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
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
ABOUT

Just a short jaunt from Naples, the Amalfi Coast is a gorgeous destination on the southwestern coast of Italy. It runs for about 25 miles (40 kilometers), starting in the famous town of Positano and ending in the small village of Vietri Sul Mare. The drive from Naples to Amalfi, although quite a scenic route, involves hairpin bends and zigzag turns on the cliff edges while the altitude makes your ears pop. Notwithstanding, the landscape comprised of limestone cliffs and coves cut into the coastline make for a memorable road trip. The coast is a cornucopia of whitewashed villages, lemon groves, and glittering water. This part of Italy is an evergreen setting for films, still photos, and postcards.


Known for its understated sophistication and timeless beauty, the Amalfi Coast is a divine place that has escaped modernization, retaining its historic palazzos and lush gardens, simple pastel-hued fishing villages, pristine beaches, and rocky shorelines. The vertiginous and craggy coast, with its towns hemmed by high mountains and three island outposts of Capri, Ischia, and Procida, has kept its evergreen appeal since Roman times. Coastal breezes, fragrant lemon trees, and candy-colored houses perched on cliff sides overlooking cerulean seas separate the stunning Amalfi Coast from the rest. It's a place to explore at your own pace, taking time to soak in the landscapes, indulge in the unbeatable cuisine, and truly enjoy life to the fullest. A trip here will be a scenic, artistic and culinary delight. 




The Amalfi Coast extends geographically from Punta Campanella on the southern edge of the Sorrentine Peninsula to the town of Vietri sul Mare. Along the coast, there are 13 different picturesque villages to discover. It takes about 90 minutes to drive from one end of the coastline to the other if you don't stop to visit the towns or snap photos along the way. These towns and villages include: Amalfi, Atrani, Cetara, Conca dei Marini, Furore, Maiori, Minori, Positano, Praiano, Ravello, Scala, Tramonti and Vietri sul Mare. The area around Sorrento and the Islands of Campania: Ischia, Procida, and Capri the latter of which is the most famous, can be considered as "a wider area" of the Amalfi Coast, although geographically they are not. In our guide we will mention the most prestigious and wondrous areas: Sorrento, Capri, and coastal towns like Positano, Priano, Ravello, Amalfi, Nerano, Massa Lubrense, Conca dei Marini and Vietri sul Mare.



Sorrento is a town of lemons, high-pedigree hotels, and plunging cliffs that cut through the heart of its historic core. Tourism has a long history here: Sorrento was a compulsory stop on the 19th century "Grand Tour" – interest in the town having first been sparked by the poet Byron. A long line of vacationing literary geniuses followed in his footsteps to take the warm Sorrentine air. You can still feel the romance.





Massa Lubrense, a small town, is at the tip of the Sorrento Peninsula and occupies one of the most evocative geographical locations in Italy. It has a population of just under fourteen thousand, and its pretty town center is dominated by the Santa Maria delle Grazie Cathedral. This picturesque spot is characterized by the pretty church with its colorful cupola and a fishing port known as Marina della Lobra with its small selection of shops, bars, and restaurants.






A visit to Capri is a must for its timeless and beautiful luxury. Steep cliffs rise majestically from an incredibly blue sea; elegant villas drip with wisteria and bougainvillea, and even the trees seem to be carefully manicured. Long a preserve for celebrities and the super-rich, this small, precipitous island off the west end of the Sorrento Peninsula has a tangibly deluxe feel.



NERANO

The delightful fishing village of Nerano is yet another slice of paradise on the Amalfi Coast famous for its pristine coastline, pretty historic center, and traditional seafood restaurants. The village is said to have acquired its name after the emperor Tiberius Nerone who built a summer residence here. As during the height of the Roman Empire, Nerano continues to attract well-heeled holidaymakers with its beautiful little beaches and secluded coves. Nerano's beach faces onto the bay of Marina del Cantone, the rocky seabed and transparent waters making it a well-established favorite with scuba divers.



POSITANO

Dramatic, deluxe, and quite dashing, Positano is Amalfi Coast's front-cover splash, with vertiginous houses tumbling down to the sea in a cascade of sun-bleached peach, pink, and terracotta. No less photo-worthy are its steep streets and steps, flanked by wisteria-draped hotels, smart restaurants, and fashionable retailers. It's one of the few towns on the Amalfi Coast known for its upscale shopping. The town is bursting with life – especially nightlife – centered around the town's glamorous seaside bars, restaurants, and clubs. John Steinbeck wrote this about Positano in an article from 1953, "Positano bites deep. It is a dream place that isn't quite real when you are there and becomes beckoningly real after you have gone."




CONCA DEI MARINI

This is one of the smallest villages in Italy (just more than 600 inhabitants) yet very proud of its history. Conca dei Marini is less known than its nearby neighbors of Amalfi, Ravello and Positano. Conca dei Marini still has the old charm of a fishing village and identity with a double soul, of land (cultivation of lemons and cherry tomatoes) and sea (the "tonnara," the traditional fishing system for catching tuna, active until 1956), which fortunately continues to renew itself. The village stretches along a small bay overlooked by the Torre Saracena – a watch tower built in 1563 to prevent probable Saracen pirates. There are several places worth a visit, including the beach of Marina di Conca, at the end of 300 steps, and above all, the Emerald Grotto (Grotta dello Smeraldo), a sea ravine, the marvelous karst cavity discovered in the 1930s by a local fisherman.




PRAIANO

From its beautiful whitewashed architecture to its friendly locals, there are many reasons to love charming Praiano. The town is divided into two hamlets: Vettica, the upper part, and Marina di Praiano, close to the sea. There are also two beaches: Gavitella and Marina di Praia. Despite their small size, these are exclusive beaches, offering a variety of restaurants specializing in fresh seafood and delectable Campana cuisine. The view and the sunset complete the idyll. Praiano is famous for its unobstructed and far-reaching views and its fiery sunsets, almost always with Capri clearly visible in the background. It is the ideal location for a romantic holiday with the right mix of privacy and social life.




AMALFI

Amalfi is one of the most important places on the Amalfi Coast, with a glorious history. Together with Pisa, Genoa, and Venice, it was one of the Maritime Republics that made the history of the Mediterranean sea, reaching 70,000 inhabitants compared to the current 5,000. Numerous traces remain of the greatness of Amalfi: from the Arsenale, the shipyard where the boats of the fleet were built, to the Regatta of the Maritime Republics, which takes place every four years. Remember to visit the Cathedral of Sant'Andrea, as well as the Paper Museum. The latter is housed inside one of the mills formerly used to process paper.



RAVELLO

A hilltop garden paradise, Ravello was founded in the 5th century as a sanctuary from barbarian invaders ransacking Rome. This coastal town was built, in contrast to other Amalfi settlements, at the top of a hill rather than down on the coast. It's second only to Positano in its style and glamour. It cured Richard Wagner's writer's block, provided inspiration for D.H. Lawrence as he nurtured the plot of *Lady Chatterley's Lover*, and impressed American writer Gore Vidal who became an honorary local. Ravello's refinement is exemplified in the town's polished main piazza, where debonair diners relax under the canopies of al fresco cafes. It's also reflected in its lush villas, manicured gardens, and one of Italy's finest music festivals. Ravello has a metamorphic effect on people.




VIETRI SUL MARE

Vietri sul Mare was declared a Unesco World Heritage site in 1997 and visiting it makes a unique experience. Its breathtaking views and ceramics (a symbol of this territory) make this town a real jewel. Its historic center is a magical place where pottery plays a starring role. The main street, Corso Umberto I, spreads along the whole town, including the two belvederes which boast wonderful views. Get lost among the colors of the pottery shops and enjoy the beautiful Vietri ceramics: dishes, vases, and various decorative objects done in brilliant colors handcrafted with passion and dedication by local artisans. The ceramic donkey is one of the symbols of the Vietri pottery since, in the past, the animal was essential to get around the narrow streets of the Amalfi Coast.






The Amalfi Coast is a stunning stretch of coastline. The UNESCO World Heritage Site is a perfect example of the luxurious Mediterranean landscape with rocky cliffs surrounded by lush greenery cascading into turquoise blue waters. Furore, known for its magnificent fjord, has a small ideal beach for late risers who like to arrive at the beach at lunch time, because the it is sunlit only during a few afternoon hours. Furore beach is among the most charming and photographed places of the Amalfi Coast, and can be reached by sea or down the steep stairways from the SS163 state road coming down to the sea.






Atrani is a medieval village close to Amalfi, which is a four-minute stroll along the corniche overlooking the sea. The secret of this little town lies in its characteristic Piazza Umberto I, a rendezvous for people of different cultures who have chosen the Amalfi Coast for a relaxing and pleasant holiday.





Castiglione is in the town of Ravello – a small and lovely sandy beach about 100 meters long, surrounded on three sides by a steep cliff. The beach is one of the most charming on the Amalfi Coast, and one of the most popular travel destinations known for its intimate, majestic sun-kissed shoreline and gorgeous villas. Rocks and cliffs surround it, though, so it does get shady toward the afternoon, but its location also provides beachgoers with more privacy. Despite its popularity, this beach doesn't get as crowded as some of the others.




CAVALLO MORTO BEACH IN MAIORI

Set on a steep cliff overlooking the sea, Cavallo Morto beach is one of the many beaches of Maiori and is perhaps the most beautiful beach on the Amalfi Coast. This smaller "wild" beach, translated to "Beach of the Dead Horse," is between Erchie and Maiori. Reachable only by boat or kayak, this white sandy beach is a little oasis. In fact, thanks to the crystal clear and deep blue sea, it is suitable for those who love to snorkel. However, it is also wonderful for swimming and sunbathing.





There are two beaches in Erchie, the main beach of Erchie is about 200 meters long, overlooked by the houses of the small village, while the real highlight is Spiaggia di Cauco or Cauco beach located between Torre Cerniola and Torre Tummolo. The wonderful Erchie beach has crystal clear water and is surrounded by sheer cliffs; for this reason, Cauco beach is accessible only by sea.






Set where the mountains meet the sea, the dramatic Amalfi Coast offers some truly amazing beach clubs. Most are set on stone or pebble beaches, hidden among the surrounding cliff sides, and, more often than not, the easiest to get to them is via boat. All along the coastline, these private beach clubs, known as "stabilimenti" in Italian, are filled with rows and rows of colorful umbrellas and sun loungers on the beaches with cafes, restaurants, and changing facilities. Truth be told, staking out a claim to your personal slice of paradise on the Amalfi Coast for the day is a luxury reserved for the fortunate few. Here are the ultimate beach clubs on Capri, Amalfi Coast, and around Sorrento, where you can indulge in a little "la dolce vita" on this part of the Tyrrhenian Sea.

LA CONCA DEL SOGNO | NERANO

In the most seducing bay of the Amalfi Coast surrounded by beautiful Mediterranean nature, with its emerald sea, white pebbles, green-tinted rock, among spectacular paths, natural caves, and fiery sunsets you will find the most spectacular beach club, La Conca del Sogno. It has it all – sun-lounges in your own private nook, impeccable wait service with drinks, snacks and lunch delivered to your lounges or your nearby table for two, floating sunbeds for lazing in the turquoise waters of the Med, and sunset DJ sets if you feel like staying into the evening.



IL RICCIO BEACH CLUB | CAPRI

Situated between Capri town and Anacapri, right above the famous Blue Grotto, is one of the island's most exclusive beach clubs on the island exclusive Capri Palace Jumeirah Hotel. With its pristine white cushioned sun loungers and bright turquoise blue umbrellas, you will truly feel as if you are living a dream when spending a day or two here. The dream does not end there! You can enjoy a delicious meal at its Michelin Starred restaurant or a dessert in the famous "Temptation Room" filled with every kind of cake, dessert, and sweet treats imaginable.



LA FONTELINA | CAPRI

Known as one of the most famous and exclusive beach clubs on the Island of Capri, La Fontelina is one of those places you simply must visit. Take a dip in the bluest fresh waters with the unique and spectacular view of I Faraglioni. This heavenly place is hidden at the foot of the island's iconic Faraglioni. It also has a vast history and it's said that Roman emperors used to come here to bathe. We recommend you book a table on the restaurant's sea view terrace to enjoy the island's fresh fish and seafood paired with a glass of their famous sangria.



ARIENZO BEACH CLUB | POSITANO

Arienzo beach is one of the most famous Positano Beach Clubs. Retro-all-orange sunbeds and umbrellas mixed with a great location and fantastic cuisine and cocktails are what make this beach club unique. Nestled between the cliffs on the beach of Arienzo in Positano, d'Arienzo also offers a spectacular setting with fantastic views of the ocean, Li Galli Island, Positano houses, and the surroundings. In the restaurant, you can enjoy the tastes of Positano and the Amalfi Coast, ranging from delicious pasta to fresh seafood.



TREVILLE BEACH CLUB | POSITANO

The beautiful Treville Beach Club offers not only privacy but also exclusivity, secluded in a sheltered bay below the small town of Laurito, a private heavenly corner of the Positano coast. You can enjoy the comforts of their sunbeds and umbrellas, floating bean bags, and cabanas. The relaxed atmosphere is what makes this beach unique from the rest. It's often visited by many Hollywood A-Listers. The beach club is part of the uber-exclusive Villa Treville, which has played host to a number of famous faces; the Villa Treville Hotel and Restaurant is a premium getaway outside Positano. It is one of Positano's best-kept secrets and is a must-visit for those exploring the Amalfi Coast on their vacations. The villa/hotel is perched on a cliff above Arenzano beach, while its namesake beach club (presented here) is further down the coast in the bay below Laurito town.



DA ADOLFO | POSITANO

Da Adolfo is an Amalfi Coast institution. No trip is complete without a day spent at this rustic beach-shack trattoria nestled between dramatic cliffs in a small cove of Laurito. Founded in 1966 by Adolfo "Pinkerton" Bella, it has been a highly popular spot ever since. With a fantastic waterfront setting, Da Adolfo is a great spot for a full day at the beach or just for a tremendous lunch. The iconic Da Adolfo boat with the wooden red fish set high on its mast will ferry you to the beach club from the main port in Positano. Reserve a sunbed in advance and head over mid-morning to soak up the sun and the vista across the Mediterranean before settling in for the famous Da Adolfo lunch. Food served is Neapolitan, ranging from fresh grilled fish to mussel soup and lots of pastas. It is all best enjoyed with one or two glasses of local wine.



LA SCOGLIERA | POSITANO

Take a break from the crowds and chaos on Positano's main Spiaggia Grande and head to this iconic spot, famous for its white sunbeds and umbrellas. Visitors who want a more relaxing atmosphere and privacy flock to this remote cove with its stretch of sand and terraces built directly over the water. There is plenty of room between the sunbeds and umbrellas on this adults-only beach, so the vibe is chic and sophisticated, and the noise level is at a minimum. Cocktails and lunch are served on the terrace bar and restaurant facing the Li Galli Islets with a view of Positano.



RADA BEACH BISTROT | POSITANO

Part of the same group, The Black Family of Positano, which posses a number of iconic venues (Rada Restaurant, Chez Black Restaurant, Rada Rooftop, Music On The Rocks and Fly Lounge Bar in this famous seaside Italian village, Rada Beach Bistrot is perfect for those who want to relax in an informal setting on the beach with an enchanting view of Positano. It sits you directly in front of glimmering Positano and to your left, the Mediterranean is just 20 meters away. The restaurant serves modern Mediterranean cuisine for lunch and dinner.



ONE FIRE BEACH CLUB | PRAIANO

Set in La Gavitella in Praiano, the only spot on the Amalfi Coast with sunset views, this beach club has the added perk of sunlight until late in the day, ideal for evening cocktails and dance parties. One Fire is the hottest beach club on the Amalfi Coast, famous for its afternoon "melon time" with DJ sets and theatrical watermelon slicing for guests. If you've come to party, this is the beach club for you.



BEACH CLUBS



If you're looking for a more casual beach club that's less about glamor and more about the chill, Lido Degli Artisti tops the list. Set on Duoglio beach near Amalfi, this beach club can be reached via a long flight of stairs from the road above or by boat. In addition to classic beach club services like sunbeds, umbrellas, and a waterfront restaurant, this club also offers a number of water sports like sea kayak rentals, windsurfing lessons, and a sailing school.



A spectacular terrace with amazing Mediterranean food awaits you at Il Refettorio. Wonders of the regional Campania cuisine (local cuisine of Naples' urban areas) can be tasted at Amalfi's Glicine. Creative cooking shines bright at Il Faro di Capo d'Orso with grand views over the coast.

DANÍ MAISON ** | ISCHIA

This is a Michelin-starred restaurant in the heart of the Amalfi coast. The latest Mediterranean Riva Privée restaurant opened in the summer of 2021 on the beautiful island of Ischia in the glittering Bay of Naples, set in the midst of an exotic tropical garden with dining decor themes reminiscent of the classic and timeless elegance of Riva yachts. The award-winning chef Nino di Costanzo heads up the team at this paradisiacal two Michelin-starred restaurant offering "the culinary excellence and peerless hospitality of Daní Maison," the Ischian family home of di Costanzo.



L'OLIVO ** @ CAPRI PALACE in Anacapri | CREATIVE

The relaxed ambiance of L'Olivo set in glamorous Capri Place Jumeirah Hotel provides the stage for Executive Chef Andrea Migliaccio to perform his culinary magic. A native of nearby Ischia, Migliaccio takes the gastronomic traditions of the region and reinterprets them in an elegant and evolved fashion, using the abundant fresh produce available to develop innovative dishes. The restaurant's signature dish is the lemon–scented homemade tagliolini pasta with burrata cheese, red prawns, and sea asparagus. White columns, comfortable seating, and soft colors of cream and sand mark the restaurant's understated modern decor, with diners treated to amazing artwork, sea–themed details, and views overlooking the pool and Gulf of Naples.



LE MONZÙ in CAPRI I MODERN

The views of Faraglioni, Capri, and the sea, especially from the outdoor terrace, form much of the attraction of this restaurant, as do the romantic candlelit tables and the native chef who conjures up classic dishes from Campania reinterpreted with taste and imagination. Blazing sunsets and an evocative twilight ambiance make the delightful Gin Club and American Bar Monzù terrace the perfect place to sip a cocktail while waiting for your table.



QUATTRO PASSI in Nerano | MEDITERRANEAN**

Ristorante Quattro Passi is a gastronomic delight, long adored by the glitterati since opening its lemon-fragranced doors in 1983. Situated in the idyllic village of Nerano in the heart of the Sorrento Peninsula, it boasts two Michelin stars, the restaurant is only accessible by yacht or winding road, adding to its allure. Dishes are crafted with serious Italian flair with a contemporary twist, with many of the ingredients plucked directly from the restaurant's own garden. The restaurant's menu focuses on four main elements: the region, the sea, tomatoes and lemons, and does so with considerable aplomb, continuously finding creative ways to express flavors. Menu highlights include *il mio giardino* and *spaghetto olio e pomodoro*.



ZASS* in Positano | MODERN CAMPANIAN

This Michelin-starred venue set within the historic II San Pietro di Positano hotel, surrounded by bougainvillea and distracting views, is one of the top restaurants in Positano. It is a creative gourmet hotspot where you will enjoy exceptional Campanian cuisine with a modern twist and expansive views over the Mediterranean. Zass was awarded a Michelin Star for the first time in 2002, for the kitchen's commitment to sustaining local growers, cultivating its own produce, and plating it with chef Alois Vanlangenaeker's culinary prowess. Chef Alois's dishes embody his quest for purity, harmony and refinement. Highlights include sea bass carpaccio with red beetroot, caviar, and black garlic, and homemade tagliatelle with lemon, lobster, and pistachios. Enjoy a fine wine to accompany your fine dining. Head sommelier, Salvatore Marrone, proposes a wine list of more than 600 labels from the San Pietro cellar.



GLICINE AT THE SANTA CATERINA HOTEL * in Conca dei Marini | ITALIAN

If you're looking for views across the bay, the luxurious Santa Caterina Hotel is home to Glicine, a one-Michelin-starred establishment with a stunning wisteria-draped terrace. Chef Giuseppe Stanzione delights by showing off Mediterranean produce in standout dishes like grilled scampo with buttermilk, chard, finger lime, and lightly spiced 'nduja sausage crumble.




IL FARO DI CAPO D'ORSO ANDREA APREA * in Maori | CREATIVE

Although it's almost hidden from the road, head down a flight of steps, and you'll be greeted by one of the most breathtaking views of the Amalfi Coast; it takes in Ravello, Amalfi, and on clear days, even Capri's Faraglioni rocks. Nestled among the cliffs of the Amalfi Coast, almost precipitously above the sea and immersed in the thick Mediterranean bush, The Capo d'Orso Lighthouse is a poetic place that enchants the eye every hour of the day. The new Faro di Capo d'Orso Andrea Aprea exudes the charm of a unique place where rare beauty meets the contemporary cuisine of Chef Aprea, defining a new experience that touches all the senses shaped as a "surprise" tasting menu.



ROSSELLINIS * @ PALAZZO AVINO in Ravello | MEDITERRANEAN

Take a seat on the Amalfi Coast's most exclusive terrace, perched on its highest peak. As you feast, soak up the concerto of colors, scents, and sounds from the infinite views. Ristorante Belvedere is steered by Campania-born Mimmo Di Raffaele, who honors his regional roots but does not shy away from conventional flavor combos. Tuck into an unforgettable experience and savor the flavors of Campania, enhanced with an international flair. Exquisite produce is elevated by its simplicity and served with timeless elegance. Though Di Raffaele's ever-shifting tasting menu is generally the way to go, a la carte delights like the paccheri pasta with Laticauda lamb ragu and regional lemon pesto also leave an impression.



IL FLAUTO DI PAN * in Ravello | CREATIVE

Refined Mediterranean fare is given a fresh interpretation by Il Flauto Di Pan's executive chef, who has earned the eatery a Michelin star. This prestigious restaurant is housed in Villa Cimbrone and it awaits you to discover its culinary delights. Expect organic ingredients grown in the villa's very own gardens mixed with innovative flavors and elements of spicy eastern aromas, all served on a terrace overlooking the Med. The old cellars with their stone vaults have also been carefully restored and now contain a valuable collection of wines and vintages to be sampled over dinner.





Ristorante La Caravella is cultural dining at its best. In 1959, this Amalfi gem – which aptly describes itself as a museum – was the first in south Italy to debut in the Michelin guide. The senses and palate are stimulated not only by the food but also by the ceramics and ancient artifacts that surround this former 12th century regal palazzo.





Apart from scenic coastal landscapes, stunning beaches, and deep culture, the Amalfi Coast offers some of the most delicious food. The coast area is peppered with eateries to engage and satisfy the taste buds. Fresh seafood and sea-view terraces are the desires of most when it comes to restaurants on the Amalfi Coast. Here are some of the best places to dine on zuppe di pesce (fish soup), sip on ice-cold limoncello, white wine punch with peaches, or immerse yourself in local cuisine and try the specialty colatura di alici (anchovy sauce); whether those venues are famous beach shacks or the most sought-after, bougainvillea-draped terraces, they are equal in their chef's mastery.


DA PAOLINO I TRADITIONAL CAPRESE

Dine beneath a blanket of lemon trees, and experience truly authentic Italian cuisine on the island of Capri. Set on the iconic island of Capri, the restaurant is tucked away off one of the town's main squares, making it a hidden gem for many years. Below a canopy of lemon trees, the ambiance is unmatchable. Live music is enhanced by an upbeat, jovial energy. Preserving its rustic charm with an assortment of ceramic plates and bowls emblazoned with bright illustrations, the menu is unfussy and flavor-focused. Lemon plays a key role in many of the restaurant's signature dishes; alongside the citrus tang, the menu includes fresh seafood, perfectly-cooked steak and a variety of Mediterranean staples including pasta dishes. It gained momentum and recognition when Capri started to become one of Italy's most glamorous jet-set destinations. Now, it is a regular backdrop to high-profile weddings, illuminated by candles, and lemon vines dripping from above.



MARIA GRAZIA | NEAPOLITAN, CAMPANIA

This ramshackle little place on the beach is a truly inspirational restaurant. The village of Nerano is a short drive from Sorrento and is completely worth the trip for Maria Grazia's famous courgette pasta – they were the first to create the dish before the rest of the coast began making similar versions. The antipasti of stuffed peppers, parmigiana, and tiny prawns are par excellence; add to it a jug of white wine with chunky peach slices – and voila – ambrozia, the drink of the gods.



CHEZ BLACK | SEAFOOD

If your idea of a beautiful view is right at sea level on the beach itself, then you'll love swanky Chez Black. Located along Spiaggia Grande – the town's largest beach – this lively Positano restaurant is perfect for lunch or dinner, especially if people-watching is one of your favorite pastimes! Chez Black. But there's far more to Chez Black than just celebrity spotting. A beachfront location in the heart of Positano, the beautiful decor of wood and tiffany blue color throughout, a long history, and not to forget, a great menu focused on seafood. Dishes like sea urchin spaghetti, for example.



LA SPONDA @ LE SIRENUSE | MEDITERRANEAN

Hotel, restaurant, and all-around A-Lister favorite, whether you choose to dine, drink, or unwind at Le Sirenuse, this five-star boutique hotel offers a taste of authentic Amalfi. The light Mediterranean cuisine of Le Sirenuse's romantic La Sponda restaurant is based on fresh local ingredients and inspired by the great culinary traditions of Naples and the Amalfi Coast. Infused by the leisured elegance of Positano's dolce vita, La Sponda is illuminated, in the evening, by 400 candles creating an unforgettable atmosphere.





If you're searching for a peaceful and romantic atmosphere for your meal, look no further than Adamo ed Eva. Part of the beautiful Hotel Eden Roc, Adamo ed Eva blends tradition with innovation. The menu includes a range of dishes, from fish, to meats, to seafood. All dishes make use of fresh, organic ingredients grown in their own gardens.



RADA ROOFTOP | MODERN

Right at the end of Positano beach and above the ground-floor nightclub, this restaurant – on the first floor of an old fishermen's warehouse – offers breathtaking views of the village and the sea. Rada Rooftop stands out among other restaurants in Positano, for a refined, romantic and elegant atmosphere that immediately attracts visitors. Extraordinary sunrises, starlit nights and moonlight will crown your candlelight dinners and make the most important moments of your life unique and memorable.





The easy way to know, learn and understand a particular culture is to try their food, speak with locals, and explore their traditional shops and boutiques. There are the top eight things to buy on the Amalfi Coast, and these include handmade clothes (crochet bikini, long and wide dresses, beach shirts, and more) and sandals for which Positano is famous throughout the world, and its fashion as "Moda Positano." Similarly, you can't leave the Amalfi Coast without buying a handmade ceramic souvenir from Vietri. Positano, Amalfi, and Sorrento are the best places to buy typical Campanian liquors - limoncello, meloncello, finochietto, and others. If you want to breathe in the real essence of the Amalfi Coast, you have to try its homemade perfumes, which are reminiscent of lemons, jasmine flowers, and all Mediterranean aromas. Capri is a famous island for many reasons, but one of those is due to its luxury jewelry. Lastly, as the whole of Italy, the coast is likewise dotted with art galleries, so you should not limit yourself only to buying pottery, but also photographic prints, paintings and sculptures inspired by the region.


THE PINK CLOSET



THE ITALIAN FINE ART GALLERY

The Italian Fine Art Gallery is an exhibition space in the centre of Positano that houses paintings, photographs and sculptures that use innovative materials and techniques, mostly by Italian artists. Beyond the objects themselves, there are also cultural tours that will help you understand the works by illustrating the style, personality and sensibility of the artists who created them. The displays are designed to be an opportunity for study and discussion and to introduce the public to the creative universe of each artist.



LIQUID ART SYSTEM

Liquid art system (LAS) is a commercial contemporary art organisation with galleries in Capri (Italy), Positano (Italy), London (UK), and Istanbul (Turkey). Despite their disparate locations, these galleries share a common goal of promoting and representing contemporary art with a "glocal" philosophy, which highlights the international nature of the art while at the same time maintaining its local context and inspiration. In addition to exhibitions and other events, during which the public can actively participate in the creative process while enjoying a unique and unforgettable cultural experience, LAS aims to promote artistic experimentation in its Lab space, where artists are free to push the envelope of their creativity.




NATURARTE OPEN-AIR MUSEUM | PRAIANO

As you walk through Praiano, you'll notice a series of ceramic works of art embedded in the walls lining the paths. These are part of a project called NaturArte, which has turned Praiano into an open-air museum. The idea was to commission works to display along the streets and create an open-air museum you can admire as you stroll through the town. There are eight routes, each one displaying the work of one of the region's leading ceramic artists, each one exploring a theme that tap into the culture and folklore of the Amalfi Coast. Among these are the playful anchovies, octopuses, and other sea creatures of Lucio Liguori and Enzo Caruso's vivid Janare panels — *le janare* being witches that are said to emerge at night and take possession of fishing boats.



THE ATELIER OF PAOLO SANDULLI

Paolo Sandulli is a painter and a ceramist. His atelier is hidden in the heart of Praiano in the splendid tower of Torre a Mare. It is there that Maestro Sandulli shapes his gracious sponge hair ladies and treasures his deep love for the Coast and the art. Welcome to his world and appreciate his delicate female busts for which he is widely known. They are inspired by the ladies of the Aragonese court sculpted by 15th century Dalmatian artist Francesco Laurana. The Avellino-born artist also paints and sketches landscapes and scenes of local life. A series of portraits of Praiano fishermen, done first in pen and ink and then as a series of terracotta busts, teeter engagingly between character and caricature. Sandulli welcomes visitors to his tower studio; he will be happy to offer you a glass of wine and show you his paintings and his terracotta artworks, some of which, probably, you might not want to part.




LA CARAVELLA ART GALLERY

The ceramics from Vietri sul Mare are unique. An antique and popular art, born for the creation of products in common use. Over the years, it has become enriched by the influence of great artists from all over the world. In this way, a unique type of ceramic has taken shape, one that does not betray its popular origins but renews itself, creating fine objects and is perfectly adaptable to every type of decor. At La Caravella Art Gallery, only the best of the artistic productions of Vietri sul Mare made over the years are being shown.



THE CORAL MUSEUM

The Coral Museum (Museo del Corallo) in the center of Ravello, right near the Duomo, is home to the family collection of an important coral fisherman. The display shows off artefacts of great beauty and reveals the secret of an ancient trade. For more than five centuries, boats set off from ports in the Mediterranean to undertake a unique activity: coral fishing. April, when the crews departed, was a special time for the families and community since the fortunes of an entire year depended on the success of the expeditions. At this museum, you can discover objects and works of art made using this delicate and precious material.




THE SOLIMENE CERAMICS

The structure built in 1954 is the only Italian work of the Turin architect Paolo Soleri, one of the major collaborators at the famous American Frank Lloyd Wright's studio. Becoming a friend of Vincenzo Solimene, or the client, Soleri presented him with a clay model an ambitious project: the Solimene Ceramics building, which over time has become one of the most significant buildings of the century. At a first glance you are struck by surprising aesthetic originality of the Solimene Ceramics. The façade recalls the best works of Gaudì characterized by a series of overturned conical towers, connected to each other by large triangular windows, creating surprising play of light raining inside from above. Once inside, surrounded by majolica motifs and many ceramic works, you will feel like in the world of wonders. The building consists of four floors; on the ground floor the finished products are exhibited and sold, imbued with passion and skill of their authors: original ceramics in bright colors – distinctive and appreciated.



THE CERAMICS MUSEUM

In Vietri sul Mare, the art of ceramics is a time-honored tradition that has transformed the look of the town, coloring its streets with wonderful objects, workshops, and shops. The Ceramics Museum (Museo della Ceramica) in the Raito district is located inside the villa that was once the residence of Raffaele Guariglia, a prominent diplomat, and ambassador in the 1930s and 40s. The museum's collection includes vases, plates, sculptures, everyday objects, and panels with panoramas of the Amalfi Coast. The exhibition route retraces the story of ceramic manufacturing from its origins up to today. There is also a noteworthy collection of riggiole, the hand-decorated tiles typical of the local area that are used on floors and walls.








It's hard to believe that beyond this unassuming exterior lies the island's best-known and most-loved nightclub and the favorite hangout of pop stars, politicians, high-flying managers, television presenters, philosophers, top models, and even royals. The dolce vita of Capri is "Anema e Core" where music has the power to bring everyone together to the sound of tambourines.





This is the VIP nightclub on Positano's seafront. Music on the Rocks nightclub has been operating for more than 40 years and is filled with music, rhythm, and dance. It's now one of Europe's most fashionable clubs, frequented by VIPs and world-famous celebs. The charm is spread across two floors carved out of the cliff.





Fly is a fabulous lounge bar off Spiaggia Grande where you can enjoy a happy hour sunset. On top of the exclusive Music on the Rocks club, on the last floor of the famous Rada Restaurant, Fly Lounge Bar is the perfect place to enjoy cocktails in a sophisticated and magical setting. It is an ideal place for an after-dinner drink before heading to the exclusive Music on the Rocks.



FRANCO'S BAR

Atop Positano's Le Sirenuse hotel is the chic alfresco setting of Franco's Rooftop Bar. The owner Antonio Sersale transformed what was a small parking lot into a stunning terrace where guests can enjoy classic cocktails in one of the world's most beloved nook. The bar features blue garden tables and chairs by Paolo Calcagni, Murano-glass tumblers by Venetian company Laguna B, and mirrors and tables decorated with graffiti-style poems by artist Karl Holmqvist. The centerpiece is a yellow fountain created by Roman artist Giuseppe Ducrot, who was inspired by those popular in the 17th century. As amazing as the backdrop are the drinks served with panache.






Tiramisu, cannoli, and gelato are a few of the best, most classic Italian desserts you must try while traveling to Italy. However, Italian cuisine is very regional, you'll find different desserts in each of the country's 20 regions. That said, some desserts like tiramisu and gelato have become quite widespread, still the Campania region hides delicious gems which cannot be found elsewhere. In pasticcerie and cafés around Naples and the Amalfi Coast, you definitely need to try Sfogliatella, a flaky pastry shaped like a lobster tail and filled with ricotta scented with citrus peel and cinnamon. The other delicacy is Delizia al Limone, invented in 1978 by pastry chef Carmine Marzuillo, which makes use of the lemons that the area is famous for. It is a dome-shaped sponge cake drenched in limoncello and topped with pale yellow icing. Here is the list of top-rated spots on the coast where you can try these regional delights.

PASTICCERIA LA ZAGARA | POSITANO

The Pasticceria La Zagara in Positano is set in one of the most beautiful locations on the entire coast: if possible, take a seat on the terrace, where you can delight your palate with the excellent Delizia al Limone, and at the same time, enjoy the view all around you. Surrounded by the greenery and the characteristic houses overlooking the sea that make this city famous all around the world, your gourmet stop in this pastry shop will be really difficult to forget. The exceptional dome-shaped dessert here has a lively peculiarity: instead of being decorated with a dot of cream and lemon, it acquires a touch of color, given by a red cherry.




BAR SANTA ROSA | CONCA DEI MARINI

There's always talk of Delizia al Limone, but the Sfogliatella Santa Rosa, is another Campania dessert par excellence that you can taste in Conca dei Marini. It is shell-shaped and a golden in color with a perfect combination of crunchiness (puff pastry) and custard and balck cherry filling goodness. Suitable for both breakfast and snacks. While it is no longer possible to buy sfogliatella at the Santa Rosa convent where they were invented (unless you are a guest of the hotel), you can head to Bar Santa Rosa in the morning and enjoy a caffè and sfogliatella. You can also take a box of these delicious pastries to go.



PASTICCERIA PANSA | AMALFI

In Amalfi, you must stop for a Delizia al Limone at the historic and renowned Pasticceria Pansa, it has been the center of attention for more than 180 years, right in one of the most beautiful locations in the world, near the famous Cathedral of Amalfi. Made with a light whipping, lemon cream, lemon paste, and chantilly cream with limoncello, it is covered with a delicious glaze and decorated with fresh whipped cream and grated lemon zest. Besides delizia al limone (lemon cake) the pasticceria makes excellent other Campanian delights, like babà (dough lined with cream) and sfogliatella, with an extra dollop of luscious lemon cream on top.



GAMBARDELLA PASTICCERIA | MINORI

The Gambardella company was founded in 1963 by Francesco Gambardella, head pastry chef of a renowned factory on the Amalfi Coast. He implemented ancient traditions and typical flavors of the Amalfi Coast into the company products, both in the liqueur and in the confectionery field, born from experience. Even today, despite the evolution in processing methods, the artisanal workshop focuses above all on the naturalness of the ingredients and the simplicity of the artisanal production processes.



SAL DE RISO I MINORI

It is the well-known pastry chef Sal De Riso who made famous the Delizia al Limone. For this reason, it is a must-stop at his beautiful pastry shop in Minori, in *via Roma 80*. The shop is embellished with typical decorations of the Amalfi Coast and blue and white tiles that recall the colors of the clear sky and the beautiful sea. Surrounded by this beauty, you will find an eye-catching display of sweets of every kind; however, Delizia al Limone is a must! In addition, the pastry chef recommends accompanying this dessert with a taste of the renowned Paesaggi limoncello, lemon cream, or a Moscato d'Asti.






Every summer the Amalfi Coast comes alive with an array of vibrant historic parades, impressive religious celebrations and tantalizing gastronomic fairs. From Vietri Sul Mare to Agerola, the Amalfi Coast celebrates the beautiful season with a series of creative events. While you are bound to find fireworks in Italy during your summer visit somewhere or another, timing your vacation to catch one of several must-see festivals during the summer months will greatly enrich your experience, immerse you deeper in the area's history and culture creating timeless memories.



RAVELLO FESTIVAL

Since 1953, The Ravello Festival has taken place in the gardens of the Villa Rufolo of Ravello, where Wagner found his "magic garden of Klingsor." When visiting Villa Rufolo, the German composer was so struck by the beauty of the place that he thought he was in Klingsor's magic gardens, the setting of a scene from his opera Parsifal. The festival starts in early April and goes on until the middle of November. The current Ravello Festival is the oldest of the Italian festivals after the Maggio Musicale Fiorentino.




THE AMALFI COAST MUSIC & ARTS FESTIVAL

In July, the palaces, churches, and museums of Amalfi and the neighboring towns host concerts for the Amalfi Music & Arts Festival, featuring local performers and soloists from all over the world. The event's locations mean you can experience the power of the music while discovering fascinating places at the same time. During a whole month, a marvelous summer of music is offered to the public opposite the Amalfitan coast in the beautiful cities of Sorrento, Ravello, Amalfi and Paestum – an old city from 600 B.C. in Salerno bay. The concerts which are played daily include chamber music, piano recitals, vocal performances and opera. The Festival is organized by the Center of Musical Studies of Washington with Jacopo Naples of Salerno and The Catholic University of America, Washington, D.C.



NIGHT OF LAMPARE IN CETARA

Cetara, the tiny village on the Amalfi Coast, is known for honoring an ancient fishing tradition. Namely, the Municipality of Cetara promotes the *Night of the Lampare*, on July 21, an event intended to evoke the tradition of the ancient technique of anchovy fishing with lamparas. The lampara is a powerful lamp mounted on a boat and is used at night to illuminate a vast area of the sea. This is to attract fish to the surface and get them to remain trapped in the fishing nets. You can watch the event from a ferry, admire the scene from the beach, or visit the stands and do some food tasting. Cetara is famous for anchovies, an ingredient that gives local cuisine its characteristic flavor.



POSITANO THEATER FESTIVAL

Positano is the perfect stage for suggestive and interesting theatrical exhibitions, so much so that in August one of the most impressive events is organized in this beautiful location – Positano Teatro Festival (Positano Theater Festival). For seven days, folk groups, theater performances, guests of national and international prominence bring people together to enjoy the beauty of the landscape and art. The festival has an itinerant schedule involving surrounding villages such as Liparlati, Nocelle, and La Garitta. It's an invitation for the theater and an opportunity to discover the places, coves, and squares beyond the standard tourist route.



THE POSITANO DANCE FESTIVAL


The prestigious Positano Premia la Danza was founded in 1969. Two decades later, it was dedicated to Léonide Massine, who died in 1979. A number of celebrated artists have received the coveted prize, including Margot Fonteyn, Rudolf Nureyev, Gianni Versace, Maurice Béjart, Vladimir Vasiliev, Ekaterina Maximova, Natalia Makarova, Carla Fracci, Luciana Savignano, Elisabetta Terabust, Alessandra Ferri, Eleonora Abbagnato, Manuel Legris, Roberto Bolle, Alicia Alonso, Uliana Lopatkina, Ivan Vasiliev, Natalia Osipova, Yuri Grigorovich, Mats Ek, Ana Laguna and Lutz Förster.




THE LUMINARIA OF SAN DOMENICO

The "Luminaria" or the "Night of Lights" of San Domenico, in Praiano, is some of the most evocative and eagerly-awaited events of the summer on the Amalfi Coast. It is an annual four-day town festival that culminates a dawn procession to San Domenico on the first Sunday in August and fireworks later that evening. Meanwhile, the piazza in front of San Gennaro is illuminated by 3,000 candles while a light show is projected on the church façade. If you're on the Amalfi Coast at this time of year, it's not to be missed.



VILLA SAN MICHELE

When he died, the Swedish physician and author Axel Munthe left behind a legacy as a healer as well as a reputation for generosity – he would treat impoverished patients without charge. He would also leave behind Villa San Michele, his home and garden in Anacapri, which has been lauded as one of the most beautiful in Italy. With impressive horticultural knowledge, Munthe filled his gardens with rare and exotic flora. Today, Villa San Michele is a destination for tourists curious to see the idyll Munthe once inhabited.





A short walk from the center of old town Capri will lead you to a botanical garden you could easily spend the afternoon enjoying. Comprising a series of terraces overlooking the sea, the gardens teem with local vegetation and geraniums, dahlias, and broom flowers. Here, a 180-degree panoramic vista of the island is also available; as is a view of the Faraglioni and a view of the serpentine footpath of Via Krupp.






Those with a fear of heights might want to skip this recommendation, but otherwise, a trip to Monte Solaro, the highest point of Capri, shouldn't be missed. Take a chair lift – a skimpy open–air vessel that sits one person per lift – from Anacapri, around the corner from the Capri Palace Jumeirah, which will transport you to the incredible views and an old 19th century fort and gardens.




VILLA CIMBRONE AND GARDENS

Perched atop a rocky promontory along the Amalfi Coast, Villa Cimbrone captivates with its 11th century splendor, magnificent sea views, and what are arguably the most romantic gardens in Italy. Villa Cimbrone's appeal certainly extends beyond its function as a hotel and the fact it houses a Michelin-starred restaurant. The glorious romantic gardens of Villa Cimbrone, characterized by the aesthetic concepts of English architects and landscapers of his time, the park features a variety of "episodes" and trails leading off from the Alley of Immensity. The garden of Villa Cimbrone might be the prime contender for the most magnificent views of the Amalfi Coast.



VILLA RONDINAIA

The Villa La Rondinaia (The Swallow's Nest) is certainly one of the most stunningly original villas on the Amalfi Coast and in Italy. This acclaim is due to many factors; its position, its scenic panoramas and a whole series of silver screen stars, artists and illustrious guests - luminaires of society and dignitaries of every kind. Initially, the property was a part of the Villa Cimbrone, owned by Ernest Beckett, 2nd Baron Grimthorpe. His daughter Lucy had La Rondinaia built around 1930 and began living there. It is built on the edge of a cliff, hence its name "The swallows nest" (rondine means swallow in Italian). It became the focal point for all English visitors to Ravello and latter when it became owned by American writer Gore Vidal, a real "must go to place" for members of the elite "inner circle." Vidal hosted Paul Newman, Mick Jagger, Greta Garbo, Princess Margaret, Bruce Springsteen, Tennessee Williams, Italo Calvino and Hillary Clinton, to name a few. The villa was even one location for the Wes Anderson's 2004 film The Life Aquatic with Steve 7issou.




VILLA RUFOLO

To the south of Ravello's cathedral, a 14th century tower marks the entrance to this villa, famed for its beautiful cascading gardens. Created by a Scotsman, Sir Francis Neville Reid, in 1853, they are truly magnificent, commanding divine panoramic views packed with exotic colors, artistically crumbling towers, and luxurious blooms. Note that the gardens are at their best from May until October. Wagner was so inspired by the gardens when he visited in 1880 that he modeled the garden of Klingsor (the setting for the second act of the opera *Parsifal*) on them.






Forming the eastern flank of Piazza Duomo, Ravello's cathedral was built in 1086. Since that time, it has undergone various makeovers. The facade dates back to the 16th century, but the central bronze door, one of only about two dozen in the country, dates back to 1179 and it was done by Barisano da Trani, Italian sculptor of the 12th century. The interior is a late 20th century interpretation of what the original must have once looked like.



AUDITORIUM OSCAR NIEMEYER

Located just below the main approach to town, this modern building, which follows the natural slope of the hill, has caused a love-it-or-hate-it controversy in the town. Designed by renowned Brazilian architect Oscar Niemeyer (who designed the Museum of Contemporary Art – The MAC-Niterói, on the coast opposite Rio de Janeiro), it's characterized by the sinuous profile of a wave and approached via a rectangular exterior courtyard, which is typically the site of temporary exhibitions of world-class sculpture. The auditorium is a venue for concerts and exhibitions.



VILLA COMUNALE

The Amalfi Coast is one of kind of imaginarium. Not only should Vietri sul Mare be on your itinerary for its ceramic processing in the shops of the historic center but also for its wonderful Villa Comunale with artwork that resembles Gaudi's Parc Guell in Barcelona and is a true explosion of colors. The Villa Comunale is a colored terrace, decorated with Vietri ceramics, overlooking the intense blue of the Tyrrhenian Sea. In this small corner of the city the walls, the avenues, the fountains and the passageways of the paths above the sea are entirely decorated with Vietri ceramics.

RIDING A VESPA

There is an unprecedented charm in riding along the Amalfi Coast on the back of a vintage Vespa and seeing the sights in true Italian style. Admire the UNESCO-listed coastal landscape, where pebble bays are framed by colorful villages stacked into the cliffs. Enjoy riding down hairpin bends, zigzagging backward and forward along the cliffs, where every sharp, narrow turn seems to reveal an even more stunning view. The Amalfi Coast drive is arguably the world's most beautiful and thrilling sightseeing road.



HIKE OR RUN THE PATH OF THE GODS

The Path of the Gods (or *Sentiero degli Dei* in Italian) is a clifftop trail above the Amalfi Coast and Italy's ultimate hiking route. The main section of the hike is 6.5 kilometers (four miles) between the small villages of Bomerano (in Agerola) and Nocelle (above Positano). Winding along these "crumbling" cliff sides has been a popular walking route for centuries, and for a good reason. Serving up heart-stopping views of the Amalfi Coast, the trek takes you between rocky passages, lush Mediterranean vegetation, oak forests, and charming terraces leading to steep slopes, turning running or hiking for eight kilometers (five miles) along the ancient mule routes a bucket-list worthy experience.



WINE TASTING IN TRAMONTI

Tramonti is the Mountain Paradise above the Amalfi Coast. Set high in the peaks of the Italian Monti Lattari, this town contributed to making mozzarella and pizza famous throughout the world. Tramonti, as its name indicates, is situated amidst the mountains. Set of charming hamlets, surrounded by streams, olive trees, vineyards and terraced vegetable patches, or "gardens" as they are fondly called by those that tend them. Whereas the coastal towns are known for their local lemon groves and limoncello liqueur making, Tramonti has a historic winemaking tradition; and grapevines are grown on steep terraces dug into the slopes of the Lattari Mountains. The Costa d'Amalfi Tramonti DOC wine is produced here, as well as Tenuta San Francesco, among other vintages. At the Tenuta San Francesco, you can take a tour of the historic vineyard and sample wine paired with a number of other local products.




PHOTO TOUR IN VINTAGE FIAT 500

LACRYMA CHRISTI WINE TASTING



PRIVATE JET


The Amalfi Coast is only accessible by boat, which means that to get to the coast one must travel through airports further away. Helicopter transfer from the airports to Amalfi Coast or Sorrento Peninsula town can be arranged.

- Salerno-Pontecagnano Airport (LIRI/QSR) it takes you closest to the coast. Though it is still a ways away, the airport is the primary gateway to Amalfi, and sees fewer passengers so that the experience is less congested. The airport is situated 21 kilometers south of central Salerno. In light traffic, driving time into central Salerno is around 25 minutes. From the airport to Positano, the transfer time is around 1h45 by car.
- Naples International Airport (LIRN/NAP) sees more passengers and is a bit further away. In light traffic, the driving time from Naples International Airport to the Amalfi Coast is around 1h15 by car.
