
ABOUT

Switzerland's beautiful villages that comprise Destination Gstaad are undeniably a breathtaking setting in the Canton of Bern. The ski region is an expansive area rambling across classic Swiss countryside, numerous villages, and the Bernese Alps' highest terrain, Glacier 3000.

Winter holidays in Gstaad have a long pedigree, offering a considerably more relaxed style of ski sojourn, unlike St Moritz and Courchevel, nevertheless luxurious — it has the exclusive mountaineering club Eagle Ski and its very own Gstaad Yacht Club. In essence, destination Gstaad is an ideal marriage of two diametrically opposing qualities: its reputation as the winter escape of choice for the international jet set, royals, and industrialists and a laid-back, slowed'-down, rural Alpine idyll — both parts elegantly intertwined in a celebrated ski resort. The likes of Hermes, Brunello Cucinelli, Prada, Ralph Lauren, and Louis Vuitton stores, plus luxury accommodations, are juxtaposed against the traditional village architecture and haybarns dotting the forested mountainside. This Swiss ski village, 58 miles east of Geneva, abides by the slogan "Come Up — Slow Down," and has successfully remained the unspoiled, understated high-class retreat, or as an acting legend, Julie Andrews once said: "The last paradise in a crazy world." Ultimately, though Gstaad enjoys international renown, it has remained truly Alpine, with its chic charm and authentic traditions.






Surrounded by a crown of majestic Swiss Alps, Gstaad, is collectively known as the German-speaking cluster of 10 chalet villages. Despite its craggy environs, the valley itself has a welcoming elevation-roughly 3,600 feet (1100 meters) above sea level. Here in the Bernese Alps, you will find an unparalleled range of leisure activities amid the gentle and unspoiled landscape.




ABLÄNDSCHEN

The idyllic small chalet village of Abländschen has the highest elevation, 4,300 feet above sea level. It is dominated by the limestone cliffs of the Gastlosen ridge. The area is popular with hikers, cyclists, and climbing enthusiasts. There are more than 30 well–prepared winter hiking routes around Gstaad, and due to Abländschen's high elevation, it is easy to reach pink and red signposts of winter hiking routes. Along the way, plenty of welcoming restaurants welcome you to grab a bite to eat and recharge your batteries.



ZWEISIMMEN

Zweisimmen (3,000 feet above sea level) is the eastern gateway to the Gstaad region. The village is the entrance to the region's largest ski area — the access to 65 miles of ski slopes, a snowpark, and a ski cross directly from the center of the village. Other highlights include attractive hiking areas within reach, circling picturesque Lake Seeberg above the chalet village. Zweisimmen has already served as the venue for the Swiss cross-country skiing championships and has the Sparenmoos cross-country ski trail above it. The village also offers a wide range of shopping opportunities in its traffic-calmed center. The medieval parish church, the Obersimmentaler local history museum, and the Caste Trail showcase history and tradition in a very compact space. It is also the starting point of the MOB, the famous railway line whose panoramic trains cross magnificent landscapes connecting Montreux to the Bernese Oberland.





The sun-soaked chalet village of Saanenmöser is at the same height as the pass that connects Zweisimmen and Saanen, i.e., 4,100 feet above sea level. Winter and summer sports enthusiasts will find many leisure facilities here. In winter, mountain railways access the region's largest ski area directly from the center of the village. Directly adjacent to the railway station and right in the heart of the village is Gstaad's natural ice rink. The area's golf course is only a few minutes drive above the village.



SCHÖNRIED

The village is nestled between its local mountain, the Horneggli, and Rellerli, on the sun terrace. It is a paradise for nature lovers as well as winter and summer sports enthusiasts. A mountain railway accesses the Horneggli Mountain direct from the village center. In winter, Schönried offers direct access to the largest ski area in the region and a cross-country skiing paradise. It is also a gateway for high-altitude hiking trails. The village square was named after Mike von Grünigen, the local multiple world champion, Olympic medallist, and World Cup overall winner in giant slalom commemorating the milestones of success in his unique sporting career. He has remained a role model and motivator for the region's young, up-and-coming ski talent. One of the distinctive experiences you can book is a day skiing with the Swiss legend.



SAANEN VILLAGE

The village of Saanen, the historical heart of the Saanenland, owes its unique character to its narrow streets and lanes, lined with old timber houses. It is one of the most beautiful chalet villages in the Bernese Oberland. The Church of Saint Maurice, dating back to the 15th century, is also impressive. Tradition, a rich heritage of craftsmanship, and history all lend the village its particular charm. The village is listed among the townscapes of Switzerland most worthy of protection. Tradition, handicrafts, and rich history give Saanen its special charm.





Gstaad village, at the elevation of 3,400 feet above sea level, is the region's main attraction, combining style, Swiss Gemütlichkeit — a state or feeling of warmth, friendliness, and good cheer, much like Danish "hygge" and tradition in a delightful way. The traffic–free center of the village is a harmonious mix of restaurants, shops, hotels, and bars. Recreational areas surrounding the village are accessed by three mountain railways.




TURBACH

Turbach is on the edge of the large ski area of Gstaad Mountain Rides. At 4,300 feet, the idyllic side valley of Gstaad offers romantic summer and winter hikes, bike tracks, and cross-country trails. Gstaad and the surrounding ski areas can be reached in a matter of minutes. Just opposite the village is the famous and steepest slope in the entire ski area, Tiger Run on the Wasserngrat, only recommended for experienced and tenacious skiers! But the actual local mountain is the Giferhorn — Gstaad's exclusive skiing mountain. The Giferhorn is one of the most popular mountains in Saanenland, be it for hiking in summer or skiing in winter, considering its summit is the highest point in the municipality of Saanen at 8,400 feet.



FEUTERSOEY

The small village of Feutersoey is part of the municipality of Gsteig on the River Saane between Gstaad and the Col du Pillon i.e., Glacier 3000. Surroundings boast many lakes and beautiful hiking areas. In winter, the village is the starting point for ski tours and the destination for many off–piste skiers. In the summer, challenging mountain bike routes start from here.



LAUENEN

The romantic mountain village of Lauenen, set at a 4,000-foot altitude, consists of old timber houses and a beautiful church testifying to an awareness of tradition. The chalet village is part of the nature reserve on Lake Lauenen, featuring impressive waterfalls, glaciers, and upland moors. Lake Lauenen is regarded as a place of great energy. The village and lake are even immortalized in a song that has become one of the Swiss folk music classics.





The village of Gsteig (4,000 feet), is under Cultural Heritage Protection. Center chalets dating back to the 15th to 18th century — lie in the deep valley of the River Saane at the Col du Pillon, framed by the Diablerets massif and the Sanetsch region. The church and the adjacent Hotel Bären are among the most photographed village scapes in Switzerland.




L'ETOILE - NOVA * MICHELIN | MODERN

The restaurant delivers impeccable, and delicately balanced cuisine prepared by a subtle and talented chef served in a warm décor of untreated wood and enhanced by delightful service. Devised by Alexandra Müller, menus reverently keep pace with the seasons, regularly changing in line with market availability, guaranteeing fresh flavors with an element of surprise appreciated by its patrons. Additionally, the bistronomy-inspired brasserie (bistronomy combines bistrot dishes cooked with haute cuisine methods) specializes in well-crafted, feel-good regional classics.



ROC BY EDGAR | SWISS, MEDITERRANEAN

In an intimate and warm setting of the Hôtel de Rougemont, discover the relaxed atmosphere of the Le Roc by Edgar restaurant. Tastefully decorated with an Alpine touch, the place conjures up classic French cuisine with a contemporary flare. The foie gras "au torchon" and the roasted medallions of Roscoff monkfish are fine examples of the gourmet dishes on offer here. Creative cuisine combines exceptional fresh and local products. In addition, the Hotel de Rougemont & Spa has a wine library and a smoking room with your comfort in mind.



LA TABLE DU VALROSE * MICHELIN | MODERN FRENCH

Set in the triangle formed by the cantons of Fribourg, Bern, and Waad, the restaurant takes you to heights of culinary enjoyment and refinement some 3,000 feet above sea level. The magnificent mountain landscape sets the background for the chic decor, where Alpine wood, contemporary furnishings, and designer interior elements are combined. Chef Benoît Carcenat creates modern and seasonal French cuisine embracing both tradition and innovation. He masterfully highlights local produce grown in Pays-d'Enhaut, Saanenland, and Intyamon.



LA VUE RESTAURANT AT HUUS GSTAAD | SWISS

The kitchen at the La Vue Restaurant of Huus Gstaad delivers an authentic taste of the Alps with straightforward and contemporary cuisine. Influenced by the earthiness of the surrounding mountain landscape enjoyed through the restaurant's panoramic windows and the expansive terrace, chefs prepare dishes using regional and seasonal produce. To honor the restaurant's maxim, "freshness is paramount, the flavor is key," craftsmanship is at the highest, and ingredients used are of the finest quality, ensuring the feel–good Huus atmosphere comes to life. Try the local lamb – coated in fresh herbs plucked straight from the Huus garden – it's a classic.



LEONARD'S * MICHELIN | FRENCH

Set in one of the Big Four luxury hotels in town — Le Grand Bellevue, Leonard's keeps up with the prevailing vibe of extravagance. Le Grand Bellevue is a positively underrated luxury hotel of rare tastefulness, and such is its a la carte restaurant. That being so, reserve a table in the stylish dining room of Leonard's and enjoy Chef Francesco de Bartolomeis' elegant international cuisine. Using locally-sourced ingredients from nearby farmers and trusted suppliers, Francesco combines fresh, lighter plates with warming seasonal dishes and mouth-watering sweet treats. Leonard's welcomes you to Gstaad with the warmth of genuine Alpine hospitality.





La Bagatelle has been one of the best restaurants in the Bernese Oberland for many years. Set in the Hotel Le Grand Chalet, the restaurant serves excellent classic French food made using the best ingredients in a relaxed and friendly environment, whether you eat in the rustic restaurant or on the terrace with its stunning views. You can also rely on charming service and a great wine list.



MEGU | JAPANESE

At this chic offshoot of the New York flagship restaurant, you can enjoy a highly successful combination of traditional Japanese cuisine and modern influences. Head Chef and Sushi Master Tsutomu Kugota takes diners on a journey through some of Japan's most pristine and rare ingredients and presentations. The restaurant interior, designed by Noé Duchaufour–Lawrance, incorporates antique kimonos, Alpine fir wood, accents of vermillion, and slatted wood partitions inspired by the temples of Kyoto and traditional Japanese houses. Megu also offers one of the largest sake collections in Switzerland and curates an exquisite selection of Japanese whiskies. The menu ranges from tuna tataki served with Kanzuri radish, ponzu, and nori vinaigrette to seared scallops with truffle miso to fermented lemon with Szechuan pepper and Sablé Breton. Gault Millau has named Megu as Switzerland's top Asian restaurant.




SOMMET BY MARTIN GÖSHEL * MICHELIN | MODERN

The exclusive and impressive Alpina Gstaad Hotel has triumphed with its appealing restaurant. Set against a picturesque mountain backdrop, everything about Le Grand Restaurant & La Grande Terrasse exudes grandeur and glamor. Upon entering, you are surrounded by high ceilings with lavish chandeliers, charming décor, and formal servers. Let yourself be indulged by the chefs' haute cuisine and creativity while you ponder the views over the stunning garden and breathtaking mountain panorama. Ready yourself for an elegant dining affair from start to finish.





Chesery remains the criterion of Swiss Alpine fine dining for many ever since. This icon delivers exceptionally delicious cuisine in a warm and relaxing environment. Tucked in a chalet, the elegant eatery defined farm-to-table long before the trend went worldwide. Fish dishes like bass in salt crust and seafood pot au feu remain the guests' favorites. AVENUE MONTAGE | MEDITERRANEAN

The elegant yet comfortable interior is challenged by the delightful balcony terrace complete with mountain views. Taking inspiration from the hotel's home in Saanenland, Avenue Montagne offers local specialties in a cozy and contemporary setting. Seasonal Mediterranean cuisine, including house–made pasta and risotto, Panzerotti with raclette cheese, spinach, and tomatoes, or saddle of mountain lamb (Scaletta Pass) in a wild garlic crust is what's on the menu at this restaurant.




PIZZA BASTA | ITALIAN

In Pizza Basta, even the most traditional pizza classics are made with a special touch evoking desire, love, and a unique Bernerhof touch. Pizza dough is made with flour from the Dittligmühle, a renowned mill in Gantrisch nature park, and is cooked for at least 36 hours. That is how the pizza crust stays crispy when taken out of the "Izzo" oven (Electric Brick Pizza Oven). Puccia Bernerhof pizza, a specialty from Apulia, is a highly recommended choice from the extensive menu list. Try delicacies from the dessert trolley, including homemade Tiramisù or Cassata Siciliana — they don't disappoint. To pass the time while you wait for your steaming pizza to arrive, treat yourself to delicious aperitifs such as Negroni and a fine selection of gin and tonics and various vermouths.



LE PETIT CHALET | SWISS

Le Petit Chalet is a cozy local restaurant in the gardens of the Le Grand Bellevue Hotel. It is the "it" place to taste delicious Swiss food in a traditional chalet setting, making it one of the best and a must restaurants to visit. It's situated outside of the heart of the village, just a five-minute walk from its center. The restaurant is a log cabin, and everything about it is inspired by Swiss tradition. The furniture, the decorations, and even the menu are all glaringly Swiss, which just adds an additional level to the experience of fine dining.





GSTAAD PROMENADE



Adding to it the wealth of cultural heritage, old traditions, legends, and artifacts meticulously and reverently collected and preserved by the community visiting Gstaad's museums is like a journey into the past, offering exciting background information on the culture, history, and old craftsmanship of the region. The high-quality art offering in the destination is also reflected in the existing sculptures. Some of Gstaad's most well-known regular guests have paid homage to the region with very special art objects.

ZENTRUM PAUL KLEE

In 2005, The Zentrum Paul Klee, a museum in Bern, dedicated to the artist Paul Klee, opened its doors. Designed by Italian architect Renzo Piano the wave-shaped steel and glass structure is worth a visit all on its own. The building's three curved "hills" and gently contoured lines blend into the surrounding rolling landscape. Enclosed by fields and a spacious park, the center provides a lovely area for walking. Paths that circle the Zentrum Paul Klee, a total of 18, are named after Klee's masterpieces. The Zentrum features about 40% of Paul Klee's entire pictorial oeuvre and awaits visitors at the intriguing address of "Monument im Fruchtland 3" (Monument in a Field 3). After you've finished viewing the exhibitions, how does a little snack sound? The Museum Café in the foyer area serves tasty refreshments and snacks. For à la carte meal, Restaurant Schöngrün offers a small but delectable selection of menu items.



BALLENBERG OPEN-AIR MUSEUM

You can visit and admire more than 100 rural houses and farm buildings from all over Switzerland. Magnificent farmhouses, humble workers' quarters, alpine huts and stalls, barns, storehouses, washhouses, and drying ovens provide architectural as well as socio-historical testimony to the everyday life and rural culture of the past. These historical buildings could not be maintained at their original location and were, therefore, carefully dismantled and transported to the museum's 66 hectares of land to be reconstructed. Collectively they provide insight into the daily life of rural Switzerland.






The Obersimmental local history museum is in a farmhouse from 1647 that has been preserved almost in its original condition. Richly furnished with antique residential and cultural assets, it bears witness to the life of the ancestors. In addition to rural and handicraft utensils, artistic works are also shown to their best advantage. The small medieval garden offers a selection of useful plants and herbs already cultivated earlier.






Founded in 2019, Tarmak 22 exists to breathe life into the cultural landscape of the Swiss Alps. Located one floor above ground level at the Gstaad Saanen airport in Switzerland, Tarmak 22 is a 3,000-square-foot gallery bringing contemporary art to new heights. The space has been open to the public, whether they are planning to travel or not, and has been hosting a yearly program of conferences and performances. The gallery takes its name both from the tarmac on airport runways and the Saanen airport code.



SAANEN LANDSCAPE MUSEUM

In 1987, the Museum Association of the Saanen Region was founded, having been given a comprehensive collection of artistic and agricultural cultural assets as a legacy. This led to the opening of the Saanen Landscape Museum. The freedom-loving subjects of the Counts of Gruyeres, who were once hunters, farmers, and loggers, became ski instructors, hoteliers, and entrepreneurs over the course of four centuries. A rich cultural heritage bears witness to the multifaceted work displayed through artifacts and other assets. With a permanent exhibition on Saaner customs and regularly changing temporary exhibitions, locals and guests are given the opportunity to see the past and present in a dignified setting.




MENUHIN CENTER SAANEN

The Menuhin Center Saanen Association has become the bearer of the great artistic and spiritual heritage of Yehudi Menuhin. Lord Menuhin, the world-renowned violinist, conductor, educator, humanist, founder, and mentor of the Gstaad Menuhin Festival & Academy for almost 40 years, has left behind a tremendous musical and spiritual legacy. The vivid presentation in the historic Chalet Salzhüsi in the center of Saanen is intended to express thanks and recognition. In the Menuhin Center Saanen, you can expect a small but fine exhibition about Yehudi Menuhin and his work in Saanenland. Special attention is paid to his most important legacy for the region, the Gstaad Menuhin Festival and the IMMA (International Menuhin Music Academy).



THE MIRAGE GSTAAD

Gstaad's spellbinding natural surroundings are a wellspring for innovation and bold contemporary art projects. Such is The Mirror House or Mirage Gstaad, made by the American artist Doug Aitken as a project within the high-altitude arts festival Elevation 1049. This totally reflective pavilion sits in an idyllic meadow with its ever-changing mirror surface. Minute passings of the seasons and the drifting of clouds dramatically change the structure's appearance accounting for a genuinely unique chameleon-like entity totally foreign yet embedded within its vast Alpine surroundings. The mirrored sculpture in Gruben has experienced a real run over the past two years. The installation has become a destination for art lovers all over, regardless of age. Children, in particular, have enjoyed the mirrored walls and ceilings.




PATRICIA LOW CONTEMPORARY

One of the best places to find art masterpieces among the mountain peaks. Established in Gstaad in 2005, with outposts in Geneva and St. Moritz, Patricia Low Contemporary is the leading destination for contemporary art in the famed Alpine town. The reopened gallery is designed by sought-after local architecture firm Rieder Architektur AG and situated in the center of Gstaad on the cobbled promenade. Not limited to high season, the gallery program of solo and curated exhibitions will take place throughout the year. Pieces by the likes of Jeff Koons, Damien Hirst, and even Robert Indiana populate the space owned by Patricia Low, an expert contemporary art dealer.



SAMHART GALLERY

Samhart Gallery presents contemporary art in all its forms: painting, sculpture, digigraphy, customization, lithographies, and screenprints. A bold selection of artworks for all sensibilities. Besides Gstaad, Samhart galleries are spread around Switzerland in Neuchâtel and Villars-Sur-Ollon.



GAGOSIAN

Contemporary art gallery Gagosian first appeared in the town through various pop-up events back in 2018. It featured artists such as Giuseppe Penone, Andreas Gursky, Marc Newson, and Ed Ruscha to name but a few. Joining the Basel and Geneva locations, the Gstaad gallery opened along the historic promenade in the heart of the village and featured an inaugural exhibition of works by Damien Hirst on February 14, 2022.



GALERIE BEL-AIR FINE ART

Founded by François Chabanian, an art collector and dealer for over 30 years, the international group of galleries Bel Air Fine Art is also present in Geneva, Crans Montana, Verbier, Paris Place des Vosges, Saint-Tropez, and Pietrasanta. Bel Air Fine Art also regularly organizes prestigious exhibitions in the Middle East (United Arab Emirates, Lebanon ...). Opened in 2013, Bel Air Fine Art Gallery Gstaad has been celebrating the work of painters, sculptors, and internationally renowned photographers such as Igor Mitoraj, Mr. Brainwash, Lorenzo Quinn, Christian Voigt, Yves Klein, Arman, Alexi Torres, Patrick Hughes, Omar Galliani.




MADDOX GALLERY

Housed in a traditional Alpine chalet, Maddox Gallery has welcomed some of the world's most prominent art collectors since it opened its doors in 2017. Situated on the main promenade, Maddox Gallery is at the heart of the relaxed and emerging art scene in this exclusive ski resort. Open seasonally for the duration of the ski season, the Gstaad outpost of the gallery is where some of the finest artworks done by the blue-chip and established artists the gallery represents are exhibited.



HAUSER & WIRTH GSTAAD

Hauser & Wirth found a permanent home in Gstaad in the former chalet of Gunther Sachs, the Vieux Chalet. It has been used by the gallerists as a private space since 2015. It functions as an unorthodox setting to view art, where eclectic art hangings — works by modern masters such as Picasso, Joan Miró, and Philip Guston, combined with ones by more contemporary artists, including Rashid Johnson, Nicolas Party, and Lorna Simpson — are curated to resemble that of a collector's home. Art exhibitions are open by appointment only. Hauser & Wirth have also presented other public art projects in the area in collaboration with the Gstaad Palace, Tarmak 22, and Casa Gstaad, such as the Jenny Holzer truism projections, the Martin Creed neons, and outdoor, large-scale sculptures by Alexander Calder or William Kentridge.






APRÉS SKI & NIGHTLIFE




THE BAR AT THE BELLEVUE HOTEL


THE ALPINA LOUNGE & BAR


JAPANESE WHISKY BAR AT ALPINA


GREENGO NIGHTCLUB


PEAK WALK BY TISSOT

There is only one suspension bridge in the world that connects two mountain peaks. It is called Peak Walk by Tissot. It is at Glacier 3000, inviting you for an adventure you will remember. The Peak Walk by Tissot highlights the glacier adventure: It connects the smaller peak (View Point) with the central peak (Scex Rouge). The 350 feet long and 31-inch wide bridge offers a stunning view of the Alps: Matterhorn, Mont Blanc, Eiger, Mönch, and Jungfrau are visible from the bridge extending majestic views far off into the distance. The suspension bridge is open year-round, subject to weather conditions.





Some of Gstaad's most well-known regular guests have paid homage to the region with extraordinary art objects. One such is the Sitting Duck. Oscar-winner Julie Andrews, as a thank you for her honorary citizenship, presented the community of Saanen with the "The Sitting Duck" sculpture created by her late husband, Blake Edwards.





Probably the most photographed object on the Gstaad Promenade is the drinking calf by the fountain near the Posthotel Rössli. The bronze figure, "Rosie," was created by Elizabeth Taylor's (Elizabeth Taylor and Richard Burton owned a chalet in Gstaad) daughter, Liza Todd.



FONDUE CAQUELON

These fantastic artisanal products are the ultimate organoleptic expression of the Swiss Alps' untouched landscapes. IGLOO DORF

The igloo village is near the Saanerslochgrat mountain station above Saanenmöser at an altitude of about 6,500 feet. From here, you can enjoy the overwhelming view of all the surrounding valleys and mountains. The igloo bar is open for you during the day. Come and enjoy a delicious fondue with regional cheese and homemade white igloo mulled wine. On selected nights, a very special fondue experience can be booked.



THE TROPICAL HOUSE IN FRUTIGEN

Treat yourself to a short trip to Frutigen. Sustainably harnessing the thermal energy of warm water from the Lötschberg base tunnel to benefit the region, this unique fusion of flora and fauna from the mountains and the tropics has become one of Bernese Oberland's top visitor attractions. Tropical plants and fruits flourish in the tropical garden, inviting visitors to enjoy them with all their senses. The Tropenhaus experience brings together the themes of renewable energy, fish farming, and caviar production with a tropical garden. The focal point is the exhibition on sturgeon, fish farming, and totally unique caviar production in Switzerland.



JUNGFRAUJOCH - TOP OF EUROPE

The end of the line has never been so breathtaking, with the Jungfrau railway making its journey to Europe's highest-altitude railway station at an astounding 11,000 feet. Marvel at breathtaking panoramas peering into a wonderland of snow, ice, and stone. The famed Sphinx observatory connects to the Top of Europe building, offering wondrous vistas over the Aletsch glacier. A feat of engineering, this rail network connects to incredible infrastructure, including an ice palace, multimedia tours, observation decks, and fine dining, immersing guests fully into the splendor of the mountain world.


TENNIS

SCENIC FLIGHTS OVER SWISS ALPS

The best way to see the Alps is from the air! Feel the rumble of a small aircraft building speed on the tarmac, taking off into the vast blue yonder. You will soar into the heart of these world-famous giants of the Swiss Alps — Eiger (13,024 feet), Mönch (13,400 feet), Jungfrau (13,600 feet), Matterhorn (14700 ft), and Mont Blanc (15,700 feet). Seeing the mountains this close from the air is unlike anything you've experienced. Scenic flights are available all year round, weather permitting. They leave on demand with a minimum of two people, and the minimum age recommended is five.



HELI OR PLANE SKYDIVING

Helicopter or plane skydiving over Lauterbrunnen valley is the best way to get close to the Swiss Alps. Such an unforgettable experience awaits you as you enjoy three experiences in one! Your adventure will start with an eight-minute scenic flight as the helicopter/plane climbs to altitude. Enjoy the views of Lauterbrunnen Valley and the incredible Swiss Alps, including the famous peaks Eiger, Mönch, and Jungfrau. A 45-second adrenaline-pumping freefall follows the flight from an altitude of 13,000 feet. Feel the ground rushing towards you at 120 mph! Once the parachute is deployed, take a deep breath and enjoy the five to seven-minute canopy ride, taking you safely back to the ground.


INTERNATIONAL HOT AIR BALLOON FESTIVAL


MONTREUX


GOLDEN PASS | PANORAMIC & BELLE ÉPOQUE


BOX SALT MINES
