ABOUT

Monaco, officially the Principality of Monaco, lights up the world with its legendary beauty, dazzling glamor, and authentic style. A visit to this miniature Mediterranean paradise is an invitation to luxuriate in moments of pure delight and an atmosphere of peace, relaxation, and well-being. It is a sovereign city-state - a microstate on the French Riviera whose official language is French. In addition, Monégasque (a dialect of Ligurian), Italian and English are spoken and understood by many residents. The principality is governed under a form of constitutional monarchy, with Prince Albert II of the House of Grimaldi as head of state. The House of Grimaldi has ruled Monaco, with brief interruptions, since 1297. The country's economic development was spurred by the opening of the state's first casino, the Monte Carlo Casino, in the late 19th century and the railway connection to Paris. Since then, Monaco's mild climate, scenery, and gamblers' safe haven have contributed to the principality's status as a prestigious holiday and leisure destination. Spooned by France, Monaco is bathed in fantasies.

Many famous images come to mind at the thought of Monaco – photographer Helmut Newton's images of the Monegasque city, inscribed with models in provocative poses; the royal family's joys and tragedies and Karl Lagerfeld's forays into interior design, plus the many yachts. From prestigious hotels and spas, private beaches, to water sports, cocktails by the sea, shopping sprees and walks through lush gardens, Monaco has everything to guarantee unforgettable moments in a truly magical corner of the world.

You will be dazzled and amazed at each turn, at the heart of the City of Princes. From the old town, a veritable open-air museum, to the Place du Casino, unique in the world – walk, bike, or slow-drive to learn the history of the Grimaldis. 




Fontvieille is a district completely reclaimed from the sea. The principality made use of modern technology to build this area and in return, Monaco chose to accommodate high-tech and non-polluting companies within it. Evening strolls along the water in Monaco are undeniably romantic if you can find just the right streets and corners such as those around Fontvieille Harbor at dusk. It's close enough to the action so you don't feel like you're missing out. And yet, the play of lights and view of Monte Carlo from a slight distance makes it feel extra special.




MONACO-VILLE

Affectionately known in the area as Le Rocher or "The Rock," Monaco-Ville is the south-central ward built on a headland going into the sea. Although it's right in the center of Le Rocher, the ward was once a medieval village with a real sense of history about it. The area is full of practically silent streets, as soon as the sun sets that are designed for pedestrian use as only local people are allowed to drive around the area. It's also illegal to ride a motorbike in Monaco-Ville after 10 p.m. Discover the old town through narrow alleyways from the middle ages leading to the picturesque Place Saint Nicolas and Placette Bosio, the cathedral, a Roman-Byzantine style building built in 1875. You will naturally find your way to the Place du Palais (The Prince's Palace), where every day at precisely 11:55 a.m., the changing of the guard takes place.






Les Moneghetti or Le Jardin Exotique (Exotic Garden) overlooks the principality. This is the district with a garden of the same name. Beautiful buildings such as the Ligures, the Patio Palace and the Harbour Light Palace offer a panoramic view over Monaco and the sea. This ward rises up into the rock, so you'll probably want to turn your camera to this intriguing urban vista. Its hilliness makes it interesting; you get a real sense of your surroundings and the people passing by.





La Condamine and the port offer you the charm of a shopping district with Rue Grimaldi and its stores, the pedestrian area of Rue Princesse Caroline and the quays at the port with many bars and restaurants. Certain buildings like the Palais Heracles, the Ermanno Palace and the Bristol give you an exceptional view of the Monaco Grand Prix.




MONTE CARLO

Probably the best-known part of Monaco and famous around the world for its casino and its palm-tree-lined streets, Monte Carlo (Spélugues) is the country's official administrative area. It is the principal residential and resort area which includes the mentioned Monte Carlo Casino and Hotel de Paris among other landmarks. The construction of Monte Carlo began in 1870, during the reign of Charles III, and it occupies the old Spelugues plateau. This area contains the largest concentration of stores and features one of the most beautiful shopping centers in Europe.





The most north easterly point of Monaco is the Larvotto ward. It borders Roquebrune–Cap–Martin and Provence–Alpes–Côte d'Azur. It's home to the Grimaldi Forum conference centre on the seafront. Named after Grace Kelly, the Avenue Princesse Grace is found near Larvotto beach and it is home to the stunning Japanese Gardens, a favorite spot to enjoy the afternoon sunshine.





Monaco seems as a favorite focal point of the enchanting backcountry and adjoining French villages or communes on the Cote d'Azur. It is spooned by France and carased by the Mediterranean waves. These farther neighborhoods seamlessly blend with Monaco's landscape and perfectly complement its splendor. Anyway you choose to roam around and absorb Monaco's surroundings you will be delighted by the outcome.



CAP D'AIL

Cap d'Ail stretches along a peaceful part of the coast, at the border with the principality of Monaco. When you arrive, take the road overlooking the coast until you reach the *Tete de Chien* viewing point from where you will have a superb panorama of Italy and the Var coastline. Cap d'Ail has been listed as a health resort since 1921. The quality of its seawater has earned it the *Blue Flag* for its three beaches: Marquet beach, the best for families with its yacht club and two restaurants; Mala beach and Pissarelles beach. Cap d'Ail also has a small harbor providing 253 berths. Regattas and sea festivals are organized during the holiday season, attracting many visitors.




BEAUSOLEIL

Beausoleil is a commune in the Alpes-Maritimes department in the Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur region in southeastern France stretching out like an amphitheatre above Monaco. The municipality was created relatively recently (1904), and is renowned for its Belle Epoque architecture. The finest example is the Riviera Palace, a historic monument, including a winter garden built by the Eiffel company, which also erected the covered market with its metal structure. Like a Montmartre of the Riviera, clinging to the slope, Beausoleil has an uninterrupted view of the principality, its casino, skyscrapers and the Mediterranean Sea in the distance. It has innumerable stairways, lined with houses painted in Italian colors, that go through the town, and you'll be able to marvel at the equally innumerable terraces and balconies perched above the Big Blue. It's a rather dizzying view which gives Beausoleil its one-of-a-kind, remarkable style, especially as it also boasts many parks and gardens with fragrances of the south. If you love the Belle Epoque you'll be in heaven at Beausoleil.




ROQUEBRUNE-CAP-MARTIN

This splendid seaside resort perched at an altitude of 300 meters is spread over 933 hectares superbly located on the French Riviera, a few kilometers from the Italian border. The history of Roquebrune Cap Martin is present everywhere to the delight of architecture enthusiasts or those nostalgic for the Roaring Twenties. The past reveals itself in the medieval village and castle, St. Marguerite's church, the ancient olive tree, the cave of Vallonet and Le Corbusier's cabin. The villas, some of which resemble palaces, remind us that here, in Roquebrune, statesmen, royalty, writers, and artists all came looking for inspiration and rest: Winston Churchill, Coco Chanel, Sacha Guitry, Jacques Brel, Silvana Mangano, to name a few.



EZE

Eze village is one of the most picturesque villages in the department and is a must-visit. Lush vegetation of banana, date, carob, orange and lemon trees testifies to the very pleasant climate most of the year. Perched in an eagle's nest at the top of an imposing and superb cliff, you will see the village and its light ochre church from afar. Once you have crossed the gate, you will discover a small Provencal village full of charm, offering superb panoramas of the sea and the coast. Small cobblestone lanes, vaulted passages, superbly restored stone houses, shaded squares, refreshing old fountains - the scenes change like a theatrical setting making it seem as if it were a mirage. It is that enchantingly beautiful! Many small craft shops might appeal to your curiosity (some look like small caves carved into the rock). Down below the village is the beach of the bay of Eze. It is easy to access on foot by taking the shaded Friedrich-Nietzsche path (at the end of the avenue du Jardin Exotique) descending into the sea. It is said that it was here, under the pines and olive trees, that Nietzsche got inspiration for the last part of his work, Thus Spoke Zarathustra.





The beach clubs in Monaco are *magnifique*! Although best known for its world-famous casinos, the F1 Grand Prix, and a lifestyle of glamor, Monaco's picturesque coastline also means it has some breathtaking beaches. You can enjoy numerous water sports, including scuba diving, snorkeling, jet-skiing, wakeboarding, parasailing and many others.


CAP D'AIL – MALA BEACH (LA RESERVE AND EDEN)

The small town of Cap d'Ail is exactly between Menton, Nice, and Monaco. Mala is a very fashionable and stylish beach. With its calm and also sophisticated spirit, the beach is famous for its crystal clear waters, picturesque sea, and mountain views. Two restaurants, La Reserve and Eden Plage Mala, are here to cater to your tastes. Nothing could be nicer than sitting in the shade of either La Reserve de la Mala or Eden Plage Mala with an ice-cold glass of rosé and a plate of fresh seafood.



CAP-D'AIL - MARQUET BEACH (NAOS AND UVITA)

This delightful beach is at the border of Fontvieille, Monaco, and Cap-d'Ail, just behind the Marriott hotel. The water is tranquil and safe. The beach meanders gently down into the sea, perfect for playing with children or just for a more regal entry into the waves than the usual sliding and balancing over hard stones. A perfect area for more prudent swimmers and water sports amateurs, with lifeguards during the summer. It features two restaurants, Naos and Uvita. Naos is a Greek bar-restaurant; while Uvita sets the mood in the evening with live music.



NIKKI BEACH

Every summer, party fans gather at the elegant and ultra-trendy place Nikki Beach by Fairmont Monte Carlo restaurant and beach club to enjoy a lively atmosphere from morning to night. Located on the 7th floor of the Fairmont Monte Carlo Hotel, the Nikki Beach Monte Carlo swimming pool is the gathering place if you want to have fun and lighten up. All ingredients are there to seduce Monegasques and travelers stopping over in Monaco: a magnificent view of the Principality of Monaco and the Mediterranean, a festive atmosphere and a sophisticated setting, all accompanied by a choice of gastronomic dishes to satisfy every appetite. The menu is indeed composed of international specialities for the cosmopolitan clientele. But what attracts the most refined clients to the Nikki Beach Monte Carlo is above all its musical program. Every summer, the greatest DJs of the international scene caress the decks of this beach club with guests swaying around or in the pool, to the sound of the best mixes, tasting champagne or cocktails prepared by the local mixologist.






This beach is in the middle of Larvotto beach. Like the public Larvotto beach, Note Bleu is covered with coarse white sand. The beach and restaurant are popular among visitors and locals alike. A most diverse clientele comes here not just to sunbathe or take a nap on pristine white pebbles, but also to enjoy amazing jazz music. La Note Bleue owes its name to a famous saxophone player, Barney Wilen from Nice.



MONTE-CARLO BEACH CLUB

If the Monaco Yacht Show masses become too overwhelming a presence, escape the center of town and drive out to Château Eza. The boutique hotel and its rustic restaurant are both hosted in the charming remains of a 400-year-old castle in the medieval village of Èze, a 30-minute journey from Monte Carlo. The château was once the writing retreat of a Swedish prince and now offers Riverian-style cuisine served up by Michelin-trained chef Matthieu Gasnier.



L'HIRONDELLE | SEA FOOD

L'Hirondelle in Monaco is a restaurant of the Thermes Marins Monte-Carlo. You can enjoy Mediterranean cuisine with a focus on health and well-being. The menu features light dishes with local and seasonal products at the forefront. Chef Jean-Laurent Basile has created a healthy cuisine allowing you to treat yourself without feeling guilty. From homemade ricotta spinach ravioli to a Norwegian omelette, the low-calorie and gluten-free menu provides immediate, healthy and sensible pleasure.



YANNICK ALLÉNO À L'HÔTEL HERMITAGE * | CREATIVE

L'Hôtel Hermitage's classic Belle Epoque architecture is almost as well loved as the principality itself. Housed within this neoclassical palace rooted in the heart of Monaco resides another three-starred restaurant with the doyen of cookery, Chef Yannick Alleno, at the helm. Frequented by a loyal following of Monegasque residents, it shuns the formalities adopted by many of its gastronomic neighbors in favor of a relaxed and inviting ambiance. Tables are grouped together in small lounge areas, while the sun terrace affords panoramic views across Port Hercules. Menus are inspired by colors and flavors of the South of France, featuring delicacies such as aubergine caviar, barbecued lobster, and candied rhubarb. "Take a fish, a vegetable, and cook them to perfection." That is the motto at the Hôtel Hermitage Monte-Carlo's gastronomic restaurant. The restaurant also features a panoramic terrace overlooking the sea and the Port of Monaco.



LE LOUIS XV DE ALAIN DUCASSE*** | MODERN CUISINE

With three Michelin stars, Le Louis XV is a decadent fine-dining experience at the Hotel of Paris. Led by chef Alain Ducasse, the restaurant offers fine-dining connoisseurs a unique culinary experience inspired by the French Riviera. The menu by chefs Dominique Lory and Alain Ducasse is fresh and contemporary. "Cuisine that sings of sunshine," is how Ducasse describes the haute couture menu of Louis XV – Alain Ducasse at the Hôtel de Paris. His Riviera-inspired dishes are a celebration of the region's very finest produce, flavors and colors, featuring locally caught fish, herbs, and vegetables grown in the nearby countryside and intensely flavorsome bouillons. Specialties include Gamberoni from San Remo with rockfish gelée and caviar or chilled langoustines, flavored with nectarine and verbena.



LE GRILL* | CLASSIC CUISINE

On the eighth floor of the prestigious Hôtel de Paris Monte-Carlo, Le Grill offers outstanding panoramic views over the Mediterranean. In fine weather, the roof opens fully for sun-drenched lunches or starlit dinners. The menu features grilled meats that have forged the restaurant's reputation. The cuisine is a return to the roots of everything that makes this place so magical. There is a promise of an exhilarating gastronomical experience. Franck Cerutti has been honing his impressive talents in the kitchens of the Hôtel de Paris Monte-Carlo's restaurants for decades.






YOSHI* | JAPANESE

Yoshi, is the only Japanese restaurant on the Côte d'Azur since 2010 to have been awarded a Michelin star. The restaurant at the Hotel Metropole Monte-Carlo is the first Japanese addition to Joël Robuchon's Michelin Star-sprinkled list of eateries. Executive chef Takeo Yamazaki designs modern menus with clean flavors at this extraordinary venue, including dishes such as Wagyu no wasabi fumi (rib steak with wasabi and vegetables), Kabu to omaru-ebi (lobster ravioli and marinated turnips) and Foa gura to unagi (foie gras and grilled eel millefeuille) and serves them in a chic east-meets-west dining ambiance. Nigiris, makis, sashimi, fish or meat – all ingredient-driven dishes are created with the freshest premium produce and prepared on the Teppanyaki. The restaurant's head sommelier has selected the best and rarest Japanese sake, whiskies or green teas for a perfect pairing with your meal.



LE RESTAURANT DU METROPOLE | FRENCH

For the world's best buttery mashed potatoes, head to this Michelin-starred restaurant at the Hôtel Métropole just off Casino Square. Every detail, from the sumptuous décor designed by Jacques Garcia to the tea trolley frothing with pots of herbs, has been considered. The late Robuchon had more Michelin stars to his name than any other living chef. His name lives on in the safe hands of Executive Chef Christophe Cussac whose team conjures Mediterranean magic before your eyes in the open-plan kitchen. Classic dishes include John Dory fillet, foie-gras-stuffed quail and milk-fed lamb.




NOBU FAIRMONT | CREATIVE

Chef Nobuyuki "Nobu" Matsuhisa is known around the world for skillfully blending the traditional culture and cuisine of Japan with the subtle spices and flavors of South America. In a stylish, plush setting with a superb terrace overlooking the Mediterranean, dinner at Nobu Fairmont Monte Carlo is an unforgettable experience. Monaco's first restaurant in the haute cuisine collection, Nobu opened in December 2013 at the Fairmont Monte Carlo hotel. The menu includes dishes such as king crab leg with ponzu and Japanese wagyu beef, which can be prepared in a variety of styles including Tataki, new style, grilled steak or Toban Yaki.



MAYA BAY | THAI

Situated side-by-side in Le Roccabella, Maya Bay's iconic Japanese restaurant was followed by its Thai offering next door. On the menu are the highest quality Asian dishes. Chef Rhuji Kakizaki created the menu at Restaurant Japonais, featuring a huge array of sushi, sashimi, dim sum and fragrant noodle soups. The tuna with red pepper, java pepper and timur berries is an excellent choice alongside the sautéed lobster with vegetables and chili. Chef Christophe Dupuy runs the show at Restaurant Thaïlandais, with a range of specialty curries, soups, salads, dumplings and spring rolls. Don't miss the 100% Wagyu beef tenderloin or the Maya crispy spit-roast duck.



BLUE BAY * | CREATIVE

Hosted inside the Monte Carlo Bay Resort, Chef Marcel Ravin serves up Caribbean–Mediterranean fusion cuisine at the Michelin–starred restaurant, Blue Bay. Guests on the terrace enjoy sea views while indoor parties watch their food being prepared in the open–plan kitchen. As well as offering freshly–caught fish, Blue Bay is an excellent spot for adventurous diners with extensive tasting menus on offer. Ravin's daring signature dishes include green papaya spaghetti carbonara and the slow–cooked organic hen's egg with cassava, truffle and passion fruit. Blue Bay also has an extensive wine cellar and a selection of Martinique rums.




COYA | PERUVIAN

High-end Peruvian restaurant COYA opened its fifth branch in Monaco with Fabrizio Fossati as the resident chef. It sits in a prime spot on Princess Grace Avenue, near the Monte-Carlo Sporting complex. Offering seaside views from the terrace, COYA boasts flamboyant décor and a lively atmosphere embracing its South American theme. Amid colorful furnishings and hanging plants, indulge in Incan-inspired dishes such as yellowfin tuna ceviche, charcoal-grilled beef skewers or tacos stuffed with soft shell crab, yuzu and aioli. The resident DJ will amp up the fiesta mood after sunset with a mix of Latin dance tunes. This will be your cue to head to the lounge for an after-dinner pisco sour or to sample COYA's alternative take on the classic margarita.



ELSA * | MEDITERRANEAN

A peaceful and beautiful terrace overlooking the blue of the Mediterranean sea, inside the beautiful Monte–Carlo Beach Hotel sits one of Monaco's best Michelin–starred restaurants, Elsa. A dazzling scenery ahead of Monte–Carlo Bay where you can sit back, relax and enjoy culinary pleasures crafted with elegance by Chef Paolo Sari. Elsa is the first 100% organic restaurant to receive a coveted Michelin star. Moreover, the products on the menu are fresh, genuine, local and most importantly, organic. You can choose from raw or cooked menus (or a five–course tasting menu), with dishes including redraw shrimp from Sanremo and responsibly sourced grilled red mullet.





Take a stroll through the streets of the city for some unique retail therapy. From the lanes of the old town where shopkeepers display traditional souvenirs to the iconic fashion houses of Monte Carlo, from elegant malls to eclectic shopping arcades and the neighboring pedestrian streets of Port Hercule, you will find a "Made In Monaco" shopping experience. There is also the stunning new One Monte-Carlo complex, you can explore on foot and in complete safety. The greatest names in haute couture fashion, perfume, jewelry quickly established themselves at this exclusive address. Monaco is unquestionably the international capital of luxury.


BOUTIQUE DU ROCHER



LA CONDAMINE MARKET

La Condamine Market is part of Monaco's heritage. It represents the authentic heart of the principality. It first opened in 1880 and was revamped and inaugurated on June 15, 2012 by TSH Prince Albert II and Princess Charlene, retained that warm and friendly Provençal spirit. La Condamine Market is open every day, all year round, accommodating about 20 vendors. This is a favorite location for Monegasques. It is also the ideal place to get a flavor of authentic Monegasque life and taste local delicacies. In the market halls, you will find around 20 stalls, selling specialties from Monaco, such as socca, barbagiuans, pissaladière and fougasse all in a warm and friendly atmosphere with an emphasis on high-quality, varied produce.




LES GRANDS CHAIS MONÉGASQUES

Fine wines, top-quality champagnes and rare spirits can all be found at the oldest cellar in the principality of Monaco. Set up in the early 1900s, the shop's classic décor is reminiscent of the boutique's beginnings; wooden beams, old wine barrels and vintage posters line the walls. Their choice wines are even featured on the menus of some of Monaco's most prestigious hotels and restaurants. The cellar has a secondary function as a delicatessen, selling Modena balsamic vinegars, foie gras and artisan jams and confits. Events such as wine and whiskey tastings are held throughout the year at Les Grands Chais Monégasques, plus they also offer wine delivery straight to your superyacht cellar.





The Shopping Promenade consists of an open-air luxury tour of more than 40 boutiques from prestigious brands around the famous Place du Casino. You'll find the biggest names in fashion, haute couture, perfumes and jewelry in a setting beautifully mirroring their prestige. This place is one of the most secure in the world with its continuous surveillance. Pick up a new fashion find, whether it's ready-to-wear, haute couture, accessories, a watch or jewelry – all your favorite luxury brands at one location and in the open air, under the warm, blue Mediterranean sky.



THE JEWELER'S PATIO

Discover this impressive open-air patio and dive into the hushed and exclusive world of the great jewelry houses. MAISON D'ART MONACO




ONE MONTE-CARLO

A private appointment is required to browse or purchase any of the fine gems from the Orlov jewellery house. Only 120 fine jewellery pieces are delivered from the workshop in Italy each year, meaning that although a relative newcomer, Orlov has gained a reputation in Monaco for its exclusive finery; their pieces have also been worn by stars such as singer Katy Perry, Bond Girl Olga Kurylenko and model Alessandra Ambrosio. Jointly owned by Angela and Christian Orlov, the couple decided to set up shop in Monaco after first meeting in the city in 2010. Their bold and colourful jewels have been exhibited in some of the finest hotels around the world; from the Metropole at home in Monaco to the Burj Al Arab in Dubai and the Kulm Hotel in St Moritz.





From luxurious cashmere knits to fine home furnishings and beautiful Italian leather goods, Florentine fashion house Stefano Ricci prides itself on catering to the every whim of the discerning superyacht set. It's stunning Monaco store at the Fairmont Hotel is a testament to the brand's high end offering and, should you like what you can see, you can even give your superyacht the Stefano Ricci treatment courtesy of the brand's Luxury Yacht Division.





Monaco may be home to every fine watch and jewellery house worth its salt but if you're looking for something you won't find anywhere else then head to Ciribelli whose one and only boutique is located at the prestigious Le Metropole shopping centre at the Hotel Metropole. KAMIL ART GALLERY

Kamil Interior Design Conception Art Gallery originally launched in Cannes in the 1970s but had moved to the centre of Monaco by 1984. Recognisable by the distinct pink marble storefront, it now sits opposite the city's retreat of the Jardin Japonais. The gallery specialises in modern art but, unlike the Maison d'Art, also offers interior design services. Their interiors portfolio includes the 44m yacht Sister Act and private residences in Monaco, Ibiza and Mexico. Sculpture work by Lorenzo Quinn and Damien Hirst is up for grabs in the showroom, as is photography by the likes of Helmut Newton.






MADAME MONTE CARLO



THE PRINCESS GRACE IRISH LIBRARY

The Princess Grace Irish Library, under the aegis of the Princess Grace of Monaco Foundation, is one of the hidden cultural treasures of the principality. It is located in a small street near the Prince's Palace – a perfect place for book lovers and young learners. The library allows users to borrow English-language books, works by Irish writers. It also houses a collection of beautiful reference works and items of historical value, much of which come from a personal collection of Princess Grace, who was of Irish descent. There is also a special children's area, with Irish books for younger readers and coloring kits. For Irish and English literature enthusiasts, this is the most suitable place to see the collection of rare works of Oscar Wilde, Iris Murdoch, William Trevor, with a corner dedicated to Samuel Beckett.



THE OPERA GALLERY

The Opera Gallery is renowned worldwide for its extensive collection of artwork ranging from historical fine art to more contemporary, off-the-wall pieces. The gallery has sister venues scattered around the world from New York to Hong Kong. The Monaco gallery holds regular exhibitions of artists like celebrity photographer Douglas Kirkland, who worked with silver screen stars, Marilyn Monroe and Audrey Hepburn. The art of legendary Spanish painter Pablo Picasso is also featured here, making this a top gallery to visit on your trip to Monaco.



MONACO FINE ARTS

Established in 1976 by British formula one driver Michael McKee, Monaco Fine Arts has been home to a number of classic fine art pieces for almost 30 years, specializing in impressionist art from the 19th and 20th centuries. Currently merging its historical collections with a number of 21st century exhibitions and projects, the gallery creates a sense of originality and freshness with its artwork, successfully combining the old with the new.





Maison d'Art Monaco, on Avenue de la Costa, upholds a distinguished reputation in the art world and is well worth a visit. The gallery houses a large collection of old master paintings from the 13th to the 18th centuries featuring artists such as Friesz, Kisling, Boldini and Greuze. The majestically intricate paintings of the Baroque, Rococo, Romantic and Neoclassical greats are combined with contemporary collections. Artists like Damien Hirst and sculptor Blake Ward feature heavily, creating a space where antiquity meets modernity, taking you on an enthralling journey through art history. In addition, the gallery showcases some superb traditional sculptures, silverware and pottery.


GALERIE DU FORUM KAMIL

This bright, airy gallery is set in a beautiful location by the beach in Monte Carlo, across from the famous *Jardin Japonais* (*Japanese Garden*). It showcases a large collection of contemporary art and remains committed to supporting the work of young, emerging artists worldwide. Owned by Iranian architect and interior designer Kamil, Kamil Galerie du Forum combines cutting-edge design with new and well-known pieces from artists such as Damien Hirst, Sabala, Lorenzo Quinn and the photographer, Luz. Be sure to check out some of the upcoming exciting and diverse exhibitions.



THE GRIMALDI FORUM

The Grimaldi Forum in Monaco is a conference and congress center on the seafront of Monaco's eastern beach quartier, Larvotto. Les Ballets de Monte-Carlo and the Monte-Carlo Philharmonic Orchestra regularly perform at the forum. This is also the venue of the EVER Monaco exhibition held annually in March. The Grimaldi Forum also hosts the draw for the group stage, last 32, last 16, quarter-finals and semi-finals of the Union of European Football Associations (UEFA) Champions League, UEFA Europa League, and the UEFA Best Player in Europe Award.



FRANCIS BACON MB ART FOUNDATION


Based in Monaco, the Francis Bacon MB Art Foundation is a non-profit institution dedicating its activities and research to Francis Bacon's art, life and creative process. The MB Art collection encompasses more than 3,000 items, including the largest collection of the artist's early paintings and furniture. It also holds the most extensive collection of photographs of Francis Bacon and a unique archive of the painter's working materials, books and documents, offering visitors and scholars an exceptional insight into the world of one of the leading artists of the 20th century.



THE ARTS

THE JEAN COCTEAU MUSEUM

At the foot of the old town of Menton, across from the covered market and by the sea, **The Jean Cocteau Museum**/Séverin Wunderman Collection opened in November 2011. It presents the work of the poet and offers visitors two-tier exhibition space for collections, an area for temporary exhibitions, an educational workshop, a cabinet d'art graphique, an area for documentary resources, a café, a boutique and a bookshop. The tour of the museum continues with the Bastion, designed by Jean Cocteau from 1958–1963. It features the famous drawings of the Innamorati, the series of fantasy animals, as well as ceramics made in the Madeline–Jolly studio.




THE ARTS

MONACO, AN OPEN-AIR MUSEUM

Walking along the principality's streets, you'll soon become familiar with the only open-air sculpture collection of its kind. At the instigation of Prince Rainier III, the Principality of Monaco acquired a rich collection of artwork and the tradition continues today under the reign of Prince Albert II. Sculptures are held in high regard in Monaco, with more than 200 works in gardens, streets and squares of Monaco – collectively named, Monaco, an Open-Air Museum. Works also offer insight into the history of the principality itself, with many being dedicated to iconic princes, personalities, events and places of Monaco. Take a stroll down the culture lanes and paths – Monte Carlo, Monaco-Ville and/or Fortville Sculpture Path and witness the immense appreciation for art this microstate has.





The small city-state, despite being diminutive, has a grand cultural and historical legacy. Although it proudly bears a reputation as the land of plenty, it's a tourist destination with a remarkable heritage and an outstanding history. Numerous cultural venues and museums testify to its richness extending well beyond the almost fairytale pizzazz. Monaco museums are not just places of interest, they are landmarks and institutions (including nonprofit organizations, government entities, and private businesses) that collect and care for objects of cultural, artistic and scientific value.

NEW NATIONAL MUSEUM OF MONACO - VILLA PALOMA

The New National Museum of Monaco (NMNM), is a museum of contemporary visual art. The museum is in two locations, the Villa Sauber and the Villa Paloma. Venues display two exhibitions annually. Recent exhibitions have retrospectives of Erik Bulatov and Yinka Shonibare and 'Monacopolis', an exhibition on architecture, town planning and urbanization in Monaco. The museum also holds an extensive collection of work relating to painter Kees van Dongen.




THE MONACO TOP CARS COLLECTION

The Monaco Top Cars Collection is an automobile museum in the Fontvieille district. Cars are the personal collection of Prince Rainier III acquired over a 30-year period. The collection contains almost 100 classic cars made in Europe and the United States. Notable vehicles in the collection include the Bugatti Type 35 driven by William Grover-Williams that won the inaugural Monaco Grand Prix in 1929 and Sébastien Loeb's Citroën DS3 WRC, which he drove to victory in the 2013 Monte Carlo Rally. Thirty-eight cars from the collection were put up for auction in 2012 due to Prince Albert II's desire to re-organize and expand the collection. Cars are displayed over five levels in a specially constructed space in the Terrasses de Fontvieille.



THE OCEANOGRAPHIC MUSEUM

Monaco's Oceanographic Museum is famous not only for its stunning aquarium but also for the building itself on a cliff overlooking the sea. It took 11 years to build and is an impressive sight. The museum is renowned throughout the world for its expertise and has more than 6,000 specimens on display, including baby sharks, sea urchins, sea cucumbers, and dancing seahorses. Built on the side of Monaco's legendary La Rocher – The Rock, the Oceanographic Museum, founded by H.S.H. Prince Albert II of Monaco's great–great–grandfather Prince Albert I, has been watching over the oceans for more than a century. From the flourishes on the façades to the décor in the halls, every aspect of the museum's architecture evokes the marine world. Since its opening on March 29, 1910, this Temple of the Sea has been an international benchmark for loving, protecting and raising awareness of the oceans.






This is a museum of Monaco's material heritage displaying ceramics, paintings, furniture, costumes and scenes of daily life from Le Rocher, Monaco's Old Town. The fundamental mission of the museum is to preserve Monegasque identity.




NEW NATIONAL MUSEUM OF MONACO – VILLA SAUBER

The National Museum – Villa Sauber is one of the last Belle Epoque villas in Monaco. In the absence of indisputable documentation, the precise date of the villa's construction is unknown. However, it is stated that at the beginning of the 1900s it belonged to the Blanc family who played a fundamental part in the development of the Société des Bains de Mer and the Casino of Monte–Carlo. Since 1969 the house and garden have remained the property of the Principality of Monaco. The programs of the Villa Sauber and the Villa Paloma, the two locations of NMNM, have been determined according to two themes intimately linked with the cultural, historical and artistic heritage of the principality: art and performance at the Villa Sauber and art and territory at the Villa Paloma.






La Rascasse is a world-famous bar inside the penultimate corner of the Monaco Grand Prix track. Cars race around the perimeter of the building putting guests right in the center of the action. Located between the F1 pit lane and Paddock Club, guests get an insight into what is going on behind the scenes. Moreover, Rascasse is known for its parties and the atmosphere here is superb all weekend. It is the place to go in Monaco for a great night out.



CRYSTAL TERRACE

Savor the best wines, champagnes and spirits and gourmet dishes in a tasteful, sophisticated setting. Take in the majestic view of the principality from the glorious Crystal Terrace while smoking a cigar and enjoying a vintage wine in a cozy, lounge atmosphere. In winter, this venue becomes *the* spot for lovers of champagne or original signature cocktails and is a hub for local events. During the summer, the Crystal Bar moves to the idyllic Excelsior Gardens and becomes the Crystal Lounge. It is a perfect blend of laid-back, relaxing style, with an air of grace truly setting it apart from the other bars in the area.




LE BAR AMÉRICAIN

Hotel de Paris is home to Le Bar Américain where you can experience classic Monaco style with impeccable service and an extensive cocktail list. Enjoy a meal cooked by chef Frank Cerutti and his team on the panoramic terrace overlooking the Mediterranean and the Monte-Carlo Casino. With its unique decor and warm atmosphere, Le Bar Américain is the perfect place to relax. Inside you will find glossy, refined wood, burnish leather armchairs and soft, elegant lighting. In short, the bar looks like it belongs in a Fitzgerald's novel. It has the atmosphere of the 1920s, with a discreet glamour and delicate charm. While table 16, facing the casino, is still the favorite among artists and celebrities. Sip a signature cocktail in this velvety, jazzy atmosphere. You are invited to try one of the signature cocktails; among them: Pulcinella with fresh tangerine or Nutcracker with Alain Ducasse's Grey Goose vodka and hazelnut syrup. Cocktails all have poetic nicknames that change with the seasons. Something that has made the Bar Américain famous.





Based in a former concert hall just off the Place du Casino, the Monaco edition of this hip restaurant-bar chain has become a firm favorite with locals. The décor mixes Asian themes with décor inspired by the Garnier Opera House in Paris. The combination of eastern sculptures and baroque moldings creates a rich, comfortable setting, complemented by the chilled-out soundtrack making the place a perfect stop-off.





Haute couture permeates the experience at the Métropole Monte-Carlo's Odyssey. An exceptional rooftop setting imagined and designed by Karl Lagerfeld with a garden, pool and lounge bar, Odyssey is an oasis of relaxation and well-being nestled in the heart of Monte-Carlo. For a lighter atmosphere, the Odyssey restaurant by the pool is a gourmet alternative at the Métropole. The menu highlights the freshness, lightness and quality of seasonal produce.



SASS CAFÉ CLUB

The somewhat bland exterior of this Monaco restaurant and bar hides a romantic, dimly lit red and gold interior and is a favorite with the glitterati. Fully refurbished in 2019, this iconic venue, popular with every generation, is the ideal place to dine and dance the night away into the wee hours, with an eclectic mix of music and a heady ambiance. Located on avenue Princess Grace the bar is a must-visit during any event in Monaco.





The brainchild of Italian businessman Flavio Briatore, Twiga has a similar vibe to the Billionaire Clubs' other establishments. It moved to a new location in 2021 and can now be found on the second floor of Grimaldi Forum. It has great views of the Mediterranean Sea. Go for dinner at one of its two restaurants serving either Italian or Japanese fare. Then stay on to dance the night away as at around 1 a.m. it transforms into a nightclub.



JIMMY'Z MONTE-CARLO





CASINO DE MONTE-CARLO

François Blanc, the casino's founder once said, "we should do nothing here as it is done elsewhere." The image of James Bond has become inseparable from the Casino de Monte-Carlo, which, with its Belle Époque architecture, is a reference for gaming and entertainment, not just in Europe but around the world. With its exceptional selection: French Roulette, English Roulette, Trente et Quarante, Baccarat, Black Jack and Poker Texas Hold 'em Ultimate new and occasional players try their luck at the table games under the warm glow of Bohemian crystal chandeliers, while slot machine players hunt down lady luck in the Salle Renaissance or Salle des Amériques. Everything here is about sophistication and attention to detail, to create an immersive experience in the casino world. No trip to Monaco is complete without a visit to the casino.





The ever-lively Casino Cafe de Paris offers players the widest selection of state-of-the-art slot machines. Nevertheless, the casino's must haves are still traditional table games like Black Jack, English Roulette and Ultimate Texas Hold'em Poker. THE PRINCE'S PALACE

The Prince's Palace of Monaco was built in the 18th century then modified during the Renaissance. Keeping pace with history, its Renaissance architecture has traveled down the centuries and still bears traces of Genoese towers dating back to 1215 AD. A guardian of an ancient tradition, with its Italian–style gallery, the palace reveals some of its splendors such as the Main Courtyard with its 17th century Carrara marble double staircase, the Hercule Gallery and its delicate 15th century frescoes ensconcing the blue and gold Louis XV lounge. The Mazarin room with its multicolored wood–paneling, the York Bedroom and finally the Throne Room with its Renaissance fireplace are simply marvelous. The Prince's Palace is a real museum.



SAINT NICHOLAS CATHEDRAL

A privileged witness to solemn milestones in the life of the principality, **The Cathedral** of Our Lady Immaculate on the Rock of Monaco contains the tombs of its Princes. The Cathedral of Our Lady Immaculate, but sometimes called Saint Nicholas Cathedral, or Monaco Cathedral, is the cathedral of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Monaco in Monaco-Ville, where many of the Grimaldis were buried, including Grace Kelly and more recently, Rainier III. The cathedral was built in 1875–1903 and consecrated in 1911, and is on the site of the first parish church in Monaco built in 1252 dedicated to Saint Nicholas.



THE FAIRMONT HAIRPIN CURVE

Named after the stunning Fairmont Hotel that overlooks the hairpin turn, every F1 fan holds their breath when those cars slide around the corner. In the heart of Monte Carlo, the Fairmont Hairpin Curve attracts F1 enthusiasts, tourists and drivers alike. A turn so tight that a car's suspension and steering need to be uniquely tuned to navigate it; vehicles race up and down the street, enjoying the thrill of backing into a curve that promises nothing less than an adrenaline rush.



THE MONTE CARLO OPERA - THE SALLE GARNIER

The Salle Garnier, jewel of the Monte–Carlo Casino, continues to embody the excess and boldness that characterized the building of the Monte–Carlo Casino. The Monte Carlo Opera Garnier is a part of the Monte Carlo Casino. With the lack of cultural diversions available in Monaco in the 1870s, Prince Charles III, along with the Société des bains de mer, decided to include a concert hall as part of the casino. It opened in 1879 and became known as the Salle Garnier, after the architect Charles Garnier who designed it. The building itself includes a casino, the Monte Carlo and the office of The Monte Carlo Ballet. However, the Monte Carlo Opera has become a place where the cultural avant–garde blossoms, boosting the distinguished status of this event hall among Europe's most eminent venues.






This statue sculpted by Joaquim Ros Sabaté is a tribute to the Argentine motor racing driver. There are six such statues around the world, all identical, in Buenos Aires (Argentina), Monaco, Montmeló (Spain), Nürburg (Germany), Stuttgart (Germany) and Monza (Italy). Juan Manuel Fangio is seen by many as the greatest driver in history. In seven full seasons in Formula One, he was world champion five times (with four different teams) and twice the runner-up.





The Fort Antoine Theatre is a small amphitheater on the Avenue de la Quarantaine in the Monaco-Ville ward which hosts open-air plays in the summer. The theatre was originally constructed as a fortress in the early 18th century before its destruction in 1944. Prince Rainier III had the fortress rebuilt as a theatre in 1953. The militaristic nature of its architecture has been retained with a bartizan and a pyramid of cannonballs at the center of the theatre around the main stage.





If you're a fan of walks in stunning gardens with their own distinctive character, then head to one of the many green spaces covering no less than one-fifth of Monaco. The Princess Grace Rose Garden and the Exotic Garden may be among the best known, but the principality has many parks and landscaped green spaces to discover, including Princess Antoinette Park, the Japanese Garden, the St. Martin Gardens, the Little Africa Gardens, the Boulingrins Gardens, and the UNESCO Gardens on the Fontvieille Terraces. They are managed according to eco-friendly principles and are all distinctive in their own way, where precious rare species mix in harmony with flowers and plants symbolically simple and fresh. You are invited to unwind in a memorable setting, in the heart of the city or overlooking the Mediterranean.






Fontvieille Park encircles the Big Top, providing the district with an urban landscaped park much appreciated by families. It features Mediterranean plants such as olive, pine and cypress trees alongside more exotic species like strelitzias, stenocarpus and araucarias. Winding paths meander through the park guiding you on a journey of discovery, both botanical and cultural, as the park is home to numerous artwork. You can take a detour to explore an educational kitchen garden, the Smart Flower and a children's playground.




PRINCESS GRACE ROSE GARDEN

Although it is within Fontvieille Park, the Princess Grace Rose Garden is a completely separate one. Conceived by Prince Rainier III in memory of his wife Princess Grace, the rose garden is laid out according to the principles of an English garden while retaining a Mediterranean character through the planting of 100-year-old olive trees. Although the gates still bear the H.S.H. Princess Grace's monogram to maintain the garden's sense of history, the "new" rose garden can now be accessed freely and admired at any time of the day. The bronze statue of H.S.H. Princess Grace, created by sculptor Kees Verkade in 1983, dominates the garden and watches over it.





High on the cliffs overlooking Monaco, the Exotic Garden is a showcase for the exuberance, strangeness and surrealism of nature. The garden is home to 1,000 cacti and other succulent plants. The enormous trees lining the paths of the garden illustrate the age of the collection when the garden was instigated by Prince Albert I. Within the garden is the Observatory Cave, the limestone rock carved out by the water, at an altitude of 100.






The Princess Antoinette Park on the Boulevard de Jardin Exotique is a municipal park in the La Condamine ward. It is named for Princess Antoinette of Monaco, the elder sister of Rainier III. The garden is dedicated to the sacred olive tree. An annual open-air meal in the Princess Antoinette Park is organized by the municipality at the end of June, continuing the Monegasque tradition of picnics. The famous mini-golf has reopened in 2021 and remains an inescapable place for Monaco families' gatherings.



ST. MARTIN GARDENS

Hidden below the road, between the Oceanographic Museum and the Cathedral, this green oasis offers fabulous views of the sea. Its steep, winding paths hug the side of the rock and offer walkers numerous spots to rest. There is also a space in the middle of the garden where you can enjoy a refreshing break by the side of the pond. Exceptional plants and sculptures sit side by side in harmony in this unique location marrying art and botany. Francois Cogne's bronze statue of Prince Albert I as a sailor stands at the center of the gardens. There are some archaeological finds here, dating back to the Holocene era.




THE CASINO GARDENS

Designed by renowned architect Edouard Andre, the main features of the "French-style" gardens are combined with landscaped valleys, waterfalls, streams and ponds, imbued with a highly distinctive exotic flavor. Andre drew inspiration from fashionable theories about the French Riviera. The region was classed as a very hot area, where one could only live during winter. From December to March, local gardens were supposed to give the impression of blazing, tropical fauna, an eternal spring.



JAPANESE GARDEN

This garden, created in 1994 – at the request of Prince Rainier III in accordance with the strictest principles of Zen design by landscape architect Yasuo Beppu (Grand Prix at the Osaka Flower Exhibition in 1990) – transports visitors to the land of the rising sun, even as they remain in the principality. Those who take a stroll through the gardens will be able to discover essential components of a Japanese garden: a pond, islands, a waterfall, lanterns, bridges, a tea house and a Zen garden. This green oasis is a rich mix of Japanese tradition and Mediterranean touches, the result of close collaboration between gardeners from Monaco and Japan. A pond at the foot of the pavilion provides an opportunity to admire a collection of koi carp, swimming peacefully among the water lilies and lotus flowers. Every year, Beppu comes especially from Japan to pass on his knowledge and give advice to gardeners about looking after the plants.







The Historic Monaco Grand Prix was created in 1997, on the 700th anniversary of the Grimaldi Dynasty. Unlike its Formula 1 counterpart, the Historic Grand Prix takes place every two years, a fortnight ahead of the Monaco Grand Prix. Only cars built up to 1980 are eligible to take part. A major meeting for classic car enthusiasts, the Historic Monaco Grand Prix features more than 230 vehicles built between the 1930s and the late 1970s.



MONACO F1 GRAND PRIX

The Monaco Grand Prix is one of the oldest and most prestigious motor races. Today, the Monaco Grand Prix city circuit snakes around Port Hercule, the streets of Monte–Carlo and La Condamine, in a series of tight bends surrounded by protective rails: there is no clearance between the track and the rails, unlike on other circuits. Drivers compete in their excellence to negotiate this extremely technical course. The greatest names in motor racing distinguished themselves here, from Fangio in the 1950s up to Schumacher in the 1990s. Ayrton Senna won this legendary race six times and became part of the legend of the Monaco Grand Prix. With its historic atmosphere, exclusive guest lists, and troublesome track, it makes for an all–around excellent sporting experience.



AMBER LOUNGE FASHION

Amber Lounge Fashion is the world-renowned annual event, a fashion show, a charity auction and F1 after-party event all in one. It brings together the world of fashion and motorsport. Amber Lounge's charity auction, held during the Fashion Show, has raised more than USD 6.5 million for charitable organisations, including Caudwell Children, Sir Jackie Stewart's 'Race Against Dementia', the Elton John Aids Foundation, Special Olympics, the Nelson Mandela Children's Fund and Make a Wish Singapore and Abu Dhabi. To date the Amber Lounge has worked with brands such as: Jimmy Choo, Ted Baker, Crisoni, Melissa Odabash, Julien Macdonald, Vionett and Osman.





The Monte-Carlo Masters is an annual tennis tournament for male professional players held in Roquebrune-Cap-Martin, France, a commune that borders on Monaco. The event is part of the ATP Tour Masters 1000 on the Association of Tennis Professionals (ATP) Tour. The tournament is played on clay courts and is held every year in the April-May period.





The first Monaco Red Cross gala was chaired by Prince Rainier III in 1948. Today it is undoubtedly the highlight of the summer in Monaco. Every year the world's largest charity gala evening brings together the international elite of crowned heads and prominent people as well as donors from all over the world. Take part in this unique event reserved for a privileged few.






It is a music and dance festival in Monaco, created in response to the wishes of Princess Grace. Today it is under the patronage of Princess Caroline of Hanover and celebrates the beginning of Spring. The musical event brings together musicians from all over the world. The Spring Arts Festival venues play as great a role in its success as the performances themselves, with audiences getting the chance to discover talented artists in extraordinary surroundings every year.



MONTE CARLO GALA FOR PLANETARY HEALTH

The Monte-Carlo Gala for Planetary Health (previously called the Gala for the Global Ocean) is the Met Gala of Europe. For its effort to save the ocean, the Fondation Prince Albert II de Monaco hosts the star-studded Monte-Carlo Gala for Planetary Health. International artists, celebrities, and philanthropists gather for this significant fundraising event to protect the ocean. It aims to address the growing concern of ocean destruction, marine-life threats, ocean acidification, and plastic pollution. It's the place to see and be seen, in the most incredible attire you can find. This is a very exclusive and expensive event to attend.





The Sporting Summer Festival is the summer event that celebrates the greatest artists on the international music scene. You can be carried away by the jazz and blues sounds in the Salle Garnier of the Monte-Carlo Opera. The month of August will see a succession of other great international artists, and the festival will as always end on a high note.





At the end of September, Port Hercule hosts the Monaco Yacht Show, an impressive spectacle devoted to the world of luxury yachting. Every year the MYS has 125 unique and exceptional superyachts on display, built by the world's superior shipbuilders, along with 580 major yachting businesses. Exclusive launches for extraordinary ships, lectures about the yachts' architecture, the unveiling of innovative devices: where ingenuity meets top-of-the-range sailing are all segments of this exceptional annual event.




PALERMO-MONTE-CARLO REGGATTA




VILLA & JARDINS EPHRUSSI DE ROTHSCHILD


VILLAGE OF LA TURBIE AND TROPHY OF AUGUSTUS


Overlooking the principality at 1,150 meters, the little town of La Turbie seems to float in the sky. It is dominated by its gigantic Trophy of Augustus (35 meters high), erected in 6 BC by the Romans to the glory of Emperor Augustus, the conqueror of the last Ligurian tribes. The Trophée is the pride of the town. Visiting it and the small Auguste museum is a must. A fraction of the tower with its columns and niches where the statues were placed is all that remains today of the grand Trophée d'Auguste, but still imposing, nonetheless. At the foot of the trophé lies the La Turbie village which has preserved the charm of its glorious past in a harmonious mixture of styles – medieval, classical and baroque. You can also hike from Beausoleil up to La Turbie, following in the Romans' footsteps.



A TRIP TO ITALY

On your scenic trip to Italy you will first pass Menton, a peaceful town with a microclimate, on the very border with Italy, known for its Iemon festival. The next stop is Italy and Ventimiglia, famous for its open-air market. Once you're there, don't miss out on a chance to visit Dolceacqua, a medieval village 15 minutes north of Ventimiglia with Its old arch-shaped bridge, baroque church of St. Antonio and the Castle – Castello Dei Doria. Claude Monet was enchanted and inspired by the village of Dolceacqua which is identical today to how he painted it in the late 1800s. The last stop is Sanremo. It's a tourist town known for being the finish point of the Milan–Sanremo cycle race and annual musical festival held since 1951. 






WATER

WATER




The cliffs of Monaco aren't considered an ideal spot for wind sports. The closest spot for ideal wind sports on the water is at Saint Laurent du Var just east of Nice. For very good conditions, head to Almanarre. It is believed to be one of the best spots and, unlike most Riviera beaches, there are no restrictions on wind sports there in the summer.



The best time for these sports is early in the morning before the sea breezes pick up and ruffle the water. You can arrange waterskiing and wakeboarding activities at Larvotto Beach, Meridien Beach Plaza and Monte Carlo Beach Hotel.

JET-SKI

You need a license to operate a jet ski or you can ride with someone already qualified. If you already have a jetski license, you'll need to wear a life jacket and follow all local speed limits and regulations.



SEABOBS

You can rent seabobs and check out the world beneath the surface. You could also use a seabob with scuba gear if you don't want to keep coming back up to the surface.





The new craze in motorized water sports is the flyboard or jetpack. This hydro propelling lift machine allows you to hover over water thanks to a flexible piping system located under your feet and connected to the turbine outlet of a jet-ski. Don't miss out on this entertaining beach trend and satisfy your inner child.





A fliteboard efoil is an electric-driven, fast, agile and silent hydrofoil that gives the sensation of flying over water. A fliteboard carves like a snowboard in fresh powder but with the freedom to ride anywhere, anytime, without wind or waves. It's fast, quiet, and emission-free. You won't ever forget your first time foiling. Anyone can learn, yet fliteboard is engaging for even the most experienced water sports aficionados.





A Schiller bike is designed to glide across the water to get your adrenaline going. It achieves a speed of up to 10 m/ph. Take it out for a solo spin or even better, race a sailboat and leave them in your wake. Experience the water like never before in a unique and mindful way to reconnect with nature.





Jetlev makes it for a flying experience of a lifetime. The Jetlev Flyer is a state-of-the-art jetpack allowing flights up to 80 km/h at heights of up to 12 meters. It provides smooth, comfortable flights as well as exciting flying thrills. Jetlev is amazingly easy to learn. The flight is stable and you feel in control because the center of gravity is below the center of thrust. You'll be airborne in less than three minutes.





The hoverboard is a hydro-propelled board which allows the user to ride and surf in total freedom above the water. Compatible with Yamaha, Seadoo and Kawasaki jet skis. Also available with remote control (no crew member on a jet ski needed). The rider is standing on a board connected by a long hose to a jet ski. Power is controlled by the crew member riding the jet ski.



RADDIN JETBOARD

Radin, or an electric surfboard as many call it, is a board equipped with a jet and controlled via a wireless remote. You can rip it on the water in any style you like. It's a brand new sport without the need for wind, waves or a boat. Fusing the thrills of motor and water sports, jet boarding is the new craze when it comes to action sports. Take the breathtaking freedom that a surfboard gives you and infuse it with the adrenaline rush that motorsports evoke.





Stand-Up Paddle Boarding (SUP) lessons and rentals on the beautiful, salty waters of the Mediterranean are available to anyone who desires to participate in this eco-friendly recreation on water and have fun. There are sites of great beauty such as Cap Martin and Villefranche Bay where SUP will worth your while.



CANYONEERING


MUSEUM OF PREHISTORIC ANTHROPOLOGY

The Museum of Prehistoric Anthropology was founded by Prince Albert I in 1902 "to conserve traces of early humankind exhumed in the Principality and neighboring regions." The numerous collections represent various phases of regional prehistory and protohistory. As a research institute, the museum continues to conduct field digs and carry out laboratory studies. The exceptional example of this is the mammoth skeleton (mammuthus primigenius) excavated in Siberia and conserved for scientific purposes and for exhibition, which has been on display since 2014.



THE ZOOLOGICAL GARDENS OF MONACO

Located on the southern flank of the Rocher, the Zoological Gardens of Monaco were established in 1954 by Prince Rainier III and are one of the last remaining royal menageries in the world. During your visit, you will be immersed in an almost wild environment right in the heart of the modern Principality of Monaco. They are home to nearly 250 animals representing about 50 species: exotic birds, turtles, caimans, hippopotamuses, reptiles, primates and farm animals. Monaco's Zoological Gardens is unique because its animals were all donated, abandoned or seized by customs. When the park's facilities deem it is no longer possible to guarantee good living conditions, the animals are transferred to more appropriate zoos.



- Cannes-Mandelieu Airport (LFMD / CEQ) is an alternate option when flights need to be diverted from NCE.

Helicopter transfer to Monaco is with **Monacair**, the sole operator of regular helicopter transfers between Nice Airport and the Monaco Heliport. The flight along the coast is beautiful and only lasts seven minutes. A chauffeur will take you directly to your villa when arriving at the Monaco heliport along the water's edge.




BY CAR
