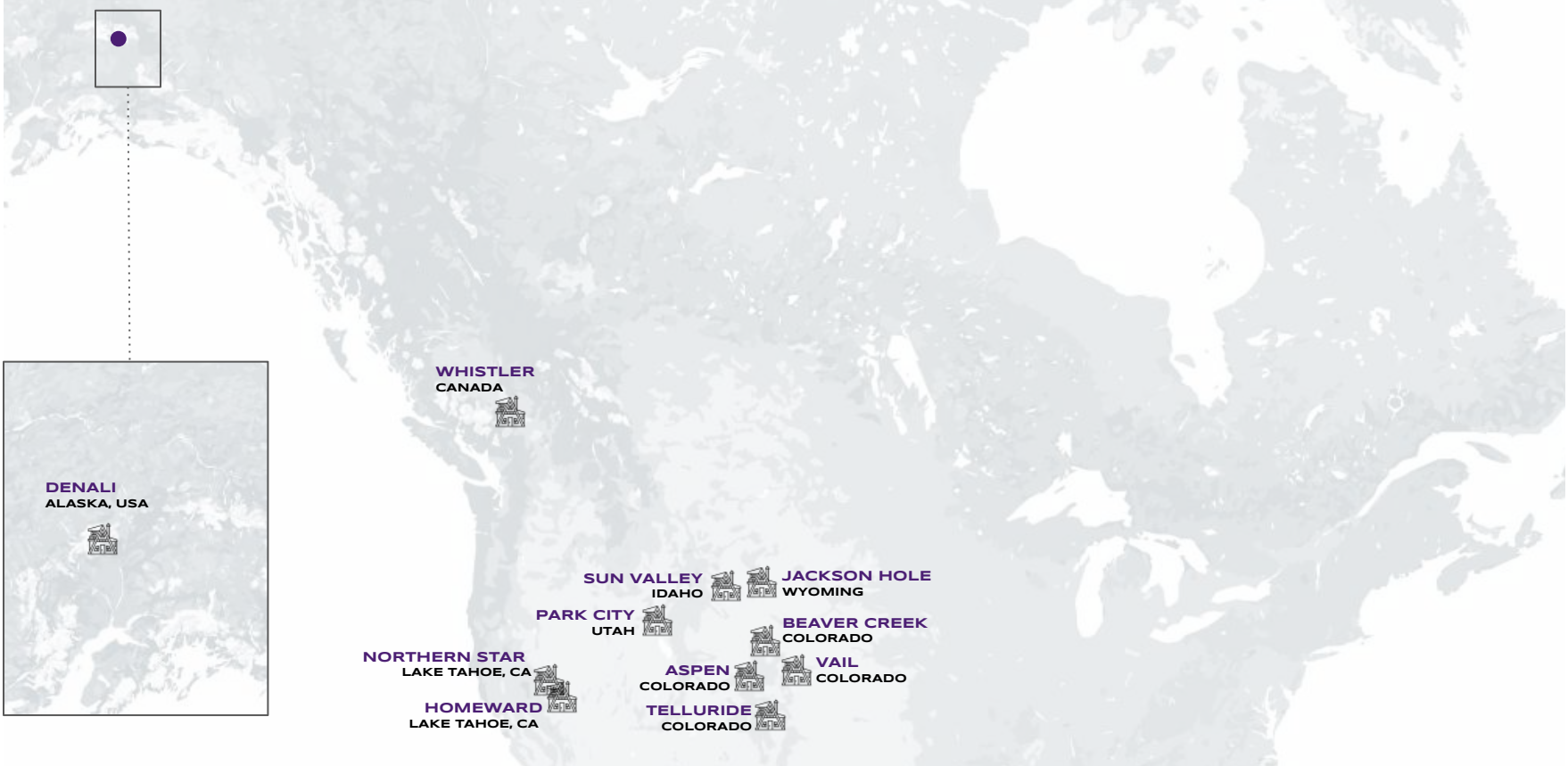

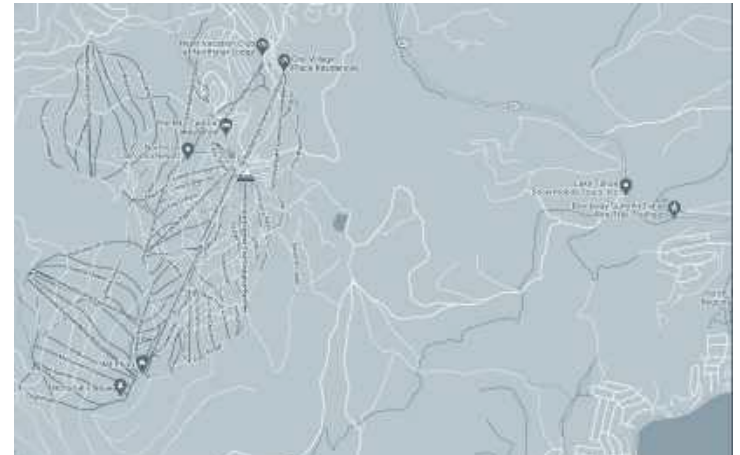

Although nicknamed "Flatstar" for its gentle slopes, Northstar compensates with ample snowmaking to maintain coverage and offers thrilling tree skiing areas for those seeking variety beyond the mellow terrain. While it may lack the extreme challenges of nearby Squaw Valley, its well-maintained slopes and inviting atmosphere make it a family-friendly favorite.

COLORADO, USA



Aspen, long before it became a glamorous haven for the world's elite, traces its roots back to the Victorian era. Nestled nearly 2,440m high in the rugged frontier country, it is surrounded by the majestic Sawatch and Elk mountain ranges of the Rocky Mountains. This town is renowned for its savage beauty and pristine forests. Its remote allure once attracted counterculture icons such as John Denver and Hunter S. Thompson, infusing the area with a spirit of hedonism and charm.
