## **ABOUT**


Located in the Central Pacific, Kauai is the easternmost major island of the Hawaiian Archipelago. It is affectionately referred to as the Garden Island and with good reason. Kauai is beautifully draped in emerald green valleys, jagged cliffs aged by the elements and time and sharp mountain spires. It is otherworldly with tropical rainforests, meandering rivers and cascading waterfalls.


Regarded as the oldest of the Hawaiian Islands, there is something intangible about Kauai that makes worries disappear in the balmy trade winds. The most remote of its siblings, Kauai abounds with a timeless mystique. The Garden Island's untouched rainforests of Koke'e host the planet's rarest plants and birds. Secluded and pristine, Kauai has a population of less than 75,000. This small-town island is renowned for its protective preserves and old plantation history.

Waimea Canyon and Na Pali Coast have been dazzling visitors for decades with their grandeur. The dramatic cliffs and pinnacles of the Na Pali Coast have served as a backdrop for major Hollywood films, while 10-mile-long Waimea Canyon and the Nounou Trails traversing the Sleeping Giant mountain ridge provide otherworldly hiking trails.

The island has slowly but surely developed an enviable culinary scene. So come along and marvel at the wonders of Kauai to see what the fuss is all about.








Just like its sister islands, Kauai's beaches have charmed the world, offering some of the planet's most stunning stretches of coastline. Some may be accessible by trail, by helicopter, or by sea; there is no shortage of diversity on this island, managing to surprise long-time visitors each time with its marine marvels.




Ke'e beach is on the island's northwest shore, marking the trailhead of Kalalau Trail. The path extends along the coast through the Hono'Onapali Natural Reserve and then into the stunning Na Pali Coast State Wilderness Park. This is one of Kauai's top snorkeling destinations during the calmer summer months, and the protected reef is teeming with tropical fish.






Makua beach is considered by many to be the **top destination for snorkelers and divers** during the calm waters of the summer, thanks to the crescent-shaped coral reef sitting just offshore. The reef also makes the beach safe for swimming during the summer, and a slow slope allows plenty of room for wading.






Poipu beach sits on the southern coast of Kauai in a reef-protected area offering safe swimming conditions and good swells for boogie-boarding and surfing. You'll find a full range of conveniences onsite, including showers and restrooms, a picnic area, and a playground, located in Poipu Beach Park, a green space that borders the sand.






Located on Kauai's western shore close to Na Pali State Park, Polihale beach is the longest in the state, stretching for 17 miles. Unfortunately, only 10 of these miles are open to the public which still leaves plenty of room for exploring the dunes. This is not a beach for swimming due to strong currents, and there are no lifeguards on duty.





As the adage goes, "good things come to those that wait." Kauai has caught up to its sister islands in terms of culinary offerings. 

#### THE EATING HOUSE 1849 | HAWAIIAN

This plantation-style restaurant from celebrity chef Roy Yamaguchi is inspired by the original farm-to-table cuisine of ancestral Hawaii. Forbes magazine says the menu is "an interesting amalgamation of Southeast Asian, American and Hawaiian favorites like kampachi sashimi, corned beef Ruebens and huli huli (Hawaiian barbecue)-style pork belly prepared with a touch of haute cuisine finesse." Located in Koloa, The Eating House 1849 is a fantastic destination for a romantic dinner or special occasion.



#### **MERRIMAN'S KAUAI | HAWAIIAN**

Diners will find gourmet pizzas and burgers highlighted on the menu at Merriman's. The thin-crust organic wheat pizzas come with island ingredients such as roasted Hamakua mushrooms or kalua pork with grilled pineapple, as well as classics such as pepperoni and sausage. Burgers feature local grass-fed beef and lamb, although the turkey option with Asian pear, white cheddar, and arugula, is also popular.





This luxury nightspot offers a truly unique and welcoming atmosphere with a 27-foot koa wood bar, outdoor lanai and intimate lounge seating. The bar features beautifully carved koa in traditional sugarcane and pineapple motifs.






The romance of Kauai is front and center at Tidepools. Picture enjoying a delectable meal sitting in a thatch-roofed bungalow above a koi-filled lagoon at the bottom of a waterfall. 




This great little museum in the park is a wonderful place to learn more about the geology and ecology of this beautiful island. This is the place to stop if you're planning a hike in the park, as they'll have all the current trail updates and weather advisories. It's an excellent stop if you have any questions about the flora and fauna you've encountered in the forest!





For history buffs, an immersive visit to the Wai'oli Mission House is a real treat. It's a 19th century mission home that has been preserved in its original state, so you can see how the original missionaries to Hawaii lived.





This beautiful old building in downtown Līhue is a great place to get a sense of Kauai's place in the larger history of the Hawaiian islands. Often overlooked by locals and tourists alike, the Kauai Museum will pleasantly surprise you with comprehensive exhibits about almost every aspect of the island. The museum is substantial and extensive.






Lihue's Grove Farm homestead provides visitors with a fascinating glimpse into the island's past. Polynesia's sugar plantations enthralled the world in the 1800s. Kauai was ground–zero for the world's pursuit of this coveted resource. Grove Farm was one of the earliest plantations belonging to George Wilcox. Today, the historic site showcases the illustrious history of the plantation era.

Kauai's golf courses are pure heaven for golfers. The island is home to some of the best golf in the world. There are oceanside Scottish links-style courses, with rolling terrain and sculpted mountains. The rough on a Kauai course may include lava rocks and thorny Kiawe tree patches, while the greens are framed by glistening ocean, volcanic cliffs with massive ravines and lush-tropical vegetation. With courses scattered all around the island, it is easy to find tee times nearby.



- 2. Ocean Course at Hokuala




The Makai Course winds it way around serene lakes, native woodlands and the spectacular coastline. The course plays to a par 72 with six different sets of tees that can be stretched to more than 7,200 yards from the tips. It consists of a challenging tee shot over scenic cliffs surrounded by brilliant white bunkers and surreal views of the mountains and Pacific Ocean.






The Ocean Course at Hokuala is the longest stretch of oceanfront golf in Hawaii. On the southeast shore of the island, the course winds through mango and guava groves to seaside cliffs, earning its many accolades along the way. It has received an MSN travel nod as one of the world's 12 most beautiful courses.






Kauai's standing as one of the most naturally beautiful places on earth can be explained by the adage that the finest things take time. Kauai is millions of years older than its sister islands in the Hawaiian archipelago, and it shows! The Garden Island stuns with its national splendor – jungles, waterfalls, mountains, valleys, and riverlands. It's no wonder this island is the prime filming spot for some of Hollywood's biggest films. Kauai's backdrop inspires awe and intrigue in the Jurassic Park franchise, Avatar, and George of the Jungle, to name a few. Less populated, Kauai is often unfairly overshadowed by its sisters, yet perhaps the most stunning of the islands. Its emerald valleys, sharp mountaintops, and cliff-sides have been finely sculpted far longer by time and the elements.






Waimea Canyon, on Kauai's west side, is described as "The Grand Canyon of the Pacific." Although not as big or as old as its Arizona cousin, you won't encounter anything like this geological wonder in Hawaii. Stretching 14 miles long, one mile wide and more than 3,600 feet deep, the Waimea Canyon Lookout provides panoramic views of crested buttes, rugged crags and deep valley gorges.





Nā Pali Coast is one of the most recognizable and beautiful coastlines in the world, stretching from the west to the north shore of Kauai. Emerald hued cliffs with razor sharp ridges tower above the Pacific Ocean revealing beautiful beaches and waterfalls plummeting to the lush valley floor.






Hā'ena State Park is at the northwestern extent of Kuhio Highway on Kauai's north shore. The park offers viewing of ancient sea caves formed during a higher stand of the sea, probably 4,000 years ago, as well as the spectacular Nāpali Coast State Wilderness Park.






Perched at the northernmost tip of Kauai, the 52-foot Daniel K. Inouye Kilauea Point Lighthouse was built in 1913 as a beacon for traveling ships. Although its light was turned off in the 1970s and has been replaced by an automatic beacon, it still serves as one of the island's most frequented attractions.





Wailua River State Park consists mainly of the lush Wailua River Valley and the Wailua River, the only navigable river in Hawaii. Two scenic waterfalls, 'Opaeka'a Falls and Wailua Falls provide breathtaking views.







Built nearly 1,000 years ago, the Alekoko Fishpond, minutes from **Lihue**, has been on the National Register of Historic Places since 1973. Ingenious ponds were built to catch fish, and this is one of the finest examples of ancient Hawaiian aquaculture.





Koloa Heritage Trail, is a 14–stop, self-guided 10–mile tour of the Koloa and Poipu area's most important cultural, historical and geological sites, with descriptive plaques explaining each spot's significance. Koloa is a historic south shore area, home to Hawaii's first commercial sugar plantation. In the mid 1800s, sugar replaced whaling to become the principal industry of Hawaii.








The flat roads of Kauai's east coast along the Ke Ala Makalae trail make for an idea leisurely bike ride. This long stretch from Anahola to Nawiliwili in the south is as scenic as it gets. The island's west side presents dramatic dips and thrills for the downhill bike enthusiast riding to the sea alongside Waimea Canyon. From beginner to expert, Kauai enthralls with its many unmarked trails. The island is ripe for the taking for adventurers. Top mountain biking paths include the Kailua Ridge Trail offering an accessible day trip.





An offroader's dream, Kauai's backcountry terrain offers mountains, rainforests, pristine valleys, riverlands, and everything in between. An exhilarating high paced adventure awaits those looking to get off the beaten track via ATV, off-road, and mud bug tours.





Waimea Canyon and Kokee State Parks offer some of the best hiking trails on the archipelago. This activity is an integral part of the Kauai lifestyle, replete with scenic lookouts and family–friendly hike options from Cliff Canyon to the Black Pipe Trail. The famous Kalalau Trail along the Na Pali Coast may be the most enticing; the 11–mile trek is known for its intermediate difficulty well worth the fantastic north shore views. A visit to the Kokee Natural History Museum is an ideal start to plan an itinerary for the endless hiking trails the Garden Island has to offer.





Na 'Aina Kai, "Lands by the Sea" in Hawaiian, is ever-evolving and unique among the world's botanical gardens. Only here, at the crossroads of the Pacific, will you find the particular rare palette of flora, fauna, land, water and climate that inspired the founders of these gardens to embark on their one-of-a-kind creative endeavor.











#### WHALE WATCHING

If you're lucky to visit Kauai between December and May, your journey will coincide with the migration patterns of the majestic kohola and Humpback whales. Booking a tour or boat charter may not even be necessary to spot these magnificent creatures; however, they are plentifully available for those seeking to get closer to the tail–slapping spout–blowing action. Popular whale watching sites include Poipu beach, Kilauea Lighthouse, or the Na Pali Coast Kalalau Trail. Be sure to keep your eyes peeled towards the ocean's horizon, and a gentle giant may very well greet you.




