RESTAURANT GORDON RAMSAY @@@ | FRENCH CHELSEA

Restaurant Gordon Ramsay is the flagship of the Gordon Ramsay Group. Established by Gordon Ramsay in 1998, the restaurant has held three Michelin stars since 2001. It is a must for the culinary connoisseur, Restaurant Gordon Ramsay offers exquisitely simply French cuisine, infusing the senses with subtle flavors. Join the well-heeled Chelsea set at the celebrity chef's flagship outpost. It's one of the rare places in London to boast three Michelin stars. The elegant interior, impeccable service, and delicious French menu more than live up to the famous chef's reputation. The cuisine is modern French, using the very finest seasonal ingredients and employing both classic and modern techniques.



PÉTRUS BY GORDON RAMSAY # | FRENCH KNIGHTSBRIDGE

Named after the famous Pomerol wine estate in Bordeaux, which produces superlative wine from 100% Merlot vines, Michelin-starred restaurant Pétrus by Gordon Ramsay represents fine dining at its best. At the heart of the elegant room is its striking glass-walled wine store, which features over 700 bins, including Château Pétrus going back to 1948, while red walls and roses further emphasize the theme. Cooking has a classic French heart, with the Ramsay hallmarks of modernity and unfussy execution. The sauces deliver great depth, textural contrasts play an important part, and dishes exhibit consummate balance and seasoning. Opt for the 'Prestige' menu of 6 signature dishes to fully experience the kitchen's talents.



ALAIN DUCASSE AT THE DORCHESTER \$\$\$\$ | MODERN FRENCH MAYFAIR

At the Alain Ducasse's elegant London outpost, the charming and professional team patently understands that making the diner feel at ease is of utmost importance. The menu includes many of the much-loved signatures, however, there are also plenty of new dishes to keep things fresh. A nice touch is that diners can, should they wish, pick several dishes off the tasting menu in order to effectively create their own à la carte. The kitchen sources the very best of British produce and dishes are well-balanced and visually striking with bold, generous flavors that live long in the memory. Sauces are a highlight, there are some amazing wine pairings – and it's hard to resist the signature, Rum Baba.



GYMKHANA II INDIAN MAYFAIR

Set in the heart of Mayfair yet inspired by the clubs of Colonial India, this special restaurant is set over two floors: the ground floor with its individual booths is perfect for lunch – or head downstairs via a mirrored staircase for dinner in the intimate basement with its vivid chili-red color scheme, wood paneling, hunting trophies – and even Grandmother Sethi's old barometer. Northern Indian-influenced menus offer a wide choice, and from the beautifully spiced kebabs and tikkas to the feather-light biryani with its flaky golden pastry dome, you'll find a delicious contrast of textures and flavors combined with a sophisticated edge. Don't overlook the side dishes which are a highlight. Service is knowledgeable, professional, and attentive.



HÉLÈNE DARROZE AT THE CONNAUGHT \$355 | HAUTE FRENCH MAYFAIR

The newly renovated Hélène Darroze at The Connaught is more feminine and less formal, considerably warmer, and more relaxing. That being said, there's still a well-drilled service team on hand to ensure everyone is looked after. When it comes to the cooking – created under the watchful eye of Hélène's head chef – the focus remains steadfastly on the main ingredient; always of extraordinary quality, be it lobster from Cornwall or grouse from Wales. The signature Baba dessert with a choice of Armagnacs aged by her brother Marc, is a must.



HAKKASAN [| CANTONESE MAYFAIR

Founded in 2001, Hakkasan celebrates Chinese cuisine through traditional techniques, the finest ingredients, and contemporary flair. Each kitchen, in Mayfair and Hanway Place, is led by a talented chef whose passion lies in creating uniquely rooted yet modern dishes. Sample Chef Tong Chee Hwee's contemporary take on Cantonese cuisine at elegantly designed Hakkasan restaurant, a celebrity haunt in Mayfair. The dim sum are particularly scrumptious. Other highlights include the roasted silver cod with champagne and honey and the black truffle roasted duck.




SKETCH (THE LECTURE ROOM & LIBRARY) (\$100 PM) MODERN EUROPEAN MAYFAIR

There are few more joyously colorful and lavishly decorated restaurants than The Lecture Room & Library. The building is steeped in history, serving as the headquarters of the Royal Institute of British Architects and the London atelier of Christian Dior. As you're whisked past the braided rope and up the stairs to the first floor of Mourad Mazouz and Pierre Gagnaire's dining Imaginarium you'll feel your expectations rise with every step - and once seated in your eminently comfortable armchair, those hopes will be met by an unfailingly attentive team. The restaurant is not afraid to eschew modern minimalism in favor of extravagant furnishing with an unabashed joie de vivre. The highly organized kitchen does an extraordinary job in executing original dishes bearing all the Pierre Gagnaire hallmarks: the main 'plate' comes surrounded by a number of complementary dishes and before long, your table is covered with an assortment of vessels, with each element excelling in terms of structure, composition, elegance and, above all, flavor. Completing the experience is a sommelier with outstanding knowledge in old and new wine regions.




TRISHNA [5] INDIAN MAYFAIR

Set in the heart of London's Marylebone Village, Trishna delivers a contemporary taste of Indian coastal cuisine and an extensive wine list that focuses on emerging regions and fine wines from niche producers and boutique wineries from all over the world. The informal and pared-back aesthetic of the interiors, offset with antique mirrors, marble table tops, and original wooden paneling offer a sociable neighborhood dining atmosphere, with terrace doors that open onto Blandford Street, creating a semi-alfresco ambiance throughout the restaurant. The coast of southwest India provides the kitchen with most of its influences and the menu is full of vibrant, exciting dishes, including original creations from the tandoor, mouth-watering curries, and satisfying biryani. However, the undoubted star of the show is a version of the dish made famous by the original Trishna in Mumbai: brown crab, in this case from Dorset, with lots of butter and a kick of red chili; it is so wondrously rich that the taste stays with you for days. The various tasting menus often provide the most rounded experience.



UMU SS JAPANESE MAYFAIR

Umu is authentic Kyoto-style kaiseki in the heart of Mayfair. From its discreet entrance to its elegantly dressed room, Umu has always been a restaurant for that special occasion. The restaurant is influenced by the traditions and delicate cuisine of Kyoto, where the philosophy of kaiseki (a traditional multi-course Japanese dinner) is preserved and celebrated. The Japanese 'umu' translates roughly as 'of nature,' and the elegant dishes on offer here have been crafted by Yoshinori Ishii to showcase the true nature of the carefully selected ingredients he uses. The ingredients are of irreproachable quality and their natural flavors are always brought to the fore. Look out for the lightly grilled tuna back and belly with three sauces or wild Cornish lobster with homemade shichimi pepper tofu miso bisque on the à la carte menu. Some dishes are simple; others are presented with a flourish at the table – but all are prepared with considerable care and respect.



THE DINING ROOM AT THE GORING SEST TRADITIONAL BRITISH MAYFAIR

In the luxurious setting of a five-star London hotel, The Dining Room is beautifully elegant – a place where traditional and delicious British food triumphs. The holder of a Michelin star and three AA Rosettes, The Dining Room offers an impeccable yet fun dining experience. Savor Michelin star British cuisine with three-course lunch at the Royal Family's restaurant of choice, The Goring Dining Room set in a magnificent Edwardian hotel, The Goring. The Goring is a model of British style and imperial opulence and its ground-floor dining room is the epitome of grace and decorum. It appeals to those who adhere to tradition and bon ton. The food is as exquisite as the well-adorned setting. Think Rhug Estate lamb or Cornish wild halibut slow-cooked with nasturtiums. All the dishes are displays of impressive understanding of the balance between flavor, and texture.



RESTAURANT STORY (350) | MODERN BRITISH MAYFAIR

The setting – on an island in the middle of two roads – may be slightly unusual but that's all part of the experience and, once seated, you'll enjoy being ensconced in your own little bubble watching the world go by. Tom Sellers tells his story and the story of British food through an ever–evolving tasting menu of seasonal dishes, visually impressive, they are crafted with care and precision; ingredients are at the luxurious end of the scale and modern techniques bring out the best in every item. Imaginative, playful touches come through in dishes such as the 'Paddington Bear' pre–dessert of pain perdu and citrus marmalade. The menu is tailored so that returning guests receive a different experience from first–timers. The restaurant gained its first Michelin star five months from opening in 2013 and its second Michelin star in 2021.



LA DAME DE PIC LONDON (36) | FRENCH MAYFAIR

Anne-Sophie Pic's London outpost is a charmingly run restaurant in the impressive Beaux-Arts style Four Seasons Hotel. It is an airy, high-ceilinged room with lots of white, plenty of light, and some attractive modern art. Cooking is rooted in classic French techniques yet delivered in a light, modern manner and dishes are elegant, refined, and original, with tremendous attention given to finer details. The kitchen sources excellent quality produce and the delicate combinations of these ingredients are exciting and intuitive, with no superfluous elements on the plate. The well-structured wine list highlights wines from the Rhône Valley – home of Maison Pic restaurant, the Valence institution, owned by the Pic family.



Granger & Co., a restaurant started by Australian chef Bill Granger, sprang up in London in 2011 and has been such a hit that it's opened three locations in the U.K., and has dotted the map in Tokyo, Seoul, Sydney, and some lucky Americans, in Honolulu, Hawaii. But the Londoners accept the 30 minutes of waiting time for the legendary breakfast. The famous ricotta pancakes as well as the scrambled eggs are a must for all brunch lovers. For lunch, you should definitely try the tuna with avocado salad and in the evening the shrimp burger.



THE IVY | TRADITIONAL BRITISH CHELSEA



Also on the menu is the superlative Beijing Duck and a variety of exciting vegetarian dishes.



NUSR-ET | STEAKHOUSE

KNIGHTSBRIDGE

Recognized as one of the most successful food and beverage brands in Turkey, Nusret opened its first restaurant in Knightsbridge, London in September 2021. The globe-trotting brand of Nusret Gökçe (aka Salt Bae), a social media sensation, cooperated with the Parla Projects Team who showcased their bespoke abilities at Nusr-et Steakhouse London. The result is a rich environment dominated by brass and marble elements, defined with chic details offering utmost comfort. Reflecting luxury and royalty, linear elements are perfectly aligned with sophisticated curves bathed in gold finish. As for the food, at the Nusr-et Steakhouse, guests can expect to dine on a menu that includes signature dishes such as roasted Asado short-rib, and Nusr-Et meat spaghetti, containing paper-thin cuts of seared beef which diners are encouraged to twirl around their forks and eat like pasta. Outside, you'll also find a secluded dining terrace, with monochrome striped awnings, plush seating, and an outdoor fireplace crackling with heat in the colder months.

HARRY'S BAR I ITALIAN



LE RELAIS DE VENISE L'ENTRECÔTE | FRENCH MARYLEBONE

Situated some steps away from Marylebone Lane, making a reservation for lunch or dinner at Le Relais De Venise will allow you to enjoy this elegant residential yet lively area of London. The atmosphere here is the same as in the Paris restaurant, with the same decor and obviously the same menu: a crunchy walnut salad followed by a good quality grilled beef steak and golden French fries accompanied by the signature famous sauce. Delight on their menu is gourmet desserts – the restaurant's renowned profiteroles, tulipe au chocolat, or fruit tarts.



ROYAL CHINA CLUB | CANTONESE MARYLEBONE

This luxurious Marylebone flagship of the smart Royal China group, despite doubling in size, still feels intimate. Instead of one large dining room, the restaurant is split into two, while five new private dining rooms benefit from natural light. The new look is slick without being intimidatingly stylish: gold leaf on the ceiling, red lacquer on the wall, and enough black leather seating. The Royal China Club is known for the "exceptional standard" of its dim sum during the day and its Cantonese classics, including seafood, in the evening. The fare is classic, but with premium ingredients: fresh abalone tossed with caviar, pan-fried scallops with foie gras, or a grilled Wagyu fillet in teriyaki sauce.



34 MAYFAIR | EUROPEAN MAYFAIR

Tucked behind Grosvenor Square sits the fanciful 34 Mayfair where the lavish menu is as lovely as the art-deco-inspired interiors. Considered the hidden gem of Mayfair with its elegant terrace, the restaurant has been delighting diners since 2011. Upon entering you can get easily seduced by the soft lighting, Upper East Side-style elegance, and unflustered calm; yet there is also a whiff of nonconformism about this restaurant. Whether it's the mischievous etchings by Tracey Emin in the eponymous private room upstairs – The Emin Room; or the eclectic collection of paintings from the next strain of young British artists adorning the walls, it's difficult to pinpoint. Open all day, the restaurant offers lovingly prepared dishes for lunch, dinner, and weekend brunch, ensuring there is a menu with variety to suit all tastes and occasions.



AMAZONICO | LATIN AMERICAN MAYFAIR

Originally opened in 2010 by a husband and wife team and renowned restaurateurs, Sandro Silva and Marta Seco, Amazónico quickly became one of Madrid's most popular and well-loved restaurants. Amazónico London, situated in the heart of Mayfair on Berkeley Square was the couple's first restaurant to open outside of Spain and similarly takes inspiration from the cultural diversity and gastronomic heritage of the Amazon region. Open from lunch until late, discover an immersive environment of rainforest-inspired lush greenery and natural materials designed by internationally renowned artist Lázaro Rosa-Violan. Combining a blend of tropical and Latin American cuisines, the menus are not only inspired by the countries of the Amazon but the unique Asian and Mediterranean communities which inhabit them. From Peruvian sushi and the freshest raw seafood, to carefully sourced grilled meats and fish; the chefs use both traditional and cutting-edge techniques along with seasonal and vibrant ingredients to transport you to Latin America.



BAGATELLE | MODERN FRENCH MAYFAIR

Bagatelle London, situated on fashionable Dover Street in the heart of Mayfair, is part of an international group of restaurants that first opened in New York's Meatpacking District in 2008; now it has many outposts across the globe in places like Los Angeles, St. Tropez, Punta del Este, St Barthélemy and Dubai. Well known for attracting celebrities, the London venue is spread over two floors with an upstairs fine dining restaurant and a downstairs lounge and bar. Interiors are much as you'd expect from a restaurant group with such a luxurious heritage. Plush blue velvet booths line the room, intricate chandeliers hang from the ceiling and Damien Hirst artworks scale the walls. Classically trained French chef Dale Osborne leads the kitchen. The very finest seasonal produce is sourced from trusted suppliers for a menu that showcases dishes like yellowfin tuna tartare with brunoise-cut avocado or T-bone steak cooked over an open charcoal grill. Diners can also opt for sharing dishes – a signature poulet entier roti à la truffle or seafood platters. The impressive wine list covers a lot of ground and the cocktail list ensures meeting cocktail connoisseurs' taste.



CECCONI'S MAYFAIR | ITALIAN/VENETIAN MAYFAIR

Cecconi's is a Venetian-inspired restaurant with a cocktail bar serving classic Italian dishes in an elegant setting. Based in historical Burlington Gardens, the restaurant is surrounded by private art galleries and old-school tailor shops. Cecconi's has a striking green and dark wood interior, reminiscent of a classy Italian bar. The waiters are very friendly and welcoming – they have a warm Italian attitude. For starter try aubergine parmigiana, proscuitto toscano or Courgette flower with ricotta & tomato sauce. Baked cod served with clams, mussels, and capers are delicious. As for dessert, try the tiramisu.



CHINA TANG | CANTONESE MAYFAIR

Mayfair restaurant, China Tang at The Dorchester, is widely heralded as home to some of the finest authentic Cantonese food outside China. China Tang bears the unmistakable fingerprint of its flamboyant creator, Sir David Tang, dressed to impress even London's most glamorous clientele. From the low-key Art Deco entrance on Park Lane, guests descend into a subterranean world inspired by the romance of pre-war Shanghai, where quirky objects d'arts twinkle in every corner and plush banquettes and ornate paneling flank the walls. The dining room serves classical Cantonese dishes prepared in a time-honored manner, using the freshest ingredients to showcase centuries of perfected recipes. From the Dim Sum menus to favorites such as Ma Po Tofu, Yu Xiang Aubergine, and succulent Char Siu including the ultimate centerpiece, Peking Duck, bronzed, lacquered, and juicy, the menu celebrates Chinese cooking and excites the most discerning diner.



CHUCS MAYFAIR | ITALIAN/ MEDITERRANEAN MAYFAIR


COYA | PERUVIAN MAYFAIR

IT | ITALIAN MAYFAIR



The restaurant and bar are open seven days a week. A private dining space, The Coral Reef Room, is on the lower ground floor and houses two of the largest live coral reef tanks in the world. The bar holds the world's biggest Japanese whisky collection and offers a drinks menu featuring both classic and inventive cocktails.



SCOTT'S MAYFAIR

One of London's landmark restaurants, Scotts, now part of the Caprice Holdings Limited group that also owns the famous *The Ivy,* opened as an oyster warehouse in 1851. 
RUYA | TURKISH







Fait Maison is all about incredible, beautifully spiced food, and fabulous patisserie and desserts. Everything created by Executive Chef and Creative Director Om Waleed has influences from Palestine, the Middle East and the Mediterranean. The cheesecake at Fait Maison is especially luscious.





Coco Momo is a bright and airy café, bar and British brasserie in one of London's most sought after areas. It's a long-established social hub on Gloucester Road serving breakfast, lunch and dinner from a seasonal all-day menu. For an English favorite sweet treat, try the sticky toffee pudding, toffee sauce and honeycomb ice cream.



POPINA

For the best brownies you'll likely ever try, head to Popina. This place creates sweet and savory baked goods people have become a little obsessive about. Popina turns out simple, honest products always baked from personally sourced ingredients. Whether you're in the mood for crispy tarts, devilishly delicious strudels or cheesecake, you'll find it here. They also offer vegan and gluten-free goodies.





Le Pain Quotidien or "the daily bread," has a menu filled with good food made from quality ingredients. 

SAATCHI GALLERY

The Saatchi Gallery showcases contemporary works of art in a spectacular 70,000-square-foot exhibition space in Duke of York Square, Chelsea. The exhibitions focus on young artists and international artists who have rarely been seen in the UK. Committed to inspire a passion for contemporary art in all audiences, the Saatchi Gallery supports innovative art through temporary exhibitions, an educational programme and events. It seeks to collaborate with artists in an open and honest manner with a primary aim of introducing their work to wider audiences. Saatchi Gallery exists as a registered charity to provide an innovative platform for contemporary art and culture. The gallery also hosts a book shop and a café.





THE NATIONAL GALLERY

Home to one of the greatest collections of paintings in the world, The National Gallery contains a "who's who" of art icons – from Titian and Turner to Van Dyck and Van Gogh. Explore the story of European art at the National Gallery, masterpiece by masterpiece, with its collection – inspiring works by Botticelli, Leonardo da Vinci, Rembrandt, Gainsborough, Turner, Renoir and Van Gogh – belonging to the public. 


BARBICAN ESTATE & BARBICAN ART GALLERY

London's brutalist buildings have long been the subject of much contempt and controversy. These post-war concrete behemoths are being seen in a new light, and receiving the appreciation they deserve. The Barbican Estate is one of London's most iconic and best-known brutalist buildings. Its exterior may give it the air of a forbidding fortress, but inside the thick concrete walls, it's teeming with culture and features extensive greenery and water. The Estate is a home to the Barbican Art Gallery, from acclaimed architects to Turner prize-winning artists, and stars of design and photography, it showcases major exhibitions by leading international figures.



LONDON'S STREET ART

From Banksy pieces to works by undiscovered artists, step outdoors to appreciate London's urban art. Street art can be found almost everywhere in London, and it's free for everyone to enjoy. Discover contemporary sculpture, abstract art, modern murals and quirky installations dotted across the capital. One of the most famous street artists to date is the anonymous Banksy, whose distinctive stencil artwork has regularly appeared in London for more than a decade. You can also find moving examples of memorial street art throughout the capital, pieces that pay tribute to some of London's greatest music artists.





London's Museum Neighbourhood is in the Kensington District and is where you'll find some of the world's greatest museums, including the Natural History Museum, the Science Museum and the Victorian & Albert Museum. A visit to London's museum neighbourhood is a great way to spend a rainy day in the capital, and many of the museums offer special child-friendly exhibits that are perfect for kids.

While not strictly an art gallery, the Design Museum in Kensington is not to be missed if you're a lover of contemporary art or design. It showcases everything from architecture and fashion to graphics, product and industrial design.





The domed glass-and-steel ceiling at the British Museum – the world's first national museum opened to the public – lets light into the atrium-like Great Court below, bouncing off the blinding-white, sweeping staircases and marble walls. Beyond the impressive lobby, it has sprawling galleries dedicated to the Egyptians, the Greeks and the Romans. Artefacts including the Rosetta Stone, Pantheon Marbles and more than 120 mummies draw millions of visitors every year.






The ornate facade of the Natural History Museum is a love letter to Victorian architecture: a vast gothic building that looks more like a cathedral than a museum. Inside the lofty Hintze Hall with Hope, a ginormous blue-whale skeleton, hanging above the information desk. See dinosaur fossils, the first edition of Charles Darwin's *On the Origin of Species* and casts from Pompeii among the museum's 80 million specimens.




VICTORIA AND ALBERT MUSEUM

Victoria and Albert Museum is London's largest art museum – the eighth-biggest art museum in the world – has more than 100 galleries displaying everything from photography to jewelry. It has put on some of the city's most talked-about exhibitions in recent years: the museum curators featured fashion displays of designers like Christian Dior and Alexander McQueen. The museum highlights include the Medieval Renaissance Galleries, containing some of the greatest surviving treasures from the period, the breathtaking William and Judith Bollinger Jewelry Gallery and the stunning British Galleries, illustrating the history of Britain through the nation's art and design.



THE ANGLESEA ARMS | PUB

The Anglesea Arms pub in South Kensington is a gorgeous space with outdoor seating and a dining area. They also boast a AA Rosette for culinary excellence. The Anglesea delivers on all fronts – with its glorious gastropub fare, great wine list, very friendly service, and good local vibe; and it's regularly ranked as one of London's better hostelries. Its quiet location, in a leafy sidestreet near Ravenscourt Park (with a small outside terrace), adds further to its appeal.



THE CHURCHILL ARMS | PUB

Dripping in flowers and crammed with Churchill memorabilia, The Churchill Arms is one of London's most recognizable and famous watering holes. It's hard to believe that a pub this well-kept was first built way back in 1750 – but it's true, the pub was frequented by Churchill's grandparents. The Churchill Arms is one of London's prettiest historic pubs. Nowadays, it's known for serving real ales and authentic Thai cuisine. The outside is decorated with over 100 flower pots, 48 window boxes, and 42 hanging baskets. The Churchill Arms' stunning floral displays have earned them a Chelsea Flower Show win. They're one of the only pubs to ever claim that prestigious title. Inside, it's just as eccentric – nearly every available surface is cluttered with baskets, pictures, and beer mats – there are even life-size cutouts of the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge suspended from the ceiling.




CAHOOTS | COCKTAIL BAR

Welcome to Cahoots, where spirits are high and drinks never run dry – a playground for London's scoundrels! Cahoots is a 1940s-themed bar in the heart of London's Soho. Set inside an abandoned train station, the scoundrels of this station speakeasy serve up spiffing cocktails, jolly-good rations, and live swinging entertainment seven days a week. Made up of three spaces: The Underground, Ticket Hall & Control Room, step back in time and enjoy each quirky space as you indulge in *High Spirits, Scoundrels & Swing!*




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45 BAR | COCKTAIL BAR

Bar 45 is in The Dorchester Collection's new hotel in Mayfair, 45 Park Lane. The bar features a long, black granite bar with an autumnal amber and red color scheme throughout. The dynamic atmosphere of the eponymous BAR 45 makes this the ideal Central London venue for cocktail sipping and people-watching. The cocktail menu at Bar 45 includes specialty infused vodka and gin creations, a warm-hearted recommendation is *Pepito's Revenge*, made from tequila and lime with an overriding basil flavor, and the Umami Cocktail, although impossible to accurately describe, is certainly worth a try.



BULGARI LOUNGE | LOUNGE

Offering the comfortable glamour and considered taste of a beautifully appointed modern Italian living room, the design of The Bulgari Lounge pays homage to Bulgari's heritage as the master of colored gems. Alongside Executive Chef Adriano Cavagnini's delicious Salato menu of Italian favorites and hotel lounge classics, The Bulgari Lounge presents a residency with eminent pastry chef and chocolatier Gianluca Fusto, the *Italian architect of modern pastry*. Covering everything sweet on the menu, 'Dolci' include cakes – *Torte*, and Il Cioccolato, Bulgari's signature handcrafted chocolate gems. All Torte, Mono Porzioni and Il Cioccolato are available to enjoy in The Bulgari Lounge or to take away. The patisserie serves indulgent Italian mignons and delicious healthy dishes as well.



CONNAUGHT BAR | COCKTAIL BAR

Drop by the Connaught Bar in Mayfair and step into another world. Conversation flows over sparkling glasses and candle lit tables. Behind the bar, mixologists conjure up new concoctions and time-honored classic cocktails. Before you savor that first sip, take in the surroundings. Textured walls in platinum silver leaf and a cool grey bar set a stylish tone. Designed by David Collins Studio, the bar evokes English and Irish Cubist art of the 1920s, with a touch of timeless elegance. From day to night, the Connaught Bar is infused with a relaxed, inviting energy. To accompany your drinks, choose from light menus of bar snacks and evening canapés.



NIGHTJAR | COCKTAIL BAR

Nightjar's reputation for breathing new life into forgotten cocktails and bringing a fresh perspective to classic recipes and presentations is world-renowned. Alongside the cocktail menu is an extensive spirit list, including vintage spirits. The owners of this bar are a quartet of Frenchman who kickstarted the cocktail revolution in Paris a decade ago. Come here for cocktails, whether Gallic-tinged riffs on classics (where a recipe might conventionally use soda, the French will swap out crisp champagne) or the chance to try some premium vintage drinks. They also have delicious contemporary tapas and a nightly schedule of the very best vintage jazz, blues, ragtime, and swing that London has to offer.



PUNCH ROOM | COCKTAIL BAR

Sat within The London Edition hotel in the heart of Fitzrovia, this smart reservation-only joint is one of the coziest cocktail dens in London. Walk straight through the vaulted marble lobby towards the neon sculpture, take the wood-paneled door and pick a set in one of the squishy armchairs by the roaring fire. It has the feel of an old English parlor, with a mid-century makeover. There's no better way to cap off your evening in Fitzrovia than with a craft cocktail at the Punch Room. Designed to be an intimate space away from the Soho crowds, the bar boasts 30 specialty punches – including the signature gin-infused EDITION house punch. A curated soundtrack of soul, blues, ragtime, and doo-wop is complemented by impromptu live performances.



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AMERICAN BAR | COCKTAIL BAR

The American Bar is the longest surviving cocktail bar in London and one of the most renowned in the world. Serving classics with a twist, new and vintage creations – the American Bar is an icon in cocktail history and has played host to legendary bartenders – historic figures such as Harry Craddock, author of The Savoy Cocktail Book. The American Bar first opened in 1893 and has since served countless well–known faces, from Winston Churchill to Ernest Hemingway. It remains at the forefront of the industry, winning World's Best Bar at Tales of the Cocktail Spirited Awards 2018 and the World's 50 Best Bars 2017.



THE ADAM & EVE | PUB

The Adam & Eve is a bustling Central London hub, between Oxford Circus and Tottenham Court Road train and tube station. It is a historic pub sitting at the edge of greenbelt land in North-West London. It has made a name for itself by serving seasonal, locally sourced modern British food with a traditional pub welcome. Situated over two floors with a charming Victorian walled garden to the rear, it is the perfect pit stop for a bite to eat or a refreshing pint of beer, serving a menu of Great British pub classics, seasonal small plates, and sharers, not forgetting the best thirst-quenching cocktails in Soho.



HOVARDA

Hovarda ('vagabond' in Turkish) is an enchanting spot, its glamorous dining room decked out in aquatic blue and gold tones, its waiters dressed in crisp white shirts. A new Aegean-inspired bar and restaurant that serves cocktails and wines alongside a line-up of live music and international DJs. Head to the place for laid-back vibes alongside a drinks menu of re-invented classics and well-known cocktails created by award-winning mixologist Cihan Anadologlu. Martini fans, shouldn't miss the many varieties of martinis inspired by Greece, Turkey, France, and Italy such as 'The Greek' – made with lemongrass infused Mastiha, grapefruit, and olive brine while 'The Turkish' includes chili-infused Raki, ginger, lime juice, and Turkish honey. On top of the spirits, the wine cellar boasts an expansive range of wines including a list made from Greek grape varietals, and a selection of European vintages.




DONMAR WAREHOUSE

The Donmar Warehouse is a 251-seat, not-for-profit theater in Covent Garden, London, England. It first opened on 18 July 1977. Sam Mendes, Michael Grandage and Josie Rourke have all served as artistic director, a post held since 2019 by Michael Longhurst. The theatre has a diverse artistic policy that includes new writing, contemporary reappraisals of European classics, British and American drama and small-scale musical theatre. As well as presenting at least six productions a year at its home in Covent Garden, every year the Donmar tours one in-house production in the UK.



ST MARTIN'S THEATRE

St Martin's Theatre is a West End theatre which has staged the production of *The Mousetrap* since March 1974, making it the longest continuous run of any show in the world. The theatre is located in West Street, near Shaftesbury Avenue, in the West End of London. It was designed by W. G. R. Sprague as one of a pair of theatres, along with the Ambassadors Theatre, also in West Street. The theatre is still owned by the present Lord Willoughby de Broke and his family.




THE ROYAL OPERA HOUSE

The Royal Opera House is an important performing arts venue in Covent Garden. It is home to The Royal Opera, The Royal Ballet and the orchestra of the Royal Opera House. The large building is often referred to as simply Covent Garden, after a previous use of the site. The first theater on the site, the Theatre Royal (1732), served primarily as a playhouse for the first hundred years of its history. In 1734, the first ballet was presented. A year later, the first season of operas, by George Frideric Handel, began. Many of his operas and oratorios were specifically written for Covent Garden and had their premieres there. You can enjoy a wide range of world-class shows, or take a backstage tour of this historic London theatre.




HAROLD PINTER THEATRE

The Harold Pinter Theatre opened in 1881 as the Royal Comedy Theatre and staged hugely successful shows, such as *The Rocky Horror Show*'s West End debut. The name changed in 2011 to The Harold Pinter Theatre in honour of Pinter's work for the Comedy Theatre. The theatre recently produced Pinter at the Pinter, a series of one-act plays in celebration of Pinter himself. Located in Westminster, the Harold Pinter Theatre is famous for its immense history, luxury horseshoe-shaped balconies and of course, for its intimate shows. The theatre is extremely rich with history and is better known as the comedy theatre, which the venue was called for more than 100 years.




LONDON COLISEUM

The London Coliseum is a theatre in St Martin's Lane, Westminster, built as one of London's largest and most luxurious *family* variety theatres. Opened on 24 December 1904 as the London Coliseum Theatre of Varieties, it was designed by the theatrical architect Frank Matcham for the impresario Oswald Stoll.It is the home of the English National Opera, the London Coliseum is a beautiful theatre in the West End. It is one of the largest theatres in London and, in addition to the ENO, regularly hosts musicals and visiting companies, including the English National Ballet.





As the largest publicly funded theatre in London, the National Theatre is the granddaddy of the capital's scene. It shows 25 major productions a year, with numerous smaller performances and festivals at regular intervals. The Olivier Theatre – its main stage – is a beautiful hall modeled on the ancient Greek theatre of Epidaurus.





The Old Vic is London's independent not-for-profit theatre, a world leader in creativity and entertainment. This not-for-profit theatre based in Waterloo is one of London's most iconic. It's known as a centerpiece of the London theatre scene for generations, playing host to many personnel that went on to form the National Theatre, including Laurence Olivier. The theatre went through a complete refurbishment in 2003.





Originally built in 1599 only to be demolished in 1644, this painstakingly constructed replica of Shakespeare's Globe theatre is the perfect place to explore some the UK's traditional theatre. Of course, you'll find many of the Bard's best works performed here, as well as some more unique and bizarre performances that will keep you enthralled. It is open from March to October and has a set programme of Shakespearean classics every summer.






The Barbican Centre is a performing arts centre in the Barbican Estate of the City of London and the largest of its kind in Europe. The centre hosts classical and contemporary music concerts, theatre performances, film screenings and art exhibitions. It also houses a library, three restaurants, and a conservatory. The venue is the base of the London Symphony Orchestra and presents an exciting international program of shows, talks and festivals.





ELECTRIC CINEMA

The Electric Cinema is a cinema in Notting Hill, London. This Edwardian venue is one of the oldest in London and is the perfect place for a romantic date, offering beautiful decor and a bar stocked with champagne and other tipples. Watch new releases with a glass of red, from one of of 65 leather armchairs with foot stalls and side tables; or push your cinematic boat out and book one of the six double beds in the front row, complete with snuggly cashmere blankets. As of 2022, after a couple of changes of hands, the cinema is also known as the Electric Portobello, with a second screen at the old Television Centre at White City called the Electric White City.





Part of the Institut Français, the French Cultural Institute in London, Ciné Lumière is an Art Deco charmer right in the heart of stylish South Ken. Set in a lavish masterpiece of a building (look out for the marble staircase, complete with Rodin statue), and named after the Lumière brothers, the emphasis is on showcasing contemporary French, European and world cinema. The venue shows French classics on Sundays and subtitled films for children aged four and above – ideal for families or those looking to brush up on their beginner French.



BFI SOUTHBANK




PAVILION ROAD


CAMDEN MARKET
