


ABOUT

Each corner of Maui's 728 square miles presents a unique district with a corresponding micro-climate and personality. An island of glaring contrasts, luxurious beach resorts, and rural cowboy ranches coexist on this varied terrain. The dry, sunny climates of south Maui are home to the exquisite resort settlements of Wailea and Makena. Western Maui is positively charming with its various inns, art galleries, and shops lining the seaboard. From Lahaina, the historic whaling port, to Hana in the east, Maui presents the full extent of natural glory.





Kapalua is one of Maui's premier resort areas. Its name means "arms embracing the sea." Kapalua's lovely shoreline is lined with five bays and three white sand beaches, one of which was named "The Best Beach in America." Host of the renowned Kapalua Wine and Food Festival, this spectacular area, nestled among Cook pines and surrounded by acres of pineapple, is the perfect getaway to indulge in the luxurious side of Maui.




KAANAPALI

This beach area was a former retreat area for Maui's royalty. Now a popular getaway, Kaanapali beach offers great swimming and cliff diving. In fact, there is a famous daily cliff diving ceremony off the beach's northernmost cliffs, Puu Kekaa or Black Rock. Held every evening at sunset, a cliff diver lights the torches along the cliff, diving off Black Rock in a re-enactment of a feat by Maui's revered King Kahekili. Also fronting Kaanapali is the open air Whalers Village, a world-class shopping complex featuring a variety of exceptional shops and restaurants, a renowned whaling museum and Hawaiian entertainment.





Kahului is the hub of activity located in the valley between the West Maui Mountains, and the slopes of Haleakala on the south side of the island. It is the most urban town on Maui. Kahului is a convenient spot for unforgettable road trips east along the Hana Highway or looping around west Maui, encountering amazing volcanic scenery, waterfalls, rugged coastlines and world-class beaches.




LAHAINA

Lahaina is a historic town that has been transformed into a Maui hotspot with dozens of art galleries and a variety of unique shops and restaurants. Lahaina was a historic whaling village during the whaling boom of the mid-1800s. Visitors can still get a feel for old Lahaina as they stroll down lively Front Street, ranked one of the "Top 10 Greatest Streets" by the American Planning Association. Lahaina's sunny climate and oceanfront setting also provides the perfect backdrop for a variety of activities and entertainment.





Wailea is a luxurious resort community in south Maui spanning 1,500 acres of land with jaw-dropping ocean views. The area exudes a sense of privacy, serenity and freedom. The area's signature beaches include Wailea and Polo beaches, with top-notch swimming and snorkeling, and Ulua beach, where early morning sunset walkers and joggers abound.

Maui's varied natural beauty foreshadows an equally colorful cuisine. Particular pride is taken in the island's gastronomic delights as an expression of its distinct terrain and bountiful waters. Produce is sourced from the expansive pasture land of Kula, with fresh fish expedited directly from the coastline. An embrace of this farm-to-table approach has sparked Maui's culinary renaissance attracting a new generation of restaurateurs. The island's exceptional ingredients have accounted for an explosion in fine dining diversity, from Hawaiian to Japanese and Mediterranean fare.






This is definitely the place to head to when celebrating a special occasion. The Plantation House is in a stunning clubhouse overlooking Kapalua's lush Plantation Golf Course. The sweeping views of the ocean are worth the trip alone. For dinner, expect choices like Angus beef, Australian lamb, just caught mahi mahi, and fresh local raw fish.





Chef/Owner Peter Merriman has brought his Hawaiian regional cuisine to the unsurpassed ocean-side ambiance of Kapalua Resort. Only the freshest ingredients are used while incorporating the farm-to-table concept of locally grown, and produced or caught using sustainable methods. For a truly romantic experience be sure to catch the sunset from "Champagne Point."





Lahaina Grill features cuisine using techniques and flavors from around the world with the freshest ingredients from Maui's local farms, dairies and surrounding waters. Among the signature favorites are the Cake Walk, a sampler of Kona lobster crab cake, seared ahi cake, and sweet Louisiana rock shrimp cake. For an entrée try the Kona coffee roasted rack of lamb, Maui onion crusted seared ahi or the nightly fresh seafood. To finish the meal, delight in a slice of the famous triple berry pie.





Pacific'o offers a lunch, dinner or bar menu with seafood straight from the harbor. Chef James McDonald combines exotic flavors with organic fruits and vegetables. He invites you to dine with live evening jazz or just relax with a cold Mai Tai while watching the surf.





The Mill House is a restaurant and bar providing innovative, farm-driven dining in central Maui on The Maui Tropical Plantation. Enjoy handcrafted cocktails, local beers, a stunning environment and absolutely amazing views in addition the decadent dishes from which you may choose.




MAMA'S FISH HOUSE | HAWAIIAN







ALALOA LOUNGE



OLD LAHAINA LUAU



- 4. Big Beach5. La Perouse Bay






Napili Bay is known as one of the best beaches on Maui. Great for both swimmers and snorkelers, its sandy bottom slowly slopes down where snorkelers can explore the coral reef just a swim away! During high surf there is an impressive undertow as the waves slap onto the steep shoreline and recedes quickly. Lots of fun for the whole family, it can get really crowded, so arrive early!






H.A. Baldwin is a picturesque community beach park with plenty of space for ball games and swimming. In fact, it is one of the most popular beach parks on the windward side of Maui. The beach and the picnic areas are always crowded and the main attraction is the surf that breaks along the entire length of the park's long, sandy beach. The shore break is usually small, but sufficient for bodyboarding..






Ulua beach was named on of the Top 10 Most Beautiful Beaches in America. It's a spectacular swimming beach due to its sandy bottom and wonderful weather conditions. Snorkeling is also possible pending conditions at the southern end.






Backed by the lush, 165-acre Makena State Park and sheltered by low black lava cliffs, Big beach is one of the prettiest in all of Maui. It's also one of the largest. True to its name, Big beach is more than a mile long and is 100 feet wide from sand to shoreline. It's completely undeveloped, but that's precisely why you're there: there's nothing around to distract you from enjoying its silvery sand and cool turquoise waters.




If you're a dolphin lover this is the place to be! A pod of dolphins is said to claim this spot for their regular morning routine. La Perouse Bay is recommended for a morning adventure. Strong winds and currents are common due to its location.





It would be a tragedy to consider Maui a mere beach destination. Maui is host to awe-inspiring wonders that need to be experienced to be believed. The austere and outworldly volcanic mountainscape of Haleakala Park leaves no one indifferent. The famous stone needle rock formation of the lao Valley has profound sacred importance as a burial place for Native Hawaiian royalty. Maui's natural beauty has provided the contours and inspiration for a fascinating and enduring civilization. 


Haleakala National Park is on the Hawaiian island of Maui. It's home to the dormant Haleakala Volcano and endangered Hawaiian geese. The Leleiwi and Kalahaku overlooks on the steep Crater Road have views across the west Maui Mountains.





Pua'a Ka'a State Wayside Park is along the Hana Highway about 39 miles east of Kahului. The area consists of five acres of rainforest with waterfalls and pools. It is like a true Garden of Eden






Wai'anapanapa State Park sits on 122 acre states on a remote, wild, volcanic coastline offering solitude and respite from urban life. Lodging, camping, picnicking, shore fishing and hardy family hiking along an ancient Hawaiian coastal trail are available for your enjoyment. The park provides an excellent opportunity to view a seabird colony and natural stone arch. Other features include a native hala forest, heiau (religious temple), sea stacks, blow holes and a small black sand beach.



MOLOKINI CRATER

View colorful marine life such as moray eels, manta rays, octopuses, and white-tip reef sharks roaming the reef at the crescent-shaped, partially submerged volcanic Molokini Crater created from an eruption hundreds of thousands of years ago. Snorkel to see creatures closer to the surface, or scuba dive to reach larger fish. The crater also serves as a bird sanctuary, so bring your binoculars if you like birding.





Waimoku Falls is at the end of the Pipiwai Trail, above Seven Sacred Pools on the Road to Hana. The hike to Waimoku Falls passes the 185-foot Makahiku Falls (which is stunning) at about half a mile into the trail. This gigantic waterfall drops 400-feet down a sheer lava rock wall into a boulder-strewn pool and is the tallest falls on Maui.






More than just a place to explore and take in the fauna and flora, Valley Isle is also where King Kamehameha I defeated the Maui army in 1790 during the Battle of Kepaniwai. The Iao Valley is a peaceful, serene destination where you can learn about Hawaii's history and explore a variety of attractions and facilities.










- 1. The Plantation Course At Kapalua Bay

- 3. Ka'anapali Kai Course




Designed by Ben Crenshaw and Bill Coore, this amazing 7,411-yard course has been consistently ranked as the #1 golf course in all Hawaii. Located on the slopes of the West Maui Mountains near Kapalua Bay, this course offers the most dramatic ocean views and stunning scenery at every hole. Most famously, the Plantation Course is home to the PGA Tour's Hyundai Tournament of Champions each January.





Beautifully landscaped and offering stunning ocean views with the Island of Molokai in the distance, this 18-hole course sits on more than 6,600 yards while playing at a par-72. Designed in 1975 by Arnold Palmer and Francis Duane, the Bay Course is Kapalua's original course and has hosted more than 20 major professional tournaments over the years, withstanding the test of time while hosting some of the best golfers in the world.





If you're looking for a spot that's easy-going, fun and scenic, then look no further than this highly accessible course. The 18 holes were originally designed by Arthur Jack Snyder back in 1967 to be more than 6,388 yards. Since then, the course has undergone major renovations and was re-designed by Robin Nelson in 2005.





Whether you're in a helicopter, private plane, paragliding, parachuting or in a hot air balloon, getting a bird's eye view will take your perceptions of an area to new heights! The west Maui and Molokai helicopter tour takes you on an aerial adventure into some of the most remote and beautiful places in the world. Soar above 88 miles of untouched coastline, where towering waterfalls plunge from sea cliffs into the turquoise sea on Molokai's north shore. Explore the lush, meandering valleys set deep in the rainforest of the west Maui Mountains, with their legendary knife-edged, mist-covered peaks.





The best view of Maui is from above! Thrill-seekers don't have to look far to satisfy their adventurous side on Maui. With the cool breeze in your hair and the Valley Isle below your feet, enjoy the thrill of hang gliding in Maui.



SKYDIVING

If hang gliding doesn't satisfy your adrenaline rush, skydiving certainly will. Maui offers one of the world's most scenic skydiving experiences. An exceptional trip calls for some extraordinary moments, and skydiving is undoubtedly an extreme sport to fit the bill.

For a truly unique family adventure, be sure to book an Atlantis Submarine underwater tour. Recently featured on National Geographic TV, this activity is destined to be a hit with the kids. This jaw-dropping journey takes you 100 feet below through the incredible ocean worlds and ecosystems that shelter west Maui, and the outer islands of Moloka'i and Lana'i.





Maui Ocean Center is the premier destination to encounter and learn about Hawaii's marine life. Home to one of the world's largest displays of live Pacific corals, the aquarium exhibits marine life native to Hawaii including tropical fish, sea turtles, sharks, stingrays, octopuses, sea jellies, and more.





The Tropical Express Tour happens at the Maui Tropical Plantation in the central part of the island. Perfect for kids, families and couples, here's a tour that gives you a chance to view fruits, produce, plants and tropical flowers growing in an active farm setting.




KIDS

Maui's famously temperate year-long climate lends itself well to water activities. With temperatures ranging from 74F during the coolest season to 80F at the apex of summer, the tepid waters invite recreation every season. Maui's ethereal shores and uncanny cobalt blue waves continue to enthrall visitors, the waters embracing a windswept paradise unlike any other.






SCUBA DIVING

Calm, clear and warm waters make Maui a premier destination for scuba diving. Many companies offer tours ranging from beginner to experienced, with Molokini, Honolua Bay, and Kahekili Beach Park being regular expedition sites. For the more adventurous diver, Molokai's Hammertime Channel offers the opportunity to swim alongside Hammerhead sharks!





Between the months of November and April more than 10,000 Humpbacks migrate to Maui from Alaska to give birth in balmy waters. During this magical period you might see their activities from shore! Fret not if you find yourself visiting off season, whale watching tours abound all year, providing spectacular views of Molokai, Lanai, and Haleakaka in addition to getting up close and personal with these majestic creatures.




