

The BVI is renowned for its seclusion and privacy, which is part and parcel of its appeal. This paradise of lush rainforests, white–sand beaches and bright turquoise waters makes even the most discriminating traveler easy to please. Even on the smaller, more remote islands like Guana Island, Peter Island, and Necker Island, guests will pretty much have the areas to themselves. 




The British Virgin Islands consist of the four main islands along with more than 50 other smaller islands and cays. About 16 of the islands are inhabited and six are private islands: Necker, Moskito, Guana, Peter, Buck, and Eustania. The four biggest ones are Tortola, Virgin Gorda, Anegada and Jost Van Dyke.

- 4. Jost Van Dyke




ANEGADA

Anegada is the only coral island in the Virgin Islands' volcanic chain. It is surrounded by the most incredible coral reefs, secluded by sandy beaches and clear springs bubbling from coral beds. It's also replete with nature trails home to some of the most exciting wildlife, such as rare rock iguanas. The reefs mazes, tunnels and drops are rich in needlefish, bonefish, stingrays, parrotfish, and other marine life. The waters are calm and ideal for swimming. Needless to say, Anegada is a diver's and snorkeler's paradise.




VIRGIN GORDA

Virgin Gorda is the BVI's third-largest island, enticing visitors with its yacht clubs, quiet coves, and safe harbors. There are many plant-lined trails, nature sanctuaries, and natural wonders in protected parks. For an incredible view of the surrounding islands, hikers make their way to Gorda Peak. There is evidence of the rich African, Indian and Spanish history here – from the Spanish ruins at Little Fort National Park to the Cornish Copper Mines ruins. Virgin Gorda is also home to many shops and restaurants and has lively arts and fashion scenes.




TORTOLA


From great dive shops and restaurants to bustling road towns and West Indian settlements, the heart of the action in the BVI begins on Tortola. Tortola hums within its charming towns, scattered all across the island. Tucked in each moss-colored peak, nook and cranny, you'll find plenty of places to play. In fact, more than 80% of the BVI's citizens live and work on this island. Tortola has everything a luxury traveler could hope for: Sunshine, sand, lush mountains, and harbors filled with yachts. Beaches are palm-shaded and secluded. Water sports and fishing enthusiasts will love the protected anchorages of Brandywine Bay, Soper's Hole, and Trellis Bay. Surfing is great on Cane Garden Bay and game fishing is exemplary at the North and South Drops.



JOST VAN DYKE

This area was named for the early Dutch settler and former pirate, Jost Van Dyke. You can explore greenery-covered sugar mill ruins, old trails crisscrossing the island, and a natural, sea-formed hot tub on the east end. Whales and dolphins often also make their presence known. The BVI's smallest island has only 300 residents, but fun and good food still abound. You can sample BBQ, West Indian roti, flying fish sammies, fresh grilled fish and lobster, and participate in yacht-filled parties on Halloween and New Year's Eve.





Whether you're looking to sunbathe, snorkel, or sip a tropical cocktail or two, the BVI has the perfect beach for you. Among the yachting crowd, The British Virgin Islands are known as one of the most spectacular places in the Caribbean for island-hopping. And where there are islands to hop, there are also beaches to enjoy – not to mention beach bars serving frosty drinks. If you are moving around this magical archipelago, these amazing BVI beaches are tempting to while the day away on pristine white sand.

The northernmost island in the hilly BVI chain, Anegada is known for its incredible white sand beaches and delicious Caribbean spiny lobster. Expansive Cow Wreck Beach is on the island's northwestern corner. Once you've had your fill of sun and sand, head to Cow Wreck Beach Bar fronting the turquoise waters and serving refreshing mango daiquiris alongside the requisite platters of lobster and fish, grilled over a barbecue fueled by local wood.



ANEGADA ISLAND

Beautiful Anegada is a Caribbean vacationer's dream with more than 300 wrecks to dive to and explore, matched by silvery sand beaches and flocks of flamingos. Anegada is also known as the "Drowned Island" because its highest point is just 28 feet above sea level. Thanks to the low-lying topography, Anegada also comes ringed with one of the most diverse and exciting reefs in the region – Horseshoe Reef. The reef is the fourth largest barrier reef globally and has been known to have many shipwrecks serving as diving attractions. It is another great attraction of Anegada. There are a handful of villas, hotels, and privately run inns on Anegada, but most travelers choose to sail here for the day from Tortola. Hopefully, you'll appreciate seclusion because Anegada offers it in spades.





Loblolly Bay beach on the island of Anegada, BVI is considered one of the most beautiful beaches globally and indeed is one of the most naturally unspoiled. Loblolly Bay provides escapism and serenity. Its creamy sand is sprinkled with rustic beach bars, inviting sun shelters and quaint cottages.





Located on Virgin Gorda, Spring Bay is east of The Baths in an area known as The Crawl. Within the Crawl there is a small bay enclosed by a circle of boulders forming a natural corral. A trail disappears through the rocks to Valley Trunk Bay, offering secluded rock pools and swimming spots along the way. Spring Bay can be accessed from land along a palm-lined avenue, popular with visitors and residents.





Just north of Cane Garden Bay on Tortola's northwest side is Brewers Bay, purported to be one of the best snorkeling beaches of the British Virgin Islands. The beach is a less crowded than the nearby Cane Garden Bay for those who are solely interested in sunning and swimming.




CANE GARDEN BAY | TORTOLA

The center of activity in the BVI is on Tortola and the center of activity on Tortola is Cane Garden Bay. Backed by a wall of verdant palms and volcanic rocks, Cane Garden Bay is the number one seaside spot on the popular island. It has everything you'd expect of a bonafide Caribbean holiday destination, from sea kayak rentals to jet skis, pristine sands to lapping shore water so clear it seems unreal! Add to that a smattering of cool beach bars, along with some fine after-dark eateries, and it's easy to see why Cane Garden draws such big crowds throughout the season.






Long Bay Beach is one of Tortola's most stunning beaches. Nearly a mile long, the beach offers the perfect locale for a classic Caribbean beach day. Long Bay is lined with resorts and beach shacks serving fruity, rum-soaked cocktails on the eastern end. But if you're looking for solitude, you'll find it on the beach's western stretch, which is quieter and offers some of the best swimming in all of the BVI.




SMUGGLER'S COVE | TORTOLA

Arguably Tortola's best beach, Smuggler's Cove is purely natural: soft white sand, a perfect crescent shape, picturesque sugarloaf mountains, an offshore reef for snorkeling, calm waters, schools of fish, and diving pelicans. Its name suggests *stealth*, and it's true that Smuggler's Cove is the ideal shore for a clandestine beach rendezvous. The beach offers a truly untrodden, castaway-type feel, with the swaying palms and sea vine patches to the back sloping gently down to an abandoned shore of lapping blue and crystalline waters. With snorkeling gear in tow, you can also enjoy the bay's coral gardens and exotic fish as well as boogie boarding on small waves due to north swells.






As its name suggests, Sandy Cay boasts a lofty beach encircling the majority of this tiny, uninhabited island. It's sandwiched between Tortola and Jost Van Dyke and can easily be reached via boat. When you're not lazing on the aforementioned beach, there's a nature trail that will lead you around the island – keep your eyes peeled for hermit crabs and bright yellow warblers.



WHITE BAY | JOST VAN DYKE

The sands here are famed for their tropical ivory white color. On southern Jost Van Dyke, White Bay is one of the best beaches to relax with a drink. White Bay is almost always buzzing with activity. Many independent yachts and boats dock out in the water and passengers swim or dinghy to shore. Local bars offer especially potent drinks. Ask for an incredibly powerful one, called a painkiller. It's a coconut, pineapple, and orange juice concoction drowning in dark rum and topped off with a little nutmeg. Rumor has it, this drink got its start on Jost Van Dyke. There's definitely a party vibe once more people arrive and may not be the best beach option for children.





The British Virgin Islands, a collection of 60 lush islands in the Northeastern Caribbean, has firmly remained one of the world's top travel destinations. Surrounded by crystal clear, aquamarine waters, tourists flock here to indulge in sun-drenched days, balmy nights, and oceanic pleasures. The culinary scene here is far more diverse than you'd expect. Given its location, a lot of local food naturally reflects Caribbean influences, but really, the best way to describe the dining here is a colorful, multicultural melting pot. Whatever your appetite or preferences, you'll find what you're looking for since the British Virgin Islands have a number of restaurants offering the finest cuisine. Thus, bon appetit!


BEACH CLUB RESTAURANT AT OIL NUT BAY | CARIBBEAN, AMERICAN

The Beach Club on Virgin Gorda serves club-style fare infused with island-style flair. Order a juicy handmade burger cooked to perfection, or share an artisan pizza with favorite toppings. Try the delectable hand-rolled sushi and farm-fresh salads, perhaps with a side of Oil Nut Bay's legendary fries. The restaurant supports local industries and works closely with neighboring farmers and fishermen to procure homegrown produce and freshly caught seafood whenever possible.



NOVA AT OIL NUT BAY | CARIBBEAN, MEDITERRANEAN

Nova is a social dining experience allowing guests to dine over the water of Deep Bay and feast on locally-sourced dishes with a global flair. Besides a variety of healthy menu options, it also offers a vegan menu with dishes such as summer rolls, superfood salad and vegan tacos. While at Nova, you can enjoy the bar, daybeds, and over-water hammocks. It is a place to not just nourish your body but your soul.





The uniquely relaxed island atmosphere and contemporary gastronomy at Saba Rock will delight all fans of good food and drink. It's even more adventurous since the only way visitors can get to the island is by boat. The Ahi is fabulous, and the Anegada lobster appetizer should not be missed. At 5 p.m. each day, staff feed the Tarpon off the deck which diners love to see. The staff is welcoming, professional, and hardworking.



COCOMAYA | ASIAN FUSION

Nestled between giant granite boulders, a pristine beach, and the crystal waters of the Sir Francis Drake Channel, Cocomaya not only offers amazing culinary choices but unrivaled sunset views. It is the ideal place to breathe easy and enjoy a leisurely lunch or a relaxing dinner with a favorite cocktail while watching the sun dip below the horizon. Here, diners will find a fusion of American and Latin flavors with a hint of Caribbean. Choices include shrimp lettuce wraps, house ribs, deep-fried CocoMaya roll with tempura shrimp, avocado, and spicy mayo. Sharing plates are also available with favorites like Pad Thai and skirt steak with crispy tempura onions and chimichurri sauce.





This upscale eatery is located in the Scrub Island Resort. The restaurant offers fine cuisine accompanied by spectacular panoramic vistas. Freshest local and imported ingredients are used to provide guests with refreshingly modern Caribbean cuisine with an American twist. Seamlessly blending gourmet fare with casual dining, Cardamom & Co. leaves a lasting impression. Feast on delightful Caribbean staples or opt for a hand-cut premium aged steak or chop.



MYETT'S GARDEN & GRILLE RESTAURANT | AMERICAN, CARIBBEAN

Myett's Garden & Grille Restaurant is one of the best places to chill and take in the breathtaking sunset on Tortola island. This breach restaurant is known as a hotspot on the island for the different events it hosts. Depending on the night, you'll enjoy live music by local bands, pig roasts, art shows, or wine tastings. You can enjoy amazing sunsets anytime.






The fine-dining restaurant at the Sugar Mill Resort on Tortola is famous for its fresh lobster, tender steak in its "steak bar," tournedos Rossini, scallops in champagne sauce, foie gras, and escargots. DEADMAN'S BEACH BAR & GRILL AT PETER ISLAND | AMERICAN


Deadman's Beach Bar & Grill serves a tempting fusion of the Caribbean and continental flavors. Guests can enjoy delicious wood-fired pizzas, colorful buffets, signature sandwiches and Peter Island's famous ribs, or soak up the sun on the beachside deck with a delicious blended drink. The eatery also offers beach service, so guests can order right from the sand. A steel drum band sets the mood on select Sunday afternoons and thrills guests with a repeat performance to spice up Wednesday nights at the restaurant's Caribbean buffet.





MUSEUMS

The Caribbean may not be a museum hotspot, but BVI is surrounded by some of the world's most prestigious museums, such as the Royal British Virgin Islands Museum, the Old Government House, Nautical Museum which preserves the rich history of the Virgin Islands. This surprising gem is a functioning museum on an estate in Tortola, originally built by slaves, was used to produce sugar until the 1940s, and is now 1780 Lower Estate Sugar Works Museum.



THE SABA ROCK NAUTICAL MUSEUM

Royal Mail ship, the HMS Rhone, left port in England in 1867 and was thought to be unsinkable. However, weeks later, it ended up at the bottom of the ocean, off the coast of the BVI. It had sunk during a hurricane killing more than 100 passengers and crew. The wreck has become a popular spot for adventurous divers, one of whom was Bert Kilbride, who opened the Saba Rock Nautical Museum to showcase the treasures he found. The museum is on Virgin Gorda and is a great spot to see more than 150-year-old artifacts from the wreck, many of which are personal belongings of those who perished.





McCleverty slaves built this sugar works structure in the 18th century. It was once part of a booming harborside sugar plantation. Inside is a veritable treasure trove of island artifacts, including old muskets, coal irons, bedding stuffed with banana leaves, woven baskets and a native folk medicine exhibit. Visitors will also enjoy viewing a rotating art gallery and learning about how molasses, sugar and rum were produced in the 1940s.



THE VIRGIN ISLANDS FOLK MUSEUM

Located in Tortola is another renowned cultural venue packed full of original examples of Arawak and Caribbean pottery and stone tools dating from the arrival of the indigenous Amerindians of 100 B.C.E to the present-day BVI. Established in 1982 by the Virgin Islands Historical Society, the Virgin Islands Folk Museum has continued to add to its impressive collection of exhibits, with some of the main highlights including a decorated spindle, local shipwreck artifacts, authentic items from an old plantation, early Virgin Islander clothing irons, photographs, crafts and much more.



HER MAJESTY'S PRISON MUSEUM

For well over 200 years through the 1990s, prisoners were housed in this building built in 1775. It was turned into a museum, opening its doors in 2016. Upon entering the gates of the old prison, you are greeted by two museum historians who come with interesting stories about the prison's past. You will get to experience the cells in which prisoners stayed before being hanged and where those hangings took place. All in all, the museum provides good information on a chunk of the BVI's prison life.



OLD GOVERNMENT HOUSE MUSEUM

Although visitors can tour on their own, a guided tour is the recommended way to explore Old Government House. Former BVI governors have left their marks on the building in terms of bequeathing mementos such as china, uniforms, clocks and art. Many interesting artifacts are in cases throughout the property, including the guest book with strikingly similar autographs of the Queen Mother in 1964 followed by Queen Elizabeth in 1977. The last known member of the Royal Family to sleep in the house was Princess Margaret in 1972. Other members of the Royal Family have visited the house.






The British Virgin Islands provide a good range of shops for visitors, from local artwork and jewelry to gifts and souvenirs. The main shopping area in Tortola is in Road Town, although Nanny Cay and the artist community at Trellis Bay are both well worth a visit. In Road Town, a variety of shops can be found by strolling along Main Street and at Tortola Pier Park. Galleries selling original artwork and scenic prints of the islands, precious and semi–precious gemstones from the jewelry shops, and BVI gin from the local distillery are worth looking out for.

Foxy's is a boutique store and bar that's been a fixture on Jost Van Dyke, the smallest of the BVI's four main islands, since 1968. A warm welcome, live music, and plenty of good food and drink cemented Foxy's reputation among the yachting crowd. It sells hats, T-shirts, stickers, and other themed merchandise. Choose from the classic foxtail design or a popular skull and crossbones motif.





Arawak is a homeware and furniture store that has been a fixture on the British Virgin Islands since 1995. Owner Roy has a keen eye for decor and bought pieces they'd asked him to source out. Here you can buy teak furniture made in Bali and Java or beautiful home accents, including lighting, art, and soft furnishings.






Nook is a bookstore in Road Town that opened in December 2020 but quickly made a name for itself as a favorite among visitors and islanders. That's in part because of its role in supporting British Virgin Island authors, stocking a wide selection of written material with local roots. Another popular feature of this bookstore is the attached café. So, pick up your reading material and sip on a chai!



NUTMEG & CO.

Nutmeg & Co. is a locally owned store in Road Town specializing in unique gifts, home furnishings, and accessories. This eco-friendly business is known for its Annie Macphail branded bags made from recycled sailcloth in assorted designs. The store also sells a wide range of other items like scented candles, jewelry, chocolate, and Sunny Caribbee spices and sauces. Artwork hangs off every inch of wall space. A resident artist who runs a successful framing and gallery business shares the retail space.



BAMBOUSHAY POTTERY


Bamboushay Pottery is a successful pottery store in the British Virgin Islands that opened in 2001. Much of the pottery and artwork is made in Bamboushay's workshop on the island of Tortola. The rest takes shape on Nevis, where the owner's family originally came from. Ceramics in the store's signature shades of blue and green evoke the Caribbean landscape. Wrapped carefully, your purchase of mugs, plates, pitchers, vases, and wall sconces will make excellent items to take home. You can also ask for your items to be shipped.



ARAGORN'S STUDIO

Aragorn's Studio is a local arts center and shoreside store in Trellis Bay. Close to the beach, it's supplemented by direct sales from the boat that artist/owner Aragorn himself loads up each morning to trade from in the waters of Trellis Bay. The studio acts as a distributor for traditional Caribbean works of art but is best known for its hand-printed T-shirts. These use an etching technique transferred to silkscreen to achieve a clean design. Don't leave without admiring the fire sculptures – spheres of steel carved with intricate designs. Each full moon, Aragorn fills them with firewood and sets them alight on the beach.





Whether you are looking for a night of partying or relaxing in a lounge with a glass of wine, everyone will enjoy the nightlife in the British Virgin Islands. There are groovy joints, wild parties, and exciting nocturnal adventures to be had. The fun gets going when the sun sets. 
SOGGY DOLLAR BAR

The Soggy Dollar Bar is the sometimes-disputed birthplace of the painkiller, the BVI's signature cocktail made of dark rum, cream of coconut, and pineapple and orange juices, topped with nutmeg. Going to this watering hole? Order a painkiller online and it will be waiting on the bar's drink board! The bar gets its name from the many patrons who choose to swim there from boats moored in White Bay, hence, soggy dollars.




PIRATE'S BIGHT

Pirate's Bight combines a menu of beach bar staples – surf and turf, salads, and tacos included – with an impressive bar menu. Here, guests can go all out with a satisfying seafood entree, or feast an array of appetizers and top it all off with a caipirinha, tropical martini, or the classic painkiller. Even better, its beachfront location in the Bight, the island's most popular anchorage point, makes it a convenient stop for guests looking to relax in the sun, play in the water or take a nap on the powder sand beach.





This place is home to more than 100 kinds of rums, making it the BVI's largest collection. Up for grabs are rare aged editions, house infusions, and cocktails made with rum from places throughout the Caribbean. Want to get a little history alongside a drink? Order a sampler board, and the bartenders will provide a lesson on the origins of each offer.





No matter when visitors descend upon the British Virgin Islands, there is always some event taking place. The 60 islands making up the BVIs feature an array of annual celebrations drawing visitors from around the world, especially the yachting set. Here are some of the best events and festivals to plan your next visit around, from various regattas to adrenaline-pumping kite surfing competitions.



HIHO WINDSURFING RACE

The British Virgin Islands shows off its status as one of the world's top windsurfing spots during the world's greatest windsurfing and sailing adventure which is this annual competition, Highland Spring HIHO windsurfing event. The annual HIHO-BVI Windsurfing Competition is an amazing event that runs every summer. The Highland Spring HIHO combines windsurfing, stand-up paddle boarding, and yacht racing into an action-packed week-long adventure that attracts the world's best athletes and sailors to the BVI.





The biggest music festival in the British Virgin Islands takes place each Memorial Day weekend at the end of May. Some of the world's biggest calypso, jazz, fungi, reggae, and rock artists perform at this lively three-day event on Tortola's Cane Garden Bay Beach. Music is accompanied by delicious local food and a pristine white sandy dance floor.





None of the numerous sailing regattas held throughout the year match the size of this week-long event at Tortola's Nanny Cay Marina during the last week of March. More than 150 boats take part in three thrilling races around the Sir Francis Drake Channel. All regatta events are followed by fun victory parties at several Road Town bars.






The British Virgin Islands Carnival celebration coincides with the anniversary of the abolition of slavery in 1834. The parade on the first Monday of every year commemorates this special day in one of many lively events held during the biggest festival of the year. One unique event is the annual horse race at Tortola's Little A Race Track. The festival is filled with beauty pageants, live music, tasty food, and J'Ouvert early morning street parties.





The Anegada Kite & Paddle Festival aims to bring together a community of watermen and women in one of the most secluded kite spots in the world to enjoy the wind and waves. If you're new to watersports the Anegada Kite & Paddle Festival offers intro kiteboarding lessons and stand-up paddleboarding clinics to give you the support you need to get on the water.






SAGE MOUNTAIN NATIONAL PARK

Sage Mountain National Park (or Mount Sage National Park to some) arches out from the southern end of Tortola Island like a great backbone of hills. It stands at 1,716 feet overlooking Tortola. One of the wildest and most rugged national parks in the region, the whole area comes dressed in the emerald–green rainforest. The rainforest is full of mahogany trees, elephant ear vines, and tropical birds, but there are also some magnificent views of the other Virgin Islands, both British and US, from lookout points along the way. Hikers say venturing through the park is a nice way to break up a beach–centric vacation, and the flora and fauna are spectacular.



GORDA PEAK NATIONAL PARK

A land of multi-colored hummingbirds and waxy orchids, pineapple trees and spiny cacti forests, Gorda Peak National Park forms the highest point on Virgin Gorda. The Gorda Peak is 1,359 feet high, making it the most elevated point on the British Virgin Islands. To make getting to the top easy, the National Park staff have marked out two paths to the peak. Both routes take roughly half an hour, so are achievable for even amateur hikers. The whole area was gifted by Lawrence Rockefeller in the 1970s and is now home to some of the most quintessential BVI trekking you can do. The views are excellent too, sweeping down to North Sound and across to Tortola in the distance.





Pretty, picture-perfect Road Town, the bustling capital of the British Virgin Islands, sits hugging a bay on the southern reaches of Tortola. Built on largely reclaimed land and surrounding a beautiful natural harbor, the area is famed for its shipping. Yachts and fishing boats rub shoulders along the jetties, and chartering has become big business here. And then there's Road Town's history and heritage, oozing out of the paint-cracked walls of the old HM Prison, coming from the colonial whitewash of the old Post Office, and abutting Main Street in colorful Caribbean shacks.




ENJOY THE TRANQUILITY OF THE BOTANIC GARDEN

At the site of the century-old Agricultural Experiment Station, the Botanic Gardens are a beautiful oasis in the center of Road Town. They are named after the National Parks Trust's first Chairman, Joseph Reynold O'Neal who was a leading figure in the establishment of the BVI's first national park, Sage Mountain National Park. Spread over some 4.5 acres, J.R. O'Neal Botanic Gardens is an oasis of plants, flowers, palms, koi ponds, fountains, shady pergolas, orchards, and more, and is a pleasure to amble around at your own pace, taking in the serene atmosphere and pretty works of horticulture that can be enjoyed every which way you turn.




HIKE THE SUNSET LOOP

The Sunset Loop Trail on Peter Island is an adventurous hike leading to a sunset viewpoint. On the private Peter Island, you can begin the eight-kilometer Sunset Loop Trail. Trek through patches of trees, cactuses, and grassy hills. Breathe in the fresh island air, appreciate the beautiful surrounding nature. You need to be physically fit to do this hike: the last 2.4 kilometers are pretty steep. At the top, you'll find a picturesque view.



HUNT FOR CACTI IN PRICKLY PEAR NATIONAL PARK

Designated a national park in 1988, Prickly Pear is actually a 243-acre island full of gently sloping, cacti-dotted trails descending to pristine beaches. The highlight is a path created by the National Parks Trust leading from the SandBox bar to the top of a hill, where hikers can enjoy cool Caribbean breezes from the shade of a tamarind tree. Along the way, look out for exotic birds like American coots, black-necked stilts, blue-winged teals, as well as such cacti as Turk's cap, and prickly pear. When you've reached the end of the hike, cool off with a swim or snorkel at scenic North Beach.



LAND

RIDGE ROAD DRIVE AND THE FAHIE HILL MURAL

As you climb up any of the steep roads that rise spectacularly to the top of Tortola's spine, the air gets cooler, the breeze intensifies, and the views become more and more fantastic. This is what Tortola residents refer to as "upcountry," and it is the most rural part of the island. A drive along this winding road is sure to be one of the most memorable of your visit to Tortola. Be sure your Ridge Road drive includes a cruise and stop by the Fahie Hill Mural, about a 10-minute drive from Road Town, between Great Mountain Road and Johnson's Ghut Road. It portrays **traditional life** before Tortola experienced modern development. Local artist **Ruben Vanterpool** painted scenes as diverse as raising food, fishing and dancing, as well as a long gone school, a remaining rum distillery and a thriving fungi band.






HELI-ADVENTURES







SNUBA



SNORKELING


There is a reason the British Virgin Islands' nickname is *Nature's Little Secrets*. The BVI chain contains a stunning variety of islands ranging from the coral atoll of Anegada, with its endless white sand beaches, to the main island of Tortola and its emerald green mountains. One of the easiest ways to explore this warm underwater paradise, with its outstanding visibility, healthy coral, vibrant reefs and abundant fish populations, is by snorkeling. Put on your mask, snorkel, and flippers and explore the BVI below the water. There are several outstanding snorkel spots in BVI you should not miss. Here is our list:

- The Indians, off of Pelican Island and near Norman Islands
- The Caves at Norman Island
- The Baths on Virgin Gorda
- Monkey Point At the southern tip of Guana Island
- Diamond Reef across from Scrub island





The RMS Rhone sailed for the last time on October 19, 1867, and sank near Salt Island during a Category 3 hurricane. Now, the wreck site and its surrounding waters are known as the Rhone National Marine Park and it's a go-to dive for intermediate to advanced divers, though there are sections beginners can enjoy too. The ship's bow can be spotted from the surface of the sea, but divers will have to descend some 90 feet to explore the rest of the largely intact vessel and swim among moray eels, turtles and octopuses that now call the ship home.






You will find Painted Walls near Dead Chest Island; one of the most popular places in the British Virgin Islands, this diving site got its name from the wonderful sceneries that lay under the waters, with the colorful, coral-covered walls. This is a fabulous dive where parallel passages and vertical walls run perpendicular to the island. The unusual underwater landscape and abundance of fish make Painted Walls one of the most popular dives in the BVI. Rocky ridges are coated with orange, purple, red, green, and yellow encrusting coral accented by many hard and soft coral bouquets.






Night diving in Brewers Bay is among the best things to do in the British Virgin Islands after dark, especially if you're the adventurous type. You'll be able to see the islands from a new perspective. Diving at night is intriguing as corals unfurl to feed and lobsters come out to hunt. Watch schools of fish swim within the crevices of the old wreck.





This natural wonder, known as The Baths, includes wading through colorful coves and granite boulders. Travelers and experts agree: It's the must-see attraction of the BVI archipelago. Massive smooth ash gray boulders of varying sizes rise from the sea's crystalline waters, making a maze of sorts for travelers to wade or swim through. Although photo opportunities are rife at The Baths, some travelers recommend saving camera space for a few shots of The Baths' Cathedral Room, a natural pool within a small cave.





The Bubbly Pool is a curious little geological treat that's formed from a small wall of rock and boulders on the island of Jost Van Dyke. Named for the bubbly whitecaps that flow over and into the rock pool whenever the waves hit, the spot mimics a jacuzzi with the onslaught of the swell. What's more, the walk over to the Bubbly Pool is a pretty one and includes crisscrossing the mud paths and salt ponds around Cape Wright.




TRANSPARENT KAYAK RENTAL
