ABOUT

A Mediterranean playground, Mallorca or 'Majorca' often spelled in English, is the largest of Spain's Balearic Islands. Known as the largest island in the Balearic archipelago off the coast of Spain, Mallorca is a hotspot for tourists seeking an unforgettable Mediterranean vacation. This naturally beautiful island has been ruled by various kingdoms over its centuries-long history but is now a major destination for European tourists looking to enjoy the sun and sand. Mallorca is divided into three sections with the west coast dominated by the Serra de Tramuntana mountain chain, the east coast marked by the Serra de Llevant mountains, and the island's center described as "es plas," or the plain.








- 1. Sierra de Tramuntana (North, Northwest, Southwest)

- 6. Levante (Northeast)




SIERRA DE TRAMUNTANA

It is is a *comarca* (county) in the island that runs parallel to Mallorca's northwest coast, stretching approximately 90 kilometres from Port Andratx to the most northern tip of Cap Formentor. The spectacular mountainous landscape is dominated by the island's highest peak – Puig Major, and comprises numerous charming villages and quaint hamlets nestled within its valleys. In 2011, the region was awarded UNESCO World Heritage Site status. An ideal setting for all manner of outdoor pursuits, the county attracts nature lovers and sports enthusiasts from all over to explore its majestic mountains, cliffs, forests, coves and beaches. Many artists drew inspiration from the stunning surroundings, and the area has hosted its fair share of celebrity looking for a secluded and serene place to disconnect. Serra de Tramuntana lures you in with its 'real Mallorca' feel and incomparable scenery, especially inviting and sought-after vacation homes are around towns of Sóller, Deià, Valldemossa and Pollensa.




RAIGUER

At the foot of the Tramuntana mountain range and bounded by the bays of Palma and Alcúdia lies Raiguer, a transition zone towards Pla, the flattest and most rural part of the island. The landscape is adorned with lush forests, beautiful valleys, and farmland, which alternate with cozy mountain villages, towns with a craft and industrial past, and tourist centers with the mountains as a common denominator that always remain as a backdrop. Thirteen municipalities make up Raiguer: Alaró, Alcúdia, Binissalem, Búger, Campanet, Consell, Inca, Lloseta, Mancor de la Vall, Marratxí, Sa Pobla, Santa Maria del Camí and Selva. Inca, the capital of the region and known for its leather tradition, is a dynamic city with a very lively commercial and cultural urban core. Eating in a cellar (restaurant with traditional Mallorcan cuisine) is also a must-stop for any tourist visiting the island. Alcúdia, with its medieval walls and the vestiges of the island's Roman past, is recognized for the prestige of its beaches with crystal clear waters. Where the Romans are, there are the wine routes. Mallorcan wine tastings are characteristic of the region. DO Binissalem (a Spanish Denominación de Origen Protegida (DOP)) route crosses some localities in the area, such as Santa Maria del Camí, Consell, and Binissalem, among others.



PALMA DE MALLORCA

Walk along the pretty streets of La Calatrava or follow the twisted turns in La Lonja and it soon becomes apparent that Palma de Mallorca is a city of beauty. With the sea a short walk away, its streets, terraces and historic plazas are blessed with a warm wind that sweeps the Mediterranean. Architecture in Palma de Mallorca fuses beautiful edifices, natural sandstone and benefits from the sea just a short walk away. Therefore, it is no surprise that Palma is a city of the outdoors, for people who enjoy walking, cycling, running and skating. Its endless blue skies and sunlight are constant, and when good weather is almost always guaranteed, it lays the foundation for an active and healthy lifestyle. There are pockets of Palma such as El Borne, Paseo Maritímo and the Old Town which all carry their own distinct identity, made clearer by influences from outside Mallorca.



PLA DE MALLORCA

In the center of Majorca, between the island's two mountain ranges: the Tramuntana (to the northwest) and the Llevant mountain ranges (to the southeast), is the county of Pla de Mallorca — a plain dotted with hills where the most rural part of Majorca begins. It is a place where farmers have worked the land and reared livestock for centuries. However, the boom in inland tourism has turned many Majorcan farms into rural vacation villas so travelers can get to know the charms of the humble land. Fourteen small towns - Algaida, Ariany, Costitx, Lloret de Vistalegre, Llubí, Maria de la Salut, Montuïri, Petra, Porreres, Santa Eugènia, Sant Joan, Sencelles, Sineu, and Vilafranca de Bonany - make up a county in which the last traces of traditional farm life remain. The weekly markets held in each town, where the freshest produce from Majorcan farms is sold, are one of the region's longest-lasting traditions. The numerous fairs and patron saint fiestas also characterize the county. You simply cannot miss the museums that keep the county's past alive, such as the Gordiola Glass Museum (in Algaida) or the Museum of Natural Sciences, located in Costitx. There are plenty of activities to get culturally immersed.




MIGJORN

The county of Migjorn, in the south of Majorca, is a plain dotted with forests that extends to the south coast, where you can find some of the best coves on the island. It is made up of five towns — Campos, Felanitx, Llucmajor, Ses Salines, and Santanyí. Migjorn's most popular feature is its beautiful coastline, which stretches from El Arenal (to the east) to Portocolom (to the west), offering beautiful coves with crystalline waters surrounded by pine forests. Beyond the coast, several parts of the interior are also worth a visit. In Felanitx, you must climb Puig de Sant Salvador, crowned with the Sant Salvador sanctuary. Other notable landmarks include the medieval castle of Santueri, perched on the mountain, the hot springs of Sant Joan de la Font Santa, discovered in Roman times; and lastly, the Salobrar salt flats, the largest in the Balearic Islands.




LEVANTE

The Northeast is simultaneously a place where you can find everyone and no-one. It is home to intriguing caves, archaeological sites and stretches of deserted coastline. It also includes some of Mallorca's most popular holiday resorts; places which come alive in summer and fade completely in the winter. Mallorca's second largest town, Manacor, as well as Arta are in this county. Manacor is equipped with all the shops and services required for ordinary everyday living. A slower paced lifestyle can be enjoyed in one of the Northeast's medieval villages or fishing towns.





The stunning Cala d'Egos is yours to enjoy If you're in the mood for an adventurous day. This unspoiled beach is perfect for swimming, diving, paddleboarding, sunbathing, and anchoring small boats and yacht tenders. The cove is surrounded by a pine forest and, more excitingly, several caves just waiting to be explored. The best way to reach the cove is by water.



CALA DEL MAGO

Just thirty minutes from Palma central lies Playa Del Mago. While maybe not the most private of beaches, it is one of the most beautiful on this island and is a great option for yachting. The tiny beach is only around 20 meters long and is situated in an unspoiled cove surrounded by rocks and greenery where the fine white sand gently slopes into the shallow, crystal clear waters. Playa Del Mago is so picturesque that it was used as a filming location for the 1967 classic film, The Magician, starring Michael Caine and Anthony Quinn. It was also one of Mallorca's first nudist beaches.





Same as Calo del Moro, Cala S'Almunia beach is remote and rural sandy beach splashed by bright turquoise waters enclosed by sharp cliffs and rocks and Mediterranean scrub. The beach belongs to a very small town consisting of just 30–40 houses with which it shares the name, but it's sometimes called Es Maquer. It's not far from the southern tip of Mallorca, and the closest major town is Santanyi 5 kilometers to the north.




CALO DEL MORO

The beaches of Calo del Moro and Cala S'Almunia are so beautiful and undeveloped sandy stretches of sand and bright turquoise waters are surrounded by steep cliffs, rocks, and pine trees, making for the perfect photo ops. It's also a great place for diving and anchoring small yacht tenders, with the nearest port two nautical miles away at Port Cala Figuera de Santanyí. Although still relatively unknown to most tourists, the beaches are well known to locals, so it's worth departing from the yacht first thing in the morning and getting there early to enjoy the beach before it gets busy.



CALA MÀRMOLS

Calo des Marmols is a remote but wonderful bay, far away from Mallorca's bustling resort towns and overcrowded beaches. Deep in the bay lies the 40-meter-long beach, surrounded by high cliffs. The sand is light and neat but is mixed with some gravel. The crystal-clear water shimmers in blue and turquoise colors and invites you to a swim in the adventurous ocean. There are not many visitors. Some come by boat, while others walk 5.5 km. long distance from the lighthouse in Cap de ses Salines, the south tip of Mallorca. It is a tough hike, especially in the heat, but the surroundings are unique and worth the trip alone.







Cala Varques is a gorgeous place to start if you love white sandy beaches with clear turquoise water. It's a cove surrounded by jagged rocks, cliffsides, and lush greenery. If renting your boat, try to make it either for the sunrise or sunset. Bear in mind that there are no man-made facilities on this beach, so rely on your adventurous side.





The beach clubs in Mallorca are famous for their luxurious surroundings and second to none service. A day at one of these resorts is a day full of pampering. The cosmopolitan island of Mallorca offers some of the finest beach clubs in the world that have become centres of Mediterranean nightlife. Most offer more than just beach atmosphere with exclusive bars, restaurants, pools and exciting parties with live music and interesting guests. Resident or holidaymaker, there's a beach club for every taste.


PUROBEACH ILLETAS

The spacious new club comprises distinct areas: restaurant, terrace bar, and beach, oasis, and palm chill-out areas for whiling away a memorable day by the sea. There are 109 sunbeds, four Balinese beds, and three 'Nomads' beds, but the site is large enough not to feel crowded. Open all day from noon, the al fresco restaurant also serves a healthy brunch on Sundays. It's a popular spot for locals taking a work break for lunch with a side order of sea air.

PONDEROSA BEACH





BARRETES | MEDITERRANEAN

The region where Ca's Xorc Luxury Retreat is situated is home to an abundance of delicious fresh and local food such as a selection of fruit & vegetables, fish, red shrimp, lamb and Iberico pork. The chef at Ca's Xorc interprets this local, Mediterranean cuisine in a modern and creative manner. The restaurant offers fresh and simple Mediterranean-inspired cuisine using vegetables, fresh herbs, seasonal fruits, cereals and homemade olive oil. All produce is local, fresh, natural and organic. ES PI | MEDITERRANEAN

In the heart of Mallorca's northern mountain range is Sa Pedrissa, a 17th century rural estate set between the sea and the mountains. From the terraces of the house, visitors can enjoy unparalleled views over the Mediterranean sea and the verdant mountains. In the countryside around Sa Pedrissa, ancient olive trees rise up from the hillside terraces. The El Olivo restaurant is the crowning jewel of the renowned Belmond La Residencia and perhaps one of the finest restaurants in Mallorca – here the art of dining is taken to the next level: the seduction of the palate. 



EL LIOQUET | MALLORCAN



BISTRO BADIA | SPANISH, LATIN-AMERICAN & INTERNATIONAL






With a capacity of 3,000 people the award winning BCM Planet Dance is the biggest nightclub in Mallorca. 


If you are on Jaime III it can mean only one thing, shopping. It was Palma's most important high street until Borne become the new designer street for the big brands but now you will still find stores such as Cartier and Lottusse here.



CARRER DE SANT FELIU

The charm and character of Carrer de Sant Feliu lie in the street's contrasting mix of period architecture and modern commercial establishments. Nestled in the heart of Palma Old Town, it connects the famous Paseo del Borne with Calle de la Paz, being home to remarkable art galleries and stylish boutiques, including the exclusive Rialto Living and Estilo Sant Feliu – a delightful home decor store specializing in distinctive Mallorquin products in colorful *llengos* patterns. Along this dark, atmospheric street lined with richly decorated Modernista facades, you will also find the fashionable Can Colmar Boutique Hotel, the emblematic Atlantico Cocktail Bar, and Bon Lloc – Mallorca's foremost vegan restaurant.






In the past few years Paseo del Borne has become the most important shopping street on the island, with the opening of Rialto Living, the Louis Vuitton store, Hugo Boss, Carolina Herrera and Mulberry making this the 'designer street' for luxury shopping. Borne is now known as the golden mile of Palma.





One of Palma's most adorable little streets, Costa d'en Brossa snakes its way through the historic city center, twisting and turning, sometimes suddenly morphing into stairs. Running from Plaça de Cort to Plaça del Mercat, this area is a treasure trove of cute crafts, vintage clothing, and all kinds of original products not to be found elsewhere. Stop by the charming Bazaar Palma to pick up stunning designer homeware, scented candles, and wonderful souvenirs.






The long, narrow shopping street San Miguel leading from Calle Olmos near Plaza España to Plaza Mayor and the nearby streets is where you will find the traditional, local shops of yesteryear. To truly experience shopping in Palma you need to pass through this street until you arrive at Plaza Cort. Ladies will find a great selection of leather shoes made in Spain as well as exclusive boutiques and some well–known brand stores.






Discover the most unmissable heritage sites on the majestic island of Majorca, from towering medieval strongholds and ancient Roman ruins to dazzling royal palaces. Occupied by the Romans and later the Moors, before falling under Catalan control, Majorca has witnessed more than its fair share of conflict and change. Thankfully, the island has tired to preserve its rich heritage, and today a visit there offers access to everything from medieval Arab bathhouses to the ruins of the Roman town of Pollentia. 
VILLAGE OF DEIA

Another charming and idyllic village in the north of the island, Deia has been a popular destination for travellers for centuries. As the years have gone by the village has embraced the arts in particular, becoming a hub for artists, musicians, and writers; the poet Robert Graves even made Deia his home in the 30s. The nearby Cala Deia is a small and lovely beach to visit and enjoy some sun, and the villages bars – such as the popular Sa Fonda – attract a cohort of exceptional musicians.



CASTILLO DE BELLVER I PALMA

It is one of the architectural wonders of the city of Palma and Europe's oldest circular Gothic castle. An absolutely essential visit in Palma de Mallorca. Castillo Bellver was built by King James II of Mallorca in the fourteenth century and was the seat of his court. It is strategically located on top of a hill 112 meters above sea level, surrounded by woods and 3 km from the center of Palma de Mallorca. Throughout its history, this wonderful and impressive fortification served as both a royal residence and prison.




PALACE DE L'ALMUDAINA | PALMA DE MALLORCA

A royal palace has stood on this site next to Palma's cathedral since the Muslim walis (governors) built their alcazar soon after the Arab conquest. It is an ancient 13th-century residence for Mallorca's rulers. The palace was converted into Gothic style under Jaume II, but elements of Islamic architecture remain – like the Moorish arches seen from the seafront, lit up at night like a row of lanterns. Inside you'll find tapestries, paintings and furniture from different time periods throughout its history. The courtyard, laid out in 1309 and flanked by palm trees, is at its best in late afternoon when the sun falls on the cathedral towers overhead. Just off the courtyard is the royal chapel, Capella de Santa Ana.





Set in the island's capital of Palma, this Gothic Roman Cathedral is a architectural wonder. Often known as La Seu, a name used by multiple churches, the Cathedral of Santa Maria of Palma is a sizeable 121 metres long, and remains one of the most popular sights to visit in Mallorca. Lovers of architecture and history can enjoy a tour of this incredible gothic structure, with facades designed by a number of renowned architects, including the modernist Gaudi.




EL CALVARI | POLLENCA

The Knights Templar were the first owners of this mount, which today hosts one of the most impressive traditions of Mallorca's Easter Week celebrations. El Calvari not only offers superb views of Pollença, but is also one of the town's most iconic locations thanks to its impressive stairway. It consists of 365 steps, one for each day of the year, and is flanked by cypress trees and fourteen three-metre-high crosses, evoking the ordeal that, according to Christian tradition, Jesus Christ suffered on the way to his crucifixion on Mount Golgotha.




FORMENTOR LIGHTHOUSE | CAP DE FORMENTOR

The Formentor or Cap de Formentor Lighthouse is an active lighthouse on the island of Majorca. It is the highest lighthouse in the Balearic Islands with a focal height of 210 metres above sea level, perched on high cliffs at the tip of Cap de Formentor. This lighthouse, a true feat of construction given the steep terrain, is the crowning point of a peninsula that offers a perfect balance between nature and art. The northernmost point of Mallorca is a place of outstanding natural beauty that has served as inspiration for many artists. The Formentor headland is one of the most photographed and portrayed places on the island.



CAN LIS I PORTOPETRO

Jørn Utzon was a Danish architect who designed the iconic Sydney Opera House. He retired to Mallorca in the 1970's and built his house, Can Lis on the cliffs by Portopetro in the south east of Mallorca. Can Lis was planned an organic, unified whole, its layout framing the day-to-day events that marked Utzon family life. Jørn Utzon's ideology centred on this very phenomenon – that architecture is not an external form: it is primarily the frame that encloses a collection of ritualized events. Can Lis has been singled out by several leading architecture critics as one of the most important houses of the 20th century.


SEA CAVING







A 3,5 km-long loop road winds past grottoes, waterfalls and a variety of wildlife including peacocks, goats – and there are even three brown bears (behind a large fence, of course but free to roam in acres of forest). There are raptors and birds of prey displays twice daily, plus opportunities for rock climbing, passing swinging bridges, and sliding down canyons.



CAVE EXPLORATION

There are several underground cave systems in Mallorca and all maintain a refreshing temperature of 18° C, all year round.

- Coves d'Arta A guided tour leads through various chambers to the 'Queen of the Pillars' — a huge stalagmite 22 m tall. There is a light and sound show to give extra effect.
- Coves del Drach 'The Caves of the Dragon" comprise of four caves forming a huge underground expanse. The cave is home to Europe's largest underground lake, Lake Martel. Boats with musicians playing classical music sail across it adding to the macabre.
- Coves dels Hams Although smaller than Coves del Drach, here you'll enjoy a Jules Verne video presentation (it is said Mallorca's caves inspired the novelist to write 'Journey to the Centre of the Earth') and listen to Mozart as a boat glides over the still underground lake.
- Coves de Genova The smallest cave attraction is no less beautiful than its larger rivals. Visitors descend 35 metres down through a maze of hallways; the stalagmites and stalactites touchingly lit by coloured lights.
- Coves de Campanet Last but certainly not least, Coves de Campanet nestle in ravishingly pretty countryside. There are none of the bells and whistles of its east coast counterparts just stillness, silence, and a wealth of fascinating formations.
