Courchevel is best known as the ski resort town to see and be seen, attracting an exclusive crowd of socialites and royalty. With one of the highest concentrations of Michelin-starred restaurants, Courchevel is not only a favorite destination for seasoned skiers but a magnet for food connoisseurs with a taste for haute cuisine. There is a great selection of après-ski bars offering everything from dancing in ski boots to enjoying a glass of wine or cocktails in a cozy bar by an open fire. In 2011 France introduced a six-star ranking for hotels, naming them "palaces." Out of eight hotels in France to receive the rating, two are in Courchevel's Jardin Alpin area.

When it comes to retail therapy, there is no place quite like Courchevel. Streets are lined with quaint designer boutiques and shops in a catwalk display of Lacroix, Armani, Louis Vuitton and others. Beneath Courchevel's glamorous surface lies a diverse resort town offering a range of activities catering to varied interests. For those interested in the finer things in life, Courchevel 1850 is the place to visit. Despite being known for its impeccable skiing conditions Courchevel is much more than impeccable pistas. Consider a trip down the mountain to Courchevel Moriond to ride the Aquamotion waves, and the new adrenaline-charged toboggan track. 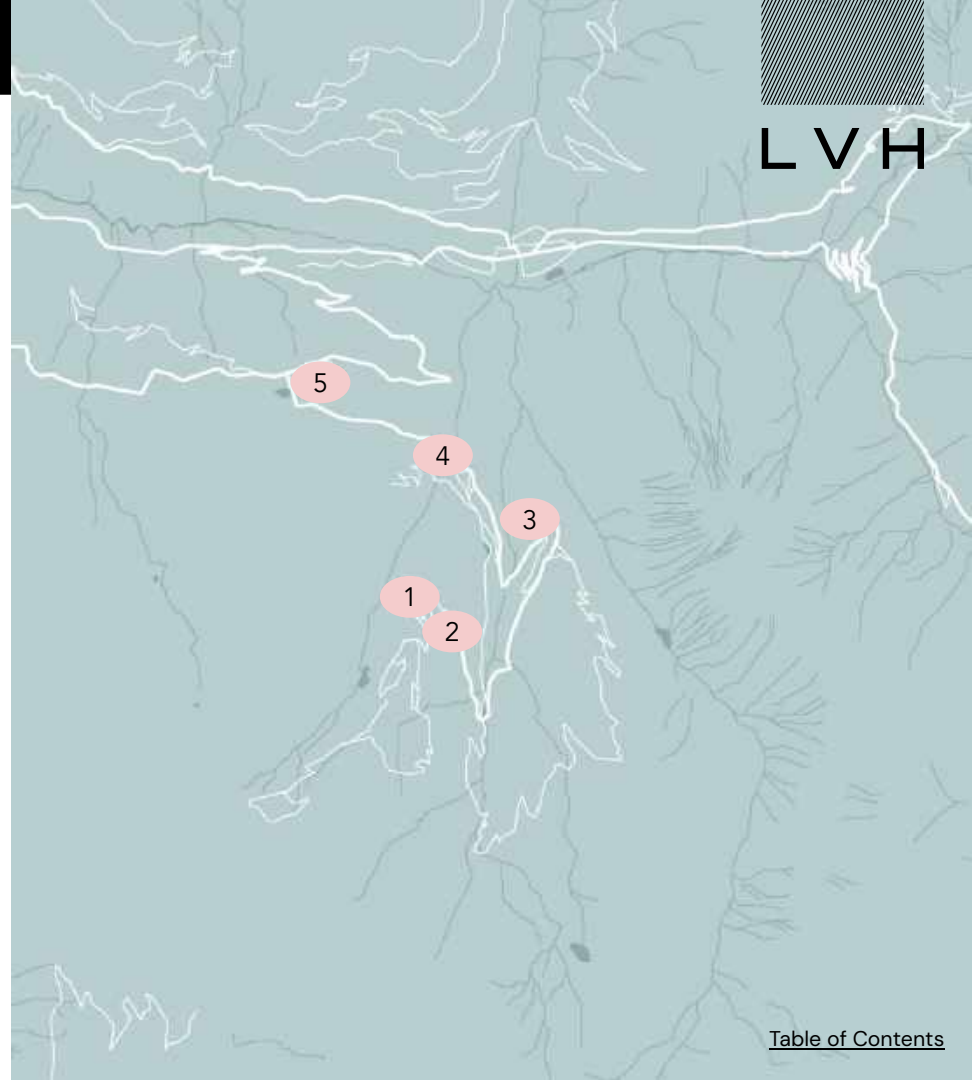
AREAS



Courchevel is the most western resort of the Three Valleys, the biggest connected ski area in the world. It consists of four satellite villages: Courchevel Le Praz, Courchevel 1550, Courchevel 1650 and Courchevel 1850. Its highest resort, Courchevel 1850, is considered exclusive, attracting wealthy clientele including royal families. In the 2011–2012 season, Courchevel rebranded, changing the names of each of the four villages in a move away from the association with altitude. Courchevel 1850 is now known simply as Courchevel, Courchevel 1650 was renamed Courchevel Moriond; Courchevel 1550 is now called Courchevel Village and Courchevel 1330 was renamed Courchevel Le Praz.

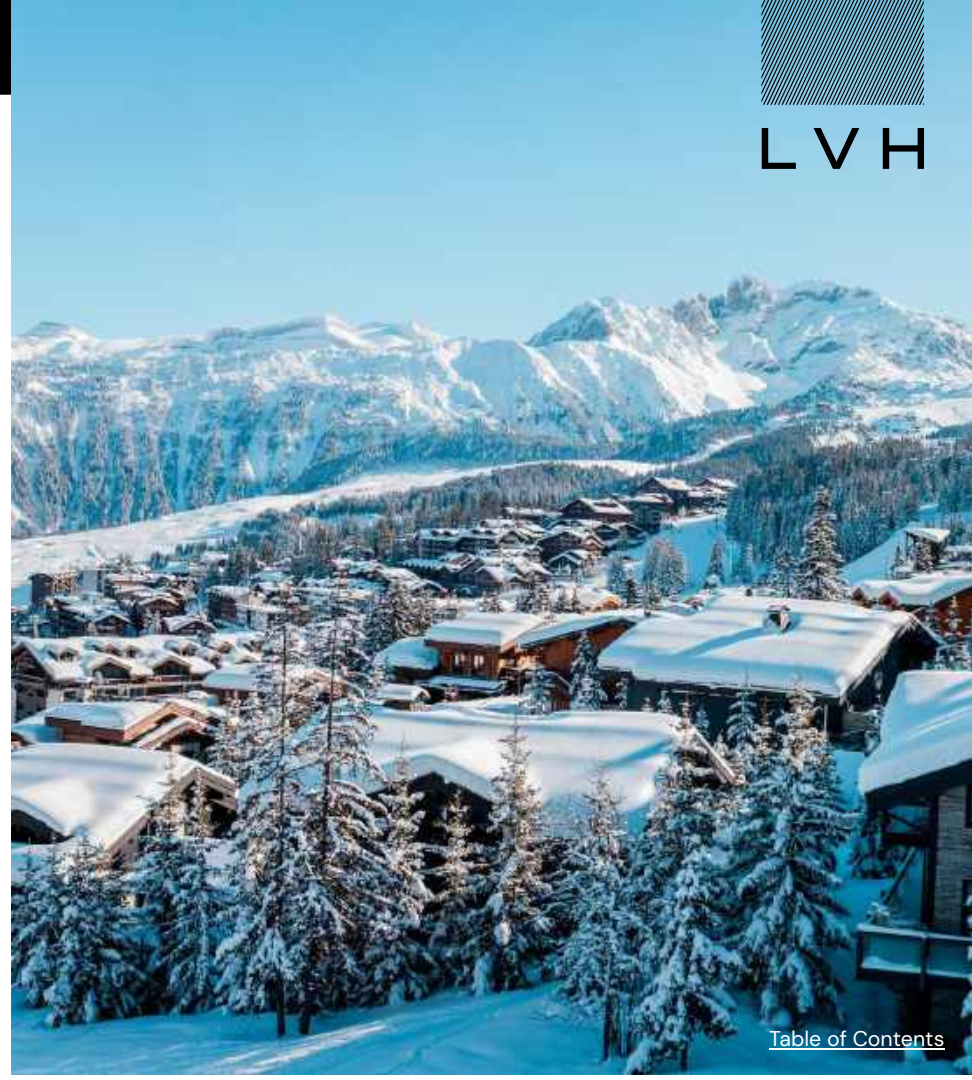

COURCHEVEL (1850)

COURCHEVEL MORIOND (1650)

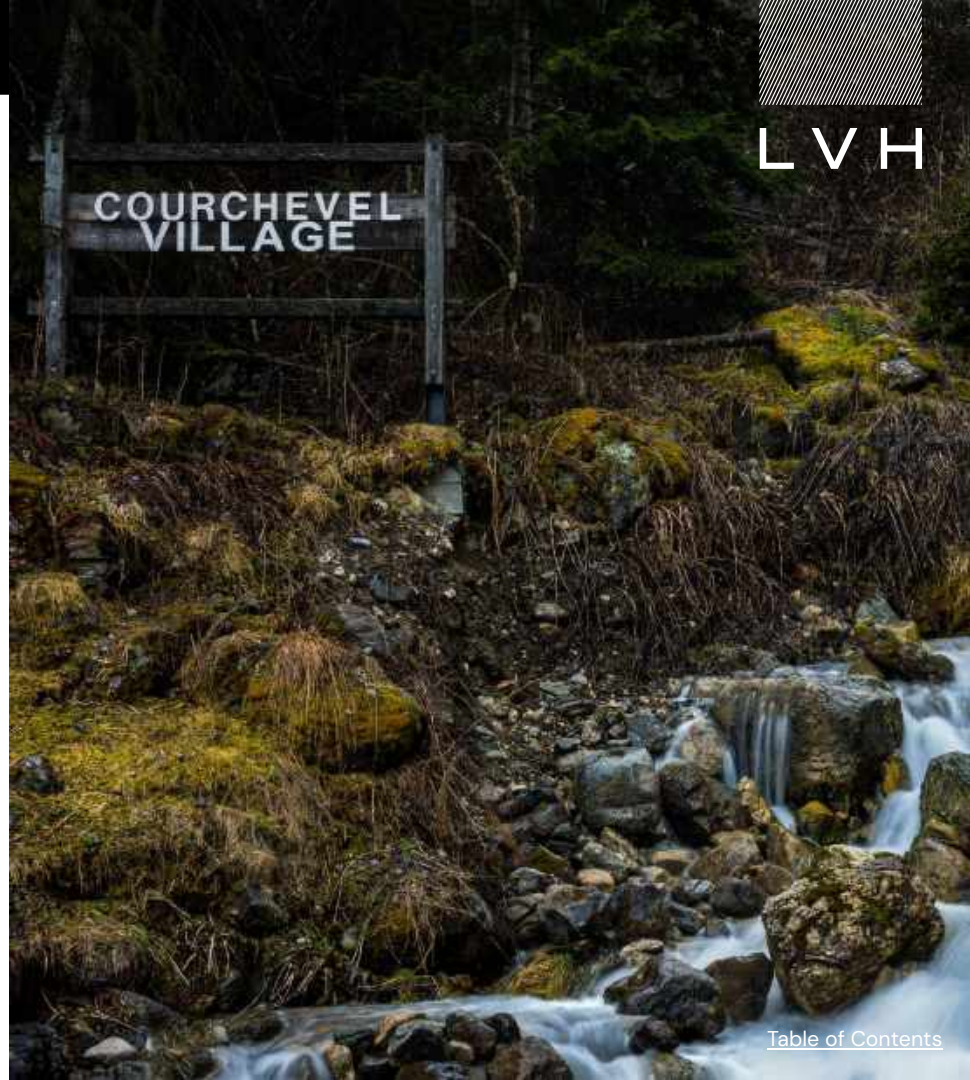

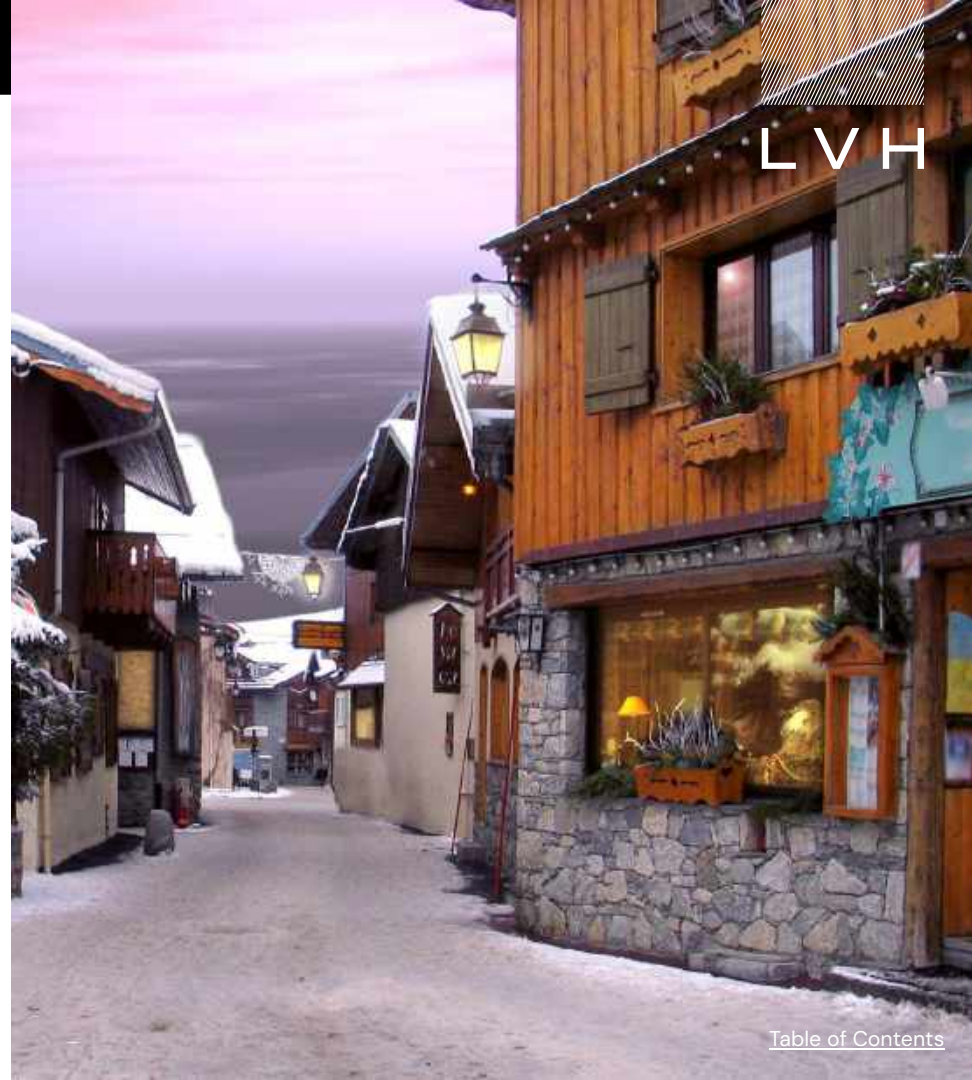
COURCHEVEL VILLAGE (1550)

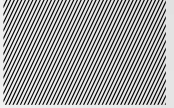

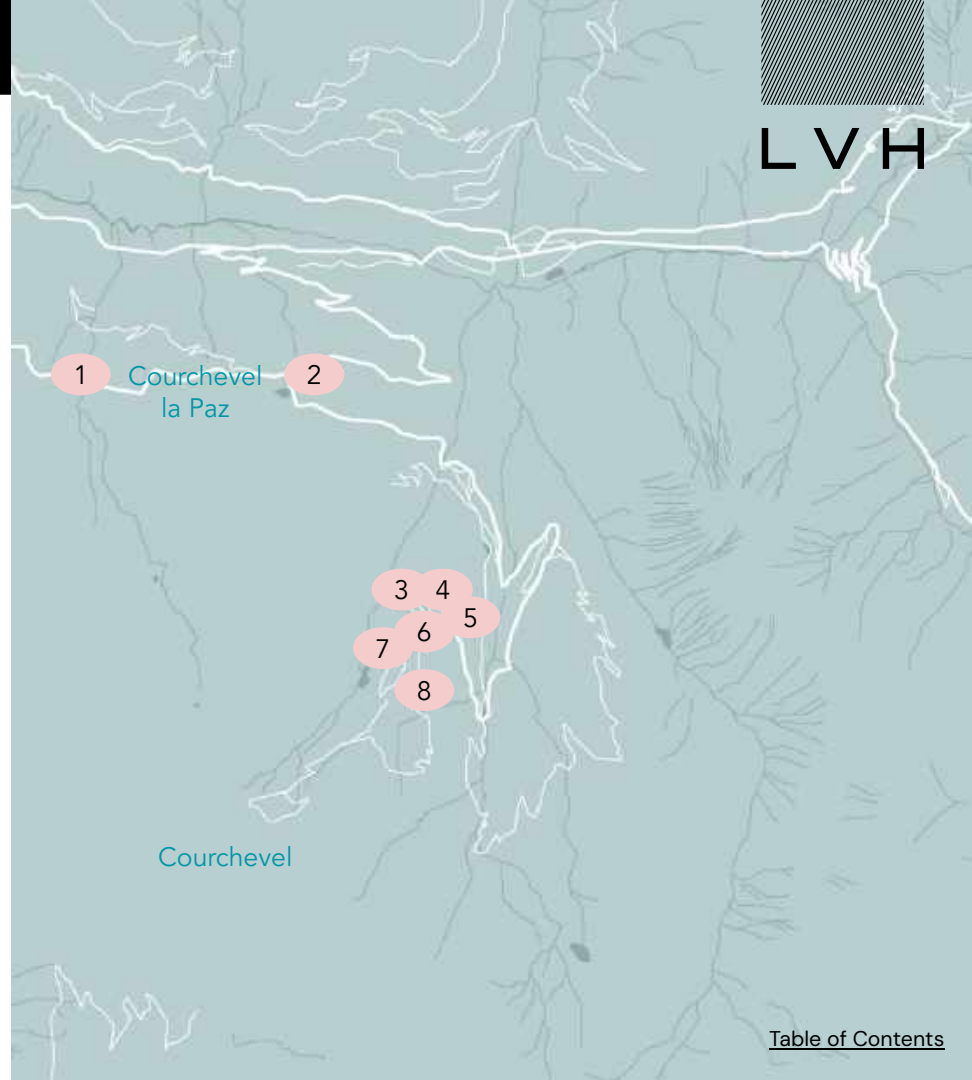

LE KINTESSANCE ** | FRENCH/CONTEMPORARY

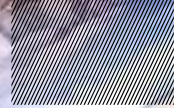

LE 1947*** | CREATIVE, MODERN CUISINE

Le 1947, in the Cheval Blanc Palace Hotel, has an incredible three Michelin stars. Located at the foot of the slopes, the restaurant offers a unique dining experience. The interior has been carefully decorated, opening the kitchen to the dining room so guests can see the masters at work. Specialties include modern tartiflette with black truffle and reblochon snow; gnocchi with féra fish from the lake; black truffle and buttermilk; scallop vapour with celeriac and caviar, and chocolate fondant over a meringue mikado, seaweed biscuit and yuzu sherbet.

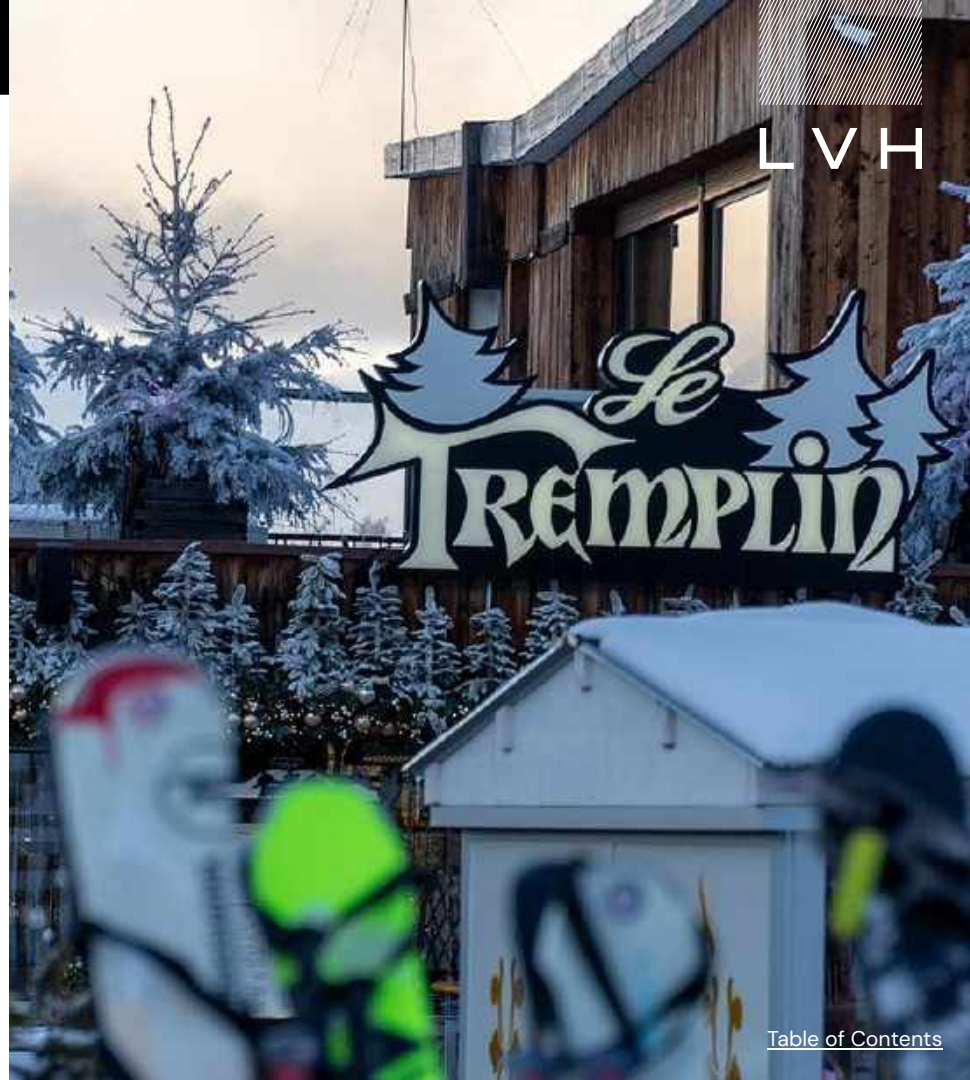
LA SOUCOUPE

LE TREMPLIN

Established in 1954, Cap Horn is the oldest altitude restaurant (at 2,000 meters) in Courchevel 1850. With its magnificent south-facing terrace and warm interior, this place mixes codes of great marine explorers with an alpine farm making Cap Horn unique après ski experience. Cap Horn is for VIP après ski guests who are encouraged to dance on the tables with their ski boots on.





LA CAVE DES CREUX

Perched at the top of the Gravelles chairlift and above the Altiport, at an altitude of 2,112 meters, La Crave des Creux is one of the favorite spots for lunch in Courchevel 1850. Run by two brothers who also happen to be ski instructors, Boris and Florian Glise have cleverly converted a former Alpine cheese ripening cellar into a wonderful restaurant in a fabulous location. There is a kids' menu for under 12s, a good wine list, and some delicious meat and fish specialties. You are welcome to enjoy the views of Mont Blanc and Courchevel Valley from the large south-facing terrace with an outdoor fireplace.



LE CASSEROLE

La Casserole is at the departure point of the Signal chairlift in Courchevel 1650 and is the second on-piste restaurant in the area. Its traditional cooking includes steaks and local dishes and the new addition of a pizza oven make this a popular choice. Every day, the chef offers a simple and refined cuisine to enjoy in front of a good fireplace or in the sun on the restaurant's south-facing terrace.

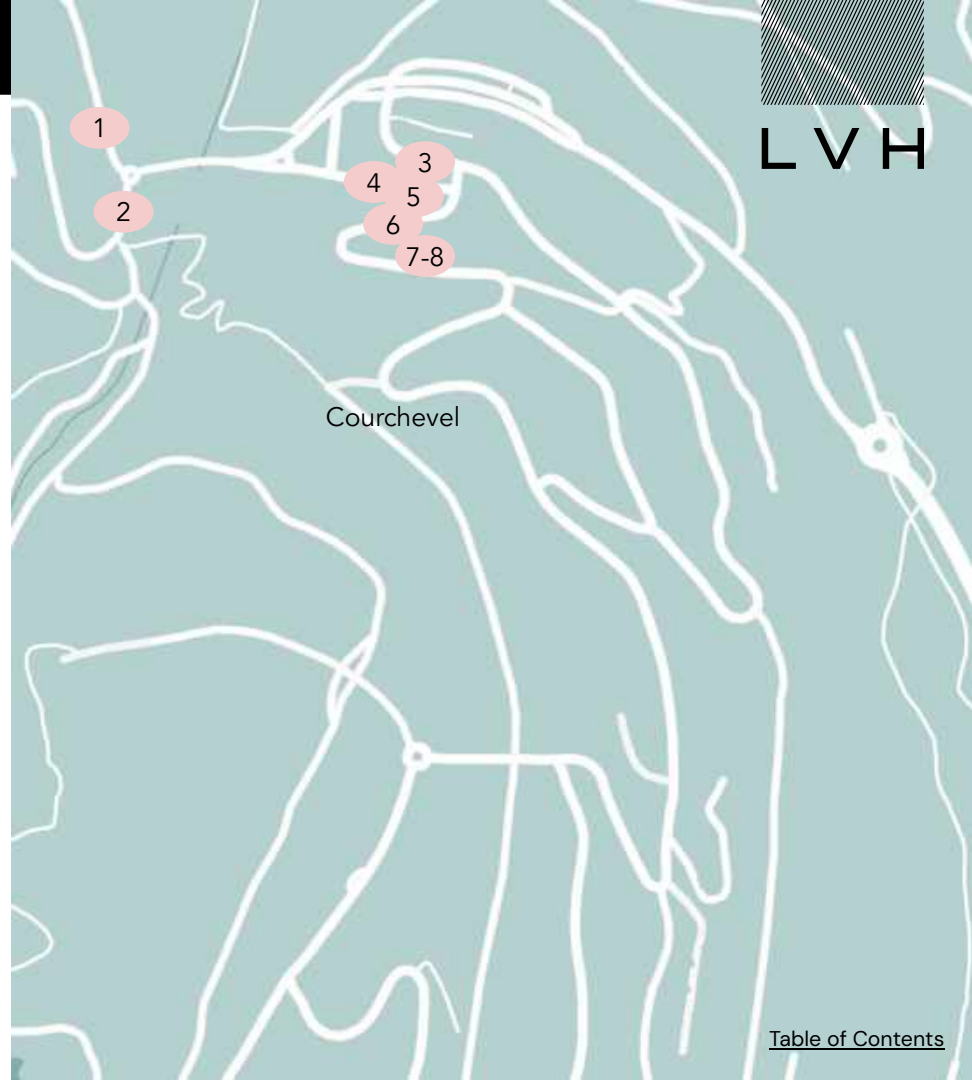

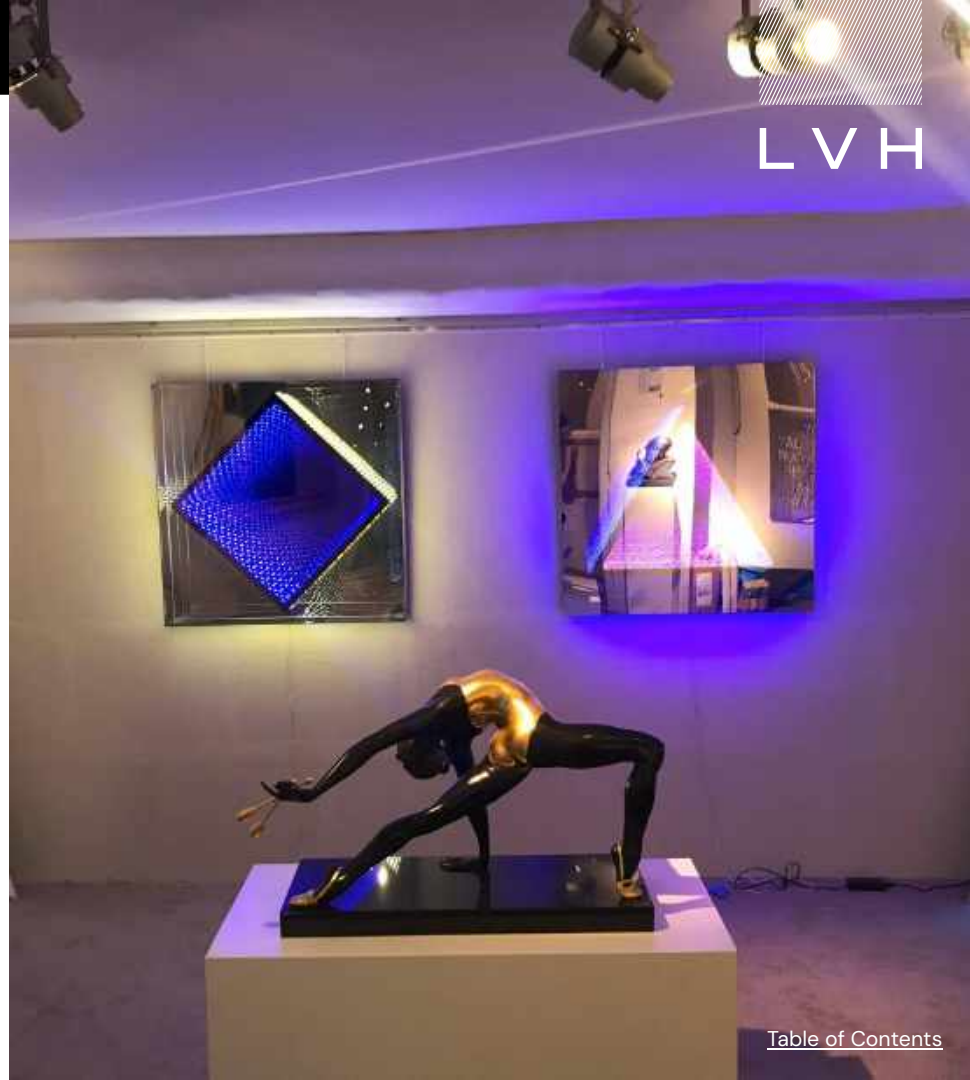
GALERIES BARTOUX

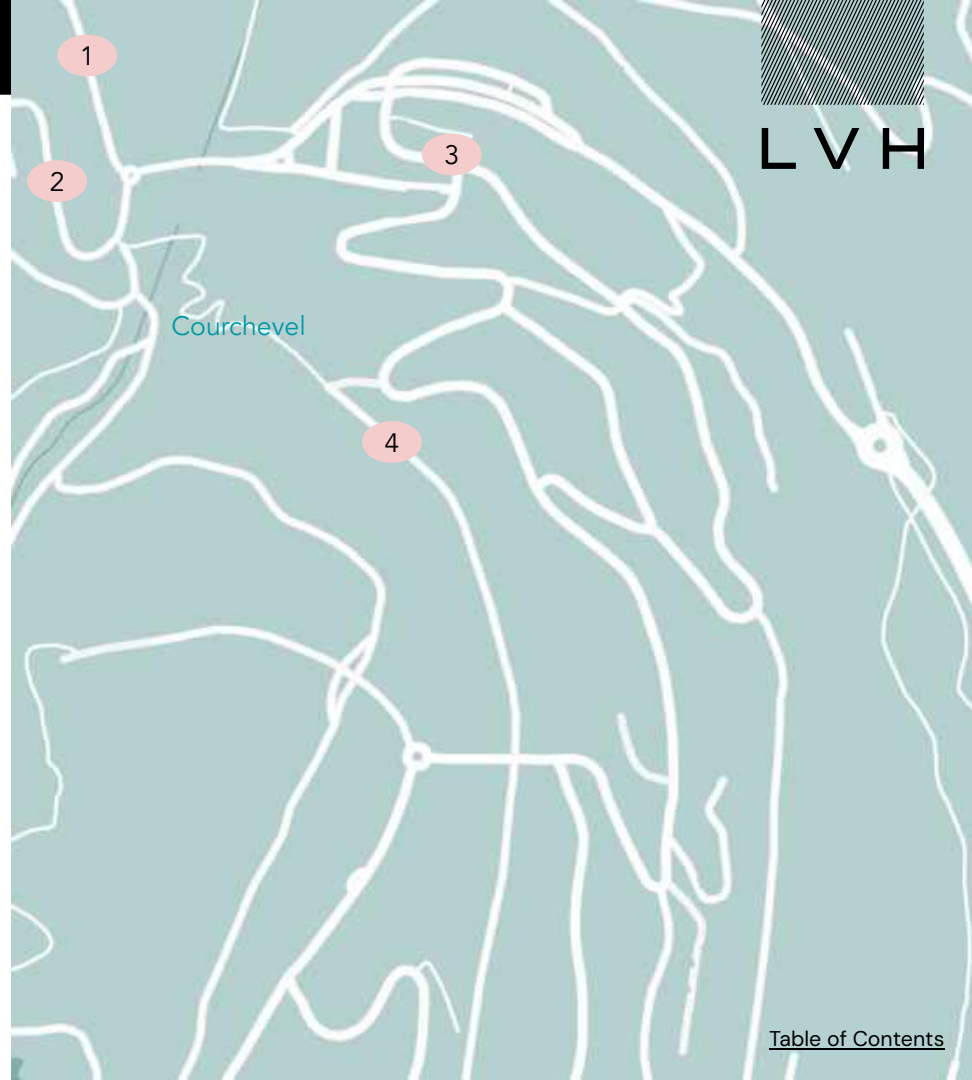

There is more to Courchevel than skiing. There are numerous events organized year-round. From quirky local affairs to large-scale sporting spectacles there is always something worth seeing. However, Courchevel puts on some truly spectacular events in winter – from World Cup ski races to the International Fireworks Festival. But perhaps one of the best, and one that can be viewed all winter long, is l'Art au Sommet, a spectacular outdoor art exhibition displayed throughout the resort and across the pistes. At the origin of this great open-air museum of Salvador Dali's sculptures, 20 years after his death. He was honored at the ski resort of Courchevel with a high-altitude tribute in his name.



ART AT THE SUMMIT – AN OPEN-AIR ART MUSEUM

Each winter, the ski resort of Courchevel seeks to provide a variety of authentic events and unexpected activities to make an impression on its guests. One of them, the *Art au Sommet* or the *Art at the Summit* exhibition, is a contemporary art event through which artists transform Courchevel into a true open-air museum. This bold challenge began 10 years ago through a partnership between Courchevel and the Galeries Bartoux to bring art and culture into the French Alps. By exhibiting his most beautiful works on mountain peaks, the ski resort of Courchevel and Les Galeries Bartoux made *Art at the Summit* an artistic gathering with surrealist creativity.

One of the much-awaited events of the day is the Bastille Ball.



AIR SHOW (FÊTE DE L'AIR)

Air Show or Fête de l'Air has been a part of Courchevel since 1997. Organized by the Courchevel Flying Club, the show coincides with the annual World Ski Jumping Championships, creating a weekend of airborne daredevil feats. The show introduces the public to the activities of the flying club. The impressive line-up often includes fighter jets, acrobatic flying teams, vintage aircraft, army helicopters and parachute commandos. As well as the thrills of the aircraft there is also live music, fireworks displays and other entertainment making for a great day out.



SKI JUMPING WORLD CUP

One of the annual sporting fixtures in the Courchevel summer calendar is actually, ski jumping. No need for snowy slopes in August since the event is held on the Olympic ski jump in Le Praz. Fifteen nationalities are represented in the two-day competition, with the event televised live on European sports channels. It is a gathering of the best ski jumpers in the world, so, an amazing spectacle is guaranteed.



INTERNATIONAL FESTIVAL OF PYROTECHNIC ART

Each year, more than 8,000 spectators come to see pyrotechnic artists from around the world compete in one of the most beautiful shows of its kind. Each fireworks performance is judged on a variety of factors and the winner is announced at the end of the festival. Entertainment starts off the festival with street performances on the snow front followed by a traditional torch-lit descent by local ski instructors. The main fireworks show starts afterwards with a different team performing each evening. Indulge in a bit of mulled wine and marvel at some of the most astounding firework displays ever to be seen.



WOMEN'S ALPINE SKI WORLD CUP (GIANT SLALOM)

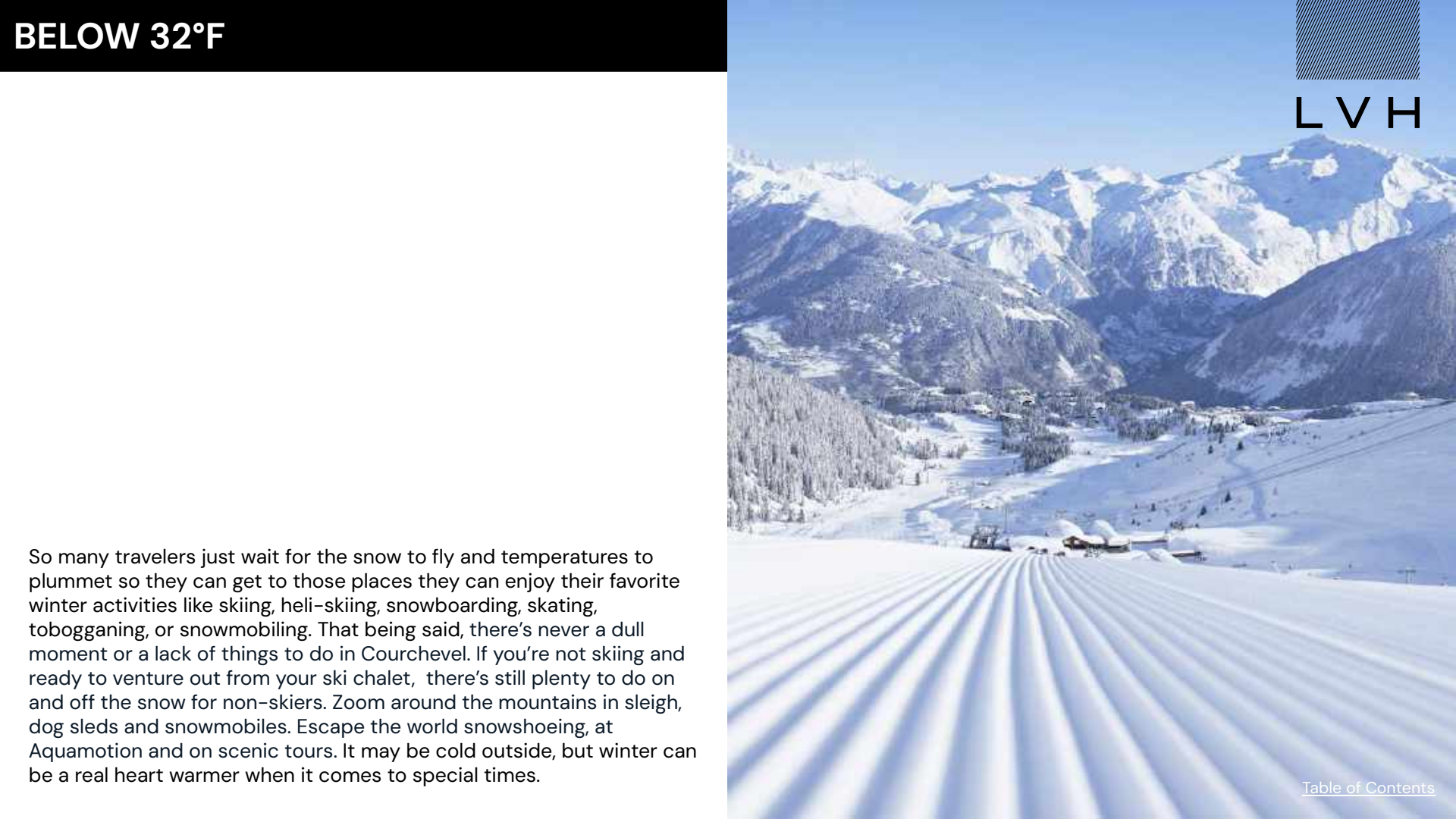

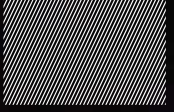


SKIING & SNOWBOARDING

You have access to the largest ski area in the world, ‘Les 3 Vallées’, with 200 serviced lifts spanning 600 kilometers (373 miles) of runs. GETTING THERE

BY AIR – PRIVATE JET

While there is a private airport in Courchevel itself (Courchevel Altiport), private jets do not generally land there. Due to the short length of the runway (525 meters) and its uphill gradient, the steep approach, and the 'no go around' procedure, all make a very challenging landing. Therefore, when heading to Courchevel landing a private jet is usually in Chambéry or Grenoble from where a local helicopter transfer is arranged to avoid the traffic and make the most of your time on the slopes. The two airports are located 20 minutes by helicopter from the resort or about an hour by car.
