
ABOUT

St. Barts is hands-down one of the most gorgeous islands in the Caribbean. While the official title of the island is Collectivite territoriale de Saint-Barthelemy, the French, Brits, and Americans have all created their tweaks on nicknames for the island. U.S. visitors prefer St. Barts, while those from France prefer St. Barth, and the Brits prefer St. Barths. Whatever you choose to call it, it's a go-to destination for society's elite to unplug and recharge, and it's brimming with gourmet restaurants and luxury boutiques.

The lovely atoll in the French West Indies has retained its character and charm with Creole-style cottages and mountainous landscapes that hug 22 bright, white sand beaches. St. Barts is a magnet for the rich, particularly between Christmas and New Year's, when billionaires bring their superyachts into the port of the capital, Gustavia. Locals try to identify which boat belongs to whom, adding to the allure of this citrus-scented playground, which, despite all the flashiness, its exclusiveness does not feel pretentious.


If shopping is a part of your DNA, there is nowhere quite like St. Barts where you'll see the world's best and most exclusive designer brands in Gustavia. 




Colombier Beach is by far the most difficult beach to reach. In 1957 when David Rockefeller built his residence on the tip of Grand Colombier, there was one condition in the bill of sale: no road must serve these 27 hectares (67 acres), which have become a private natural marine reserve. You can reach the beautiful beach by boat or by two paths. When snorkeling, you might see turtles frolicking in the seagrass bed.





Flamands is the largest beach on St. Barts and a favorite of the locals. Long, meandering walks on the beach, lost in thought, cares carried away by the balmy breezes are part of the appeal of Flamands since its shores are so lengthy. The ocean in this location is terrific for body boarding or skim boarding and is best left to good swimmers since the waves can get pretty hefty.



ST. JEAN BEACH

Saint-Jean is the tourist spot of Saint Barthélémy with its 2 superb beaches, its shops and its restaurants. The Saint-Jean district is a must-see for any visitor to Saint-Barthélemy, it is the center of tourist life. Its large beach, where Eden Rock sits, is emblematic of the island. Nature lovers will be able to observe several species of migratory birds, as well as a small fauna teeming around its pond. You will have a breathtaking view of the airport from the top of the Col de la Tourmente, or watch the airplanes ballet from the beach.





Shell Beach is about a five-minute walk from Gustavia. It didn't exist before the embankment of the small island capital, and why its sand, mixed with shell debris, is so special. Brave divers jump from the natural diving platforms off the cliff. Tennis champion Yannick Noah was behind the restaurant on the beach, now the Hellenic-themed eatery, Shellona. There you can wait for the sunset, sitting in a deckchair while nibbling Greek olives and sipping on your favorite beverage.





Gouverneur Beach is one of the most sought-after beaches by visitors. Nestled between its wild cliffs and surrounded by brilliant cobalt waters, at Gouverneur Beach, it's even possible to catch glimpses of St. Kitts in the distance. It is an astonishing beach for snorkeling. You may come across squids, sand dollars and on extremely clear days, the ocean floors will truly take your breath away. It is also a perfect beach for picnicking with family or friends.






With its peaceful, unspoiled landscape and just enough remoteness, Saline beach is one of St. Barts' most relaxing beaches and considered by many to be the most stunning on the island. The water is choppier here, so you'll see bodyboarders testing their skills. Saline dunes give the beach a very private, secluded feeling. This spot is very popular for nude sunbathing.





Petit Cul de Sac is a magnificent, protected lagoon and always calm enough to enjoy a refreshing swim. Visitors who want to feel like they're on their own private beach must head to this spot. Turtles are usually swimming or soaking up the sun on the rocks on the left side of the cove. Petit means small in French, and this lovely piece of paradise is true to its name. It's not the largest beach on the island, but one of the most delightful and secluded.






Grand Cul de Sac Beach is a terrific spot to learn to kitesurf. It's a lovely lagoon with calm, shallow water, which is ideal for small children. If your stomach starts to grumble, grab something to eat with your toes in the sand at either O'Corail or La Gloriette.



TOINY BEACH

Swimming here is not recommended, but it is a lovely spot to enjoy the ocean in solitude or with someone special. However, this beach is one of St. Barts' best surfing beaches, but most of the time you'll find it pretty much deserted. If you can park in the tiny indentation and walk to the beach for a half-hour hike along the "goat path," you'll find the area of water known as "the washing machine" — peaceful or tumultuous, depending on the moment and the sea's mood.





St. Barts has the best restaurants in the Caribbean. It's a French island with little indigenous food culture, so many ingredients are brought in from Europe. Some of the best restaurants are found on the site at upscale hotels or resorts, where the brand of Caribbean cuisine combines Creole flavors, exotic local fruits, fresh seafood, and traditional French cooking techniques.

The menu at La Case highlights Caribbean cuisine at its finest, treating your taste buds to a profusion of flavors. Offerings include local octopus with mango and passion fruit, rum-lacquered pork belly with grilled eggplant, and Yellowfin tuna tartare with crispy rice and basil. They also have a selection of Casparian caviar and a set Caribbean menu to share.



L'ISOLETTA | ITALIAN

L'Isoletta treats its guests to the most divine pizza at any hour of the day and into the late evening. Sit comfortably at one of the tables on the covered terrace and enjoy an authentic Roman-style pie. Try the pizza that bears the restaurant's name, L'Isoletta: Cream cheese, arugula, cherry tomatoes, with a balsamic reduction. The freshest ingredients come from Italy and are also used to make L'Isoletta's lasagna and eggplant parmesan. Traditional Italian desserts are made daily.



L'ATELIER DE JOËL ROBUCHON SAINT BARTH | CREATIVE

Chefs at this upscale eatery will prepare dishes right in front of you in an open kitchen. You can choose to sit at one of the 34 counter seats, one of 20 seats in the dining room or by the bar or a table on the covered rooftop. Whichever area you choose, you are sure to be treated to a memorable meal, paired with a healthy selection of wines either by the glass or the bottle.



OREGA I JAPANESE

Orega's Franco-Japanese fusion fare continues to please even the most discerning diners. Smack in the center of Gustavia, Orega isn't just a meal, it's an experience. Lovers of fine food will not only get a feast for their palates but one for their eyes as well. These dishes are beautifully plated. Order the confit duck or mahi-mahi, or enjoy the Omakase tasting menu of seven or nine dishes paired with just the right Sake combination to accentuate this food adventure. Save room for the chocolate bomb to end a splendid meal.





Right in the heart of Gustavia, Black Ginger serves a 100% authentic and refined Thai cuisine created by a trio of Thai chefs. The eatery's unique interior courtyard opens onto the starry sky, matched only by its contemporary design combining a palette of red and black colors, lighted domes spreading a soft, attractive cast. You should try the Massaman curry with coconut milk and peanuts.




L'ISOLA | ITALIAN


L'ESPRIT | GASTRONOMIC

LE FOUQUET'S | FRENCH




MODJO ST BARTS




NIGHTLIFE

MUSEE MUNICIPAL DE ST. BARTHELEMY / THE "WALL HOUSE" MUSEUM

Visit Wall House Museum for a glimpse into St. Barts' history. The museum presents a limited number of artifacts and pictorials on the history of the island. On the outside, you'll be able to view old canons, a fireplace, and the thick wall of the original building. Modest and brief, a quick stop in the museum provides an interesting non-beach vacation activity.







EDEN GALLERY

The Eden Fine Art Gallery has opened its seventh gallery location on the island. Eden, an international distributor of exclusive and contemporary art by selected artists, aims to create a modern, dynamic, and open space in each gallery, allowing artists and visitors to have the full and very unique experience of the art collection. Permanent exhibitions make way for temporary exhibits, pop-ups, and artists' live performances.

It's a regatta that starts under the coconut trees, swaying gently in the warm trade winds. It's so good that it's sold out every year. As soon as registration opens for the regatta each year, the 60 spots are snapped up in hours. After just a few editions, the St-Barth Cata Cup established itself on the world circuit.




ST BARTS GOURMET FESTIVAL

Since 2014, the Gourmet Festival has been a must-attend annual event in St. Barts. Each November, by invitation of the finest establishments on the island, Michelin-starred chefs from France leave their kitchens to spend a week at this festival. PHOTO FESTIVAL ST. BARTH ART WEEK

If you want to attend a week of immersing yourself in some of the most fantastic art in the world's most glamorous art destination, you must head to St. Barts for the annual St. Barth Art Week. The opening week begins November 22 at the Wallhouse Museum with an exhibition of emerging artists presented. Jet-setters and the island's prestigious residents will enjoy the unique opportunity to meet the renowned fashion photographers at their opening event.



ST. BARTH CHRISTMAS VILLAGE

The very much awaited and famous Christmas Village opens on the quays of Gustavia the first week of December each year. Dozens of merchants set up areas to peddle their products – everything from sweets to jewelry – to put under the Christmas tree. There are different musical performances every evening, providing a festive atmosphere for the holidays. In mid-December, Santa descends on the island to have his photo taken with all his fans!




ST BARTH NEW YEARS

St. Barts is the place to be on New Year's Eve! The island is definitely the kind of celebration to ring in a new year. Regulars and jet setters of all stripes flock to St. Barts in their yachts and private jets to celebrate at the island's chicest restaurants and bars. Gustavia is the official epicenter of New Year's celebrations in St. Barts and dockside berths and anchor moorings sparkle with luxury yachts and equally refined guests. Many yachts participate in the annual New Year's Eve yacht parade. Making a full loop around the island, the beautiful boats vie for best-in-show prizes awarded later at the awards ceremony, each glimmering seafaring vessel more glamorous than the next.






A is a three-day invitational regatta with 48 of the most impressive mega-yachts in the world, all at least 100 feet long, including many classic wooden racing boats. Travelers can view many of the participating boats in Gustavia harbor after 5 p.m. most days.



ST. BARTS MUSIC FESTIVAL

Since 1985, St. Barts has hosted a performing arts festival unlike any other in the world. The island stages more than a dozen nights of the finest live music and dance performances in an informal setting each January. Audiences are treated to intimate concerts by some of the world's most prominent classical, opera, ballet, and jazz stars. These performers have the level of artistry that one would normally have to attend Carnegie Hall in New York or the Opera Garnier in Paris to experience. But they're offered in St. Barts with the added magic of island breezes stained with the fragrance of flowering hibiscus.





Carnaval is the period between Epiphany and Ash Wednesday, marking the beginning of the 40 days abstinence of Lent. St Barts Carnaval celebrations include a children's costume parade, a pajama parade, a Mardi Gras parade in Gustavia, and ends with the burning of (Vaval) the king of Carnaval at Shell Beach on Ash Wednesday.



THE ST BARTHS SUMMER CAMP YOGA CHALLENGE

This a-la-carte wellness event is an opportunity for the island's yoga community to practice, learn and grow together. The camp's flexible format lets you choose your schedule, from one drop-in class to complete immersion. It's open to all levels of practice and experience in yoga, meditation, and breathwork. With more than 25 weekly scheduled classes and events to choose from, you select the level of immersion and participation, and you can join at any time during the month. As places are limited, register early to save your spot.


GUSTAVIA SIGHTSEEING

Gustavia, St. Barts' capital, mixes Caribbean charm with those upscale elements that appeal to the wealthy. A day's sightseeing in this lovely town includes meandering down cobblestone streets dotted with beautiful Scandinavian, French, and English-influenced architecture. There is a quaintly-styled church dating from the 1800s and a small, lovely museum. You can visit the three old forts raised by the Swedish during their almost 100 years of island ownership, beginning in the late 1700s and ending when they sold their claim back to France in 1878. Fort Gustav was originally constructed in 1787 as harbor protection and today is a ruined complex with little beyond its cannon-studded bulwarks and traces of a guardhouse, bake-house, and cisterns. Despite its dilapidation, the site is atmospheric with a distinctive and still operating red and white lighthouse raised in its middle. The walk is lovely, and visiting this spot is worth it for no other reason than to get a glorious view of the harbor.



ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE (ATV) ISLAND EXPLORATION

ATVs are a common sight in St. Barts. These machines are an easy and quick way to get from place to place on an island only about 11 miles long and 2.5 miles wide. Driving around takes about a half-hour. The roads on the island are well-maintained, but if you want to explore some rougher terrain on an ATV, you should have some experience driving one since many of the roads are steep and winding. Some people say renting an ATV is the best way to see the island. By the way, ATVs are not allowed on beaches.





All St. Barts' areas are breathtaking, but the drive through Grand Fond is the most exceptional. Here, along the island's Cote Sauvage, you can smell the open ocean like nowhere else. This fantastic drive, letting the balmy ocean breeze kiss your skin, is a refreshing alternative after a few hot beach days. Locals describe the Grand Fond as a magical place, with picturesque vistas, rocky beaches made of weathered coral, and impressively turbulent waters. It's a drive you won't find mentioned in most tourist guides.

HIKE TO NATURAL POOLS OF SAINT BARTHÉLEMY

The coastal and underwater natural environment of Saint Barthélemy represents the second wealth of this small island. But apart from all this, St Barth is also one of those places which shelter these rare natural pools, often unknown by tourists. Once you take the scenic drive through Grand-Fond make sure to take a hike to the magnificent turquoise waters of this rare natural phenomenon. It is a dangerous path leading to the "Washing Machine", as the pools are called, thus the sights should not be visited if the sea is rough, lest you get surprised by powerful and dangerous waves.

RENT MOKE

St Barts' travelers looking for a rental car option with personality may want to consider the Moke – an open format mini-jeep type vehicle great for heading to the beach. St. Barts is a hilly island with some steep grades, and roads can be narrow at times when passing another car. So it's better to stay small, high, and fully powered when selecting a rental. The Moke is young and dynamic, very colorful, and ideally in tune with the island's spirit. It's a thermal vehicle with an automatic gearbox and power steering, allowing you to make peaks at 120 km/h.




PICNIC AT (COLOMBIER BEACH)

Couples who want some serious privacy for a romantic picnic must visit this remote beach, which hides at the bottom of a steep, cacti-lined hike down from the main road along St. Barts' northwest tip. The rock formations, calm waters, and stunning views of Colombier Beach are what define the island. If you're getting there by boat, the natural gulf along the beach is a perfect place to dock. With so many beaches around, you have the luxury to handpick a beach of your choice. Whether that be Toiny, Petit Cul de Sac, Saline, or at Shell Beach, you can equally enjoy your dining alfresco excursion.





Seventy-one percent of the earth is water, yet most of this magical world remains a mystery. 
SCUBA DIVING

Scuba diving in the warm waters of St. Barts is a must! The channel between St. Barts and St. Martin is only 30 m deep, and with such shallow waters, the sunlight reaches all the way to the seabed, illuminating the coral and reefs, bringing out their striking colours. Throughout these waters you will see tropical fish of all kinds and colours. There are numerous dive sites in St. Barts – 22 to be exact – and with such consistent and calm waters all around you are likely to have a good experience with any one of them.





Stand-up paddleboarding was an ancient form of surfing and re-emerged as a way for instructors to manage larger groups of students. It gave instructors a higher viewpoint and better visibility. SUP is increasing in popularity and is now a sport in its own right and a brilliant activity for first-time participants. SUP is ideal for a serene afternoon in Grand Cul de Sac or even a venture out onto the open ocean.






With its shallow waters, protected lagoons, and exposure to northeastern trade winds, Grand Cul de Sac –the bay directly outside Le Sereno – is widely regarded as one of the world's finest windsurfing destinations. Expert surfers test their luck here daily, but it's also the perfect spot for a beginner's outing. There are many outfits on the island that offer private windsurfing lessons and equipment rentals.



KITESURFING

Who wants to go to school on vacation? No one, unless it's kitesurfing school. Private, one-on-one kitesurfing lessons for beginners are offered in various locations on the island; however, one of the most well-known schools is run by former kitesurfing pro-Rodolphe MacKeene. Learn the basics and advance to freestyle jumps with newfound "flying" skills. Get started in the Grand Cul de Sac marine reserve. Closed off from the ocean by a coral reef, it has warm, shallow water, making it a naturally formed wading pool and ideal for learning this new, adventurous skill.






Flyboarding has taken St. Barts by storm. You can learn how to master this nautical activity with the help of professional instructors. To flyboard, you stand on a board in a pair of special boots with jet nozzles underneath. A long hose connects the board to a personal watercraft. When water is forced under pressure to the boots, it thrusts you up into the air. Most people learn to flyboard in under 10 minutes. The biggest thing is confidence.





Hoverboarding provides new sensations of gliding just above the water. Even if your children have never tried this type of activity, they are sure to have fun with this one. A hoverboard is connected to a long hose attached to the board, which makes the rider shoot high enough into the air to do flips and other spectacular tricks. A hoverboard is different from a flyboard in that its movement is more horizontal, while a flyboard is more vertical.



DEEP SEA FISHING

There are many opportunities in St. Barts for offshore fishing charter excursions that boast catches of bull-nosed dolphin (mahi-mahi), wahoo, tuna, barracuda, marlin, and more. Big game deep sea fishing is an exciting way to commune with the open sea. Success on the water can present itself with a trophy fish with wahoo, tuna, and barracuda present all year. White and blue marlin populate the waters from May to September (catch and tag system), while Mahi-Mahi is prevalent from December to April.

INTRODUCTION TO SEABOB

A seabob is like a motorized scooter underwater, and when kids get the hang of it, they'll want to do it again and again. Everyone wants to have a go with the seabob since it's easy to maneuver and can be learned in an instant, and allows you to skim the surface of the water or swim like a dolphin. There are seabob lessons available for children 8 years old and up, while they're in St. Barts. Seabob rentals are available for children 10 years old and older, and children 12 years old and up can participate in a seabob snorkeling tour.



HIKE TO COLOMBIER BEACH

Offering panoramic views of the island's jewel-toned coastline, the 25-minute walk to Colombier is genuinely impressive. You'll come across sweeping mountainsides with low-lying shrubs providing an unparalleled sense of seclusion while cliffs drop off to reveal stunning turquoise water and white caps breaking over the reef. You will have to be very mindful of children since you'll have to take the stairs carved into giant exposed reef rocks beneath overhangs. When you near the trail's end, you'll all get the first glimpse of Colombier Beach, where you'll again have to descend stairs to get to the water, which is dotted with the masts of sailboats. This hike is not for children still unsteady on their feet.

It can accommodate propeller planes and small jets. Due to the runway restrictions and wind patterns around the airport, pilots must be specially trained to fly into St Barts Airport. Private flights on small or light jets can be booked from New York, London, Miami, or other major cities around the globe.


Private charter flights to St Barts are also available from all neighboring islands, as well as a Caravan plane or on five-passenger helicopters.
