

ABOUT

Canada's most famous mountain resort, Whistler, is nestled at the feet of two gargantuan mountains – the Whistler and Blackcomb – in the Whistler Valley, north of Vancouver, British Columbia. These impressive peaks form the most significant and upscale winter sports area in North America, and the always bustling Whistler Village provides immediate access to some of the best skiing. If you're a skier, then you certainly would have heard of Whistler if you haven't already traversed its sensational slopes or, at the very least, fantasized about it. Whistler's international appeal existed before it co-hosted the 2010 Winter Olympics. Still, the games only amplified the mountain resort's fame as a vacation hotspot.


Only one main road, Highway 99, also known as the Sea-to-Sky Highway, connects the area's attractions and communities, a scenic drive that rates as one of Canada's most spectacular road trips. This alpine wilderness is your year-round playground, just a scenic two-hour drive or short helicopter flight north of Vancouver. Whistler Village Stroll is lined with countless opportunities for memorable experiences, from fine dining to luxury boutique shopping, art galleries, and apres ski venues. On the other hand, just beyond the comforts of elegant and extravagant accommodations, the trails and ancient forests of British Columbia's wilderness call to casual adventurers and outdoor purists alike.





Pemberton is a beautiful town just 30 minutes north of Whistler. With incredible mountain views, tons of recreational activities, and a quieter lifestyle than Whistler, it's no wonder many people choose their accommodations here. The area is surrounded by numerous breathtaking provincial parks, each providing opportunities for adventure and exploration. Birkenhead Lake, Garibaldi, Joffre Lakes, and Nairn Falls parks are huge draws for those who love the outdoors.



WHISTLER NORTH

The subdivisions in Whistler North are characterized by extensive green spaces and access to lakes, seemingly endless hiking and biking trails, a world-class golf course, cross-country ski trails, and some of the most magnificent mountain views. Alpine Meadows is one of the most popular areas in Whistler North, offering a harmonious blend of Whistler's past, present, and future with a combination of townhomes, traditional ski cabins, and modern mountain chalets. Just a short drive past Alpine is Whistler's newest subdivision, Rainbow. It boasts breathtaking views across Green Lake to Whistler, Blackcomb, and Wedge Mountains. A short way past Rainbow is the residential neighborhood of Emerald Estates, named after the jeweled color of Green Lake, with some villas having waterfront access.



WHISTLER CENTER

Characterized by the beautiful Alta Lake and surrounding parks, Whistler Centre is a part of the village's original history as a fishing resort, well before any dreams of skiing. Set close to the village, this area is incredibly desirable. Many properties in Whistler Center are situated above the valley floor, offering beautiful panoramas of Whistler, Blackcomb Mountains, and the valley or the golf course. There are many exclusive neighborhoods within Whistler Center. Just south of the village, you will find Brio, with the exclusive ski-in/ski-out Sunridge Plateau development. North of Brio, perched alongside the Whistler Golf Course, is Blueberry Hill, one of the resort's first luxury home subdivisions. South of Brio, hugging the shores of Alta Lake and neighboring Wayside Park, is Alta Vista.




WHISTLER VILLAGE

It's not just the mountains that make Whistler an incredible place. The village boasts hundreds of shops, world-class restaurants, bars, multiplex cinemas, concert venues, and much more. Fully pedestrianized, you are free to explore wherever you want on foot. The cobblestone pedestrian-only village is known for internationally ranked cuisine, a famous apres ski and nightclub scene, high-end spas, and all the retail therapy an avid shopper could want. There are stunning views no matter where you turn, and it was meticulously conceived to exist in harmony with its beautiful natural surroundings.



WHISTLER SOUTH

Whistler South is the home of the first village site when Whistler Mountain opened in 1966. Here you will find a unique mix of original rustic cabins next to luxurious and modern townhomes, condos, employee housing, timeshares, and single-family dwellings. On top of that, it's just a stone's throw from the gondola. Creekside is the hub of this area, with the Creekside Gondola, restaurants, shops, and Whistler's only gas station. Whistler Creek also features three exclusive locales. Kadenwood is Canada's first and only resort neighborhood with its dedicated gondola service, while Bear Creek has incomparable access to Whistler Mountain as well as simply stunning views from across the valley. The Nita Lake Lodge, also located in Whistler Creek, is Whistler's first and only five-star waterfront hotel.



The Braidwood Tavern at the Four Seasons Resort Whistler has a dedicated vegan menu with mouthwatering options like green pea and zucchini curry, rigatoni bolognese, and all green pizza and plant-based burgers. The vibe is relaxed and easy, and it's also good to know the drinks list is another thing you should look at. They have a large array of local craft beers and some unique and innovative craft cocktails.





Earls is a fantastic après ski location. It is fancy enough to feel a bit special, has a broad crowd-pleasing menu, offers happy hour drinks and food, and somehow always manages to have a bustling weekend-y vibe. Their veggie selection has expanded recently and includes a vegan quinoa and avocado power bowl, sushi such as a green dragon roll, as well as spicy tofu tacos or a crispy tofu Zen bowl.





The Naked Sprout is a juice bar slash cafe with many veggie and gluten-free options. Its located right in the center of the village at Sundial Place, so it's perfect to pop into if you need a quick, healthy meal or snack. The Naked Sprout has grilled paninis, a ramen bowl, a miso quinoa bowl, raw desserts, and a wonderful variety of fresh smoothies, juices, and shots.




HY'S STEAKHOUSE & COCKTAIL BAR | STEAKHOUSE

Hy's is a must for any meat lover. Unanimously thought to have the best steak in Whistler, Hy's Steakhouse has a vast steak menu with lots of incredible sides to go with it. 
IL CAMINETTO | ITALIAN


THE BEARFOOT BISTRO | MODERNE




Casual and refined, Fairmont's Mallard Lounge and terrace is the ideal destination for sunny patio cocktails in the summer or après ski entertainment in winter. 
BAR OSO

Bar Oso by Araxi offers a pleasant après with windows facing the stroll so you can check out the latest mountain fashions. This après spot specializes in the *Art of Charcuterie* in Whistler. There are no rules with Whistler après, so choose your own adventure. "Oso" meaning "bear" in Spanish, an homage to Whistler's wildlife – offers a profusion of Spanish-influenced small plates, tapas, and house-made charcuterie. THE LONGHORN


GARIBALDI LIFT COMPANY (GLC)


DUSTY'S BAR & GRILL






UMBRELLA BAR











SQUAMISH LIL'WAT CULTURAL CENTER

The Squamish Lil'wat Cultural Centre in Whistler is an authentic First Nations museum and cultural experience. The Squamish Lil'wat Cultural Centre showcases Whistler's First Nations through art, exhibits, food, film, tours, crafts, and live performances. This is the only centre in the world that has purposefully been designed to demonstrate how two distinct First Nations can share territory, knowledge, and cultural practices in a way that acknowledges the uniqueness of each. It is reflected not only in the architectural design but also in how exhibits, activities, and programming are offered. Worth noting is that all proceeds from the SLCC are invested in training and cultural revitalization programs for the Squamish and Lil'wat Nations.



MAURY YOUNG ARTS CENTRE

The Maury Young Arts Centre is the hub for everything arts and culture in Whistler. The Arts Centre hosts a community gallery, local artisan wares, a performance theatre, and multi-purpose rooms for workshops and rehearsals. The centre is the home of Arts Whistler, a team passionate about connecting visitors, locals, and artists with the incredible variety of arts and culture offered throughout the resort community. Likewise, the Gallery at Maury Young Arts Centre is Whistler's community gallery, showcasing work from talented artists and artisans from the Sea to Sky region. Stop by and check out the latest art exhibit. Each piece on display in the gallery is available for purchase, with most of the sale revenue going directly to the artist and a portion going toward community art programs.




AUDAIN ART MUSEUM

Established in 2016, the Audain Art Museum is a leading arts organization founded upon the major philanthropic gift of Michael Audain and Yoshiko Karasawa. Designed by the internationally–renowned firm Patkau Architects, the AAM boasts a comprehensive permanent collection of the province's most celebrated artists. Exemplifying the richness of cultural differences in Canada, the collection takes visitors on a transformative visual journey from the late 18th century to the present. Highlights include an exceptional collection of indigenous historical masks and key examples of the Vancouver photo conceptualism movement. In addition, the museum hosts dynamic exhibitions from around the world.





The Whistler Contemporary gallery not only features established contemporary artists but is also a champion of emerging voices. The Whistler Contemporary Gallery currently showcases works by Jeff Koons, Paul Rousso, Bill Starke, and many more. Keep up with their current exhibits and events.





PUBLIC ART

Here are just a few pieces you can appreciate in the open space, like *A Timeless Circle*, a permanent fixture in the courtyard beside Maury Young Arts Centre designed by Musqueam artist Susan Point, or *Quartz-Chromatic*, a Sea to Sky-inspired mural by Dave Petko, and *Thunderbird* by Squamish Nation artist Sinámkin – Jody Broomfield, her aluminum sculpture pays tribute to the Squamish Nation legend of Black Tusk Mountain exhibited at the east end of the Upper Village Stroll.




PEAK 2 PEAK GONDOLA


WHISTLER SLIDING CENTRE

Above Whistler Village on the side of Blackcomb Mountain is a world-class bobsleigh, skeleton, and luge facility – Whistler Sliding Centre. Public visitors can try Whistler's unique activities, passenger bobsleigh (winter and summer), and public skeleton (winter). Aspiring athletes can join *Learn to Slide* programming for all skill levels in bobsleigh, skeleton, and luge within the BC Sliding Development Centre. The facility is also a National Training Centre and popular training and competition venue for athletes from all over the world.



THE PEAK EXPRESS CHAIRLIFT

In addition to riding the Blackcomb Gondola, the Whistler Village Gondola, and the Guinness World Record-breaking PEAK 2 PEAK Gondola, your can ride on the Peak Express chairlift as well and experience the beauty mid-air. Breathe the fresh air, admire the sights and feel the wind on your face as you move through the mountain environment. The Peak Express chairlift is your access to the Top of the World Summit, Cloudraker Skybridge, and Raven's Eye Lookout. This chairlift ride is an exhilarating experience taking you over the top of an ancient glacier while cresting over a 100-foot vertical cliff at the top.



CLOUDRAKER SKYBRIDGE

Situated at the highest point on Whistler Mountain, near the top of the Peak Chairlift, is the Cloudraker Skybridge. To access the Cloudraker Skybridge, you must ride the open Peak Express chairlift. This new attraction offers arguably some of the finest views in all of British Columbia. Open only in the summer, the metal-framed bridge stretches 130 meters over a yawning chasm from Whistler Peak to West Ridge. On top of West Ridge, the Raven's Eye deck provides unobstructed views of Black Tusk in Garibaldi Provincial Park, Whistler Village, Blackcomb Mountain, and the Coast Mountain range. Equally thrilling is the ride up the Peak Chair as it ascends steeply over several very high sections.



ATTRACTIONS



Stepping off the Peak Express chairlift to the summit of Whistler Mountain truly feels like you're on top of the world. Jaw-dropping views of the surrounding Coast Mountains like the iconic Black Tusk, the Tantalus Range, Castle Towers present themselves in full view. No other place displays the alpine-like the Top of the World Summit does, making this journey a must-do for all ability levels.






So many travelers just wait for the snow to fly and temperatures to plummet so they can get to those places where they can enjoy their favorite winter activities like skiing, heli-skiing, snowboarding, skating, tobogganing, or snowmobiling. We'd be remiss if we didn't mention cuddling up under a blanket in a sleigh being pulled by beautiful horses while the moon lights the way. Imagine sitting in front of a roaring fire with a mug of hot cocoa embellished by coffee liqueur and whipped cream. It may be cold outside, but winter can be a real heart warmer when it comes to special times.



SKIING AND SNOWBOARDING

Whistler is a skier and rider's paradise. With more than 8,170 acres of skiable terrain between Whistler and Blackcomb Mountains and 200 counting runs, 16 alpine bowls and three glaciers, every powder hound will find a line, no matter the skill level. As Canada's biggest ski area and a perennial award-winning best ski resort in North America, Whistler brings the ski experience to another level. The two mountains offer slightly different skiing and riding experiences for winter enthusiasts. Whistler Mountain offers more green runs, wide open bowls, and family-friendly terrain, while Blackcomb Mountain attracts more intermediate and advanced skiers and riders, as well as those interested in double blacks and high alpine chutes.



HELI-SKIING AND SNOWBOARDING

No matter what your powder ability, there is a run for you. Fully-certified heli-skiing guides will take you into the backcountry to experience powder skiing and riding like it is supposed to be *untracked*, *uncrowded*, *and unbelievable*. Epic bowls, long glacier runs with the perfect pitch, mind-blowing tree runs. Fly in A-Star helicopters which lift one pilot, one fully certified professional heli-ski guide and four guests to some of the most amazing and easily accessible terrain anywhere.



CAT SKIING

Cat skiing is rarely mentioned outside North America. So here is a short explanation of what it is and how it works. Beginning in Canada more than 30 years ago, two bright sparks had the idea of using snowcats, or piste bashers as they're often known, to transport skiers uphill, allowing them to access terrain beyond the confines of a resort. So rather than flatten the powder into easily manageable groomed highways, the cats get you to the top of deep, untouched runs. Led by a guide, you'll ski the pitch before being collected at the bottom and head off for the next run. And you can do that all day long. Put yourself in an environment where the powder is deep and the mountains quiet. But there is something magical about being up in the mountains with only a handful of friends.




PASSENGER BOBSLEIGH

The Whistler Sliding Centre's Passenger Bobsleigh Experience is one of Whistler's most unique activities. After an orientation, you will slide in a real bobsleigh, driven by a trained pilot. You and your team will race through ten twists and turns at speeds of more than 125 km/h and feel the full force of acceleration. The Whistler Sliding Centre is the only place in Canada where the public can try bobsleigh and slide like an Olympian. Passenger Bobsleigh runs rain, snow, or shine so it's the perfect addition to your time in Whistler.





Tackle one or all of the seven lanes at the Coca–Cola Tube Park just off Base 2 Zone on Blackcomb Mountain. Tubing is great fun for children or to do as a family. Gain speed on your own or ask the staff to join tubes together and give you a spinning start for an extra blast as you careen down the hill.




CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING | WHISTLER OLYMPIC PARK

Get inspired by Whistler Olympic Park's history as the 2010 Nordic Olympic venue and the beautiful mountain and valley views, and strap on cross-country skis. For skiers of all abilities, Whistler Olympic Park provides access to close to 90 kilometers of well-marked trails from green/easy, blue/intermediate to black/advanced. Explore the trails through old-growth forests and dreamy meadows, or, for even more breathtaking views of the surrounding mountain ranges, work your way up to the different viewpoints. Cross-country skiing is an easy-to-learn sport for all ages and fitness levels.





Experience the next step in adventure snowmobiling. Guests with some experience can progress into more exciting terrain and tighter trails. Explore frozen lakes or visit Whistler's Ancient Cedar Forest. Guests should have some previous snowmobile, automated terrain vehicle, or jet-ski experience.




ICE FISHING

Ice fishing is a truly Canadian experience. You should be advised there is a strict policy in place and it's all about practicing catch and release. Under no exceptions are fish kept. Ice fishing is conducted on one of three lakes in town stocked annually with rainbow trout. After drilling a few holes into the ice with a powered auger, you will be fishing in no time. There is a good chance you will have the lake all to yourself. It's the perfect getaway when you need a break from skiing and want some quiet time.





A wonderful introduction to winter, snowshoeing is a refreshing, low-impact activity that harnesses the skill of walking – so everybody from toddlers to seniors can do it. Whistler Olympic Park provides access to more than 30 kilometers of marked trails (more than 15 kilometers of which are dog-friendly). Book a Guided Snowshoe Tour and let guides take you through the park, or pick up a map and go on a self-guided walk.





Ski fast, shoot straight, that's what the Olympic sport of biathlon is all about. The dual winter sport combines the exhilaration of cross-country skiing with the marksmanship of target shooting. Experience it for yourself with one of the unique biathlon lessons for all levels. Experienced and knowledgeable biathlon instructors will eagerly share their knowledge with you.





If you're looking to challenge yourself and get some exercise while doing it, rock climbing and bouldering at the Whistler Core is a super enjoyable way to burn some energy and test your strength. With both a bouldering area and climbing walls there is plenty of room to space out and climb. If bouldering is more your style, the bouldering area has a cave, chimney, and crack climbing. Shoe and harness rentals are available if you don't have your own.



DOG SLEDDING

For the kind of Canadian winter experience that will spark your inner child, embark on a three-hour dog sledding journey through the magnificent old-growth forest of the Callaghan Valley. To start, a professional musher (dog sled driver) will harness and stage a team of dogs for you before you learn the commands and get to take over the driving of your canine team. You'll experience a mix of open and tighter, winding trails for an unforgettable winter journey, not to mention priceless photo opportunities.



MOUNTAIN TOP FONDUE

Visiting during the winter when the days are short, the nights are long, evenings can feel like they come too soon. However, there is a special opportunity to eat dinner at the top of the Crystal Chair on Blackcomb Mountain. The Crystal Hut Fondue Tour takes you up the mountain in a snowcat and into the Crystal Hut for a surreal mountain top fondue dinner. The views of the lights of Whistler below and the glow on Rainbow Mountain lit up by the moonlight are truly special. Even with the cold wind outside the window of the Crystal Hut, the warmth of friends and good food is worth it.








The aqua blue ice chambers and caves underneath the Pemberton Ice Cap are part of the largest southern ice field in British Columbia. Ancient ice has formed into a maze of spectacular ice halls, frozen water sculptures and flows. Elite visitors can arrange a helicopter expedition to explore the ice caves and even book a dining experience set in the blue light of a private ice chamber. Guided tours are also available.


HELI-GLACIER ICE CAVE EXPLORING




- Alpine Walk walk
- Overlord Trail to Lakeside Loop the best intermediate hike (two to three hours)
- Overlord Trail to Decker Loop the best advanced hike (three to four hours)



HIGH NOTE TRAIL

High Note Trail is the best hiking experience on Whistler Mountain. At the top of the Peak Express chairlift, hikers will enjoy stunning views of Black Tusk and Cheakamus Lake as they descend through rugged terrain that mellows into a rolling course.

- Time required: three to four hours



DECKER LOOP


Connecting with Overlord Trail, the Decker Loop is a world-class alpine trail and the best hiking experience on Blackcomb Mountain. Start by hiking clockwise up and into Garibaldi Provincial Park with incredible views of ancient mountain peaks, the Overlord Glacier, and the Decker Tarn – a glacial alpine lake.

- Time Required: 45-75 minutes (one-way)






Several trails link together to create the Brandywine Gorge Loop. The loop is a mostly unpaved, 1.4-mile route traveling the deep, wooded ravine created by Brandywine Creek. The 1.5-mile, unpaved Stanford Trail heads down into the valley to a connector to the Towpath Trail. Visitors can also access Summit Metro Parks' Bike & Hike Trail for miles of paved biking and hiking.

ELECTRIC BIKES

Tour this breathtaking valley upon the seat of the world's finest Swiss-designed and engineered electric bikes. This locally curated and guided Eco Adventure will glide you past three Glacier fed Alpine Lakes, through three world class golf courses, check out an active bear den, see 500-year-old Canadian Red Cedar stands, bird sanctuaries, beaver lodges, fishing holes, the only airport – a Sea Plane Harbor.





The peaks of both Whistler mountains are home to the furry animals that give Whistler its name. Marmots live among the rocks of the alpine and subalpine, and their whistles can be heard all around the mountain and are used to warn of incoming predators. The best spots to view them are the High Note Trail on Whistler and the Decker Loop on Blackcomb.



BEAR VIEWING TOURS

Whistler and Blackcomb Mountains are home to 60 black bears and cubs adapted to feeding, mating, and hibernating within ski area habitats. This is the only population of black bears in BC that has been studied for more than two decades. Travel in a comfortable 4x4 vehicle through a maze of ski area roads that traverse the largest concentration of mother bear ranges in the region. Take an even closer look with short walks to bear feeding sites and family daybeds, and wander through old–growth forests where bears have hibernated through many winters. Experienced and qualified teams of guides boast a wealth of knowledge of Whistler's flora and fauna, ecology, and bear biology for a truly incredible outdoor learning experience.







The exclusive RZR tours weave unforgettable natural destinations and the pleasure of off-roading into one seamless journey, where the scenery at each stop rivals the power of the off-road vehicle.






Consider booking a guided via Ferrata tour on the top of Whistler mountain. Translating literally to *iron way*, via Ferrata are a series of metal rungs and cables fixed to a cliff-face to assist climbers. They were famously used in the First World War by Italian soldiers who had to carry heavy supplies dangerously high into alpine camps. Moreover, Whistler Blackcomb hosts some of the best summer ski and snowboard camps in North America.





A labyrinth of snow walls tower above Pika's Traverse on Whistler Mountain for a short period in early summer. Walls are carved from the abundance of snow received from the past winter, which provides a unique route for guests to access the alpine. But they don't last forever, so experience them before they melt. Snow walls are just one part of the PEAK 2 PEAK 360 Experience.





Whether it's because of its jaw-dropping scenery, the need for a strategy before you swing there is something memorable that stays with you well after you've left the green.






Although Whistler is predominantly known as a winter hotspot, in the summer, it transforms into a different type of destination resort and vacation spot. The many lakes lining the valley ensure there is enough space for everyone. With five lakes easily accessible from Highway 99, you can pick from Alpha, Nita, Alta, Lost, and Green lakes. In the mountains, there are many to explore: Wedge, Iceberg, Sproat, Cheakamus, Russet, and Loggers lakes. They take a little more effort to get to but are definitely worth it. The valley lakes of Whistler are the most popular for both tourists and locals looking to relax and swim. It's worth mentioning, is that all the lakes are glacier-fed by the river systems coming down from the mountains.

- 5. Garibaldi Lake






Although not strictly located in Whistler, One Mile Lake is within walking distance of downtown Pemberton, just a 20-minute drive north of Whistler. This local spot has several walk-in sandy beaches, docks, and even a walking trail surrounding its perimeter so you can get warmed up if you're not ready to jump in. As one of the most swimmable lakes in temperature, this spot does get busy, so you might wish to get there early.






Instantly recognizable by its unique color, Green Lake is just north of Whistler Village along Highway 99. See incredible views from the shores and enjoy hiking around the lake, however, be wary that being glacier-fed, Green Lake can be incredibly cold to swim in.





Located in the Upper Village area, despite the name, Lost Lake is one of Whistler's most accessible. Surrounded by easy hiking and biking trails, it is the perfect place to relax and cool down after a long day. It's a friendly, relaxed environment and even has a dog beach, along with a nude dock if you're feeling adventurous!





Potentially Whistler's most popular lake, Alta Lake, is huge and can be accessed from a variety of different points, all with docks, parks, and beaches. Rainbow Park is the largest access point and has docks, volleyball courts, and the dog-friendly "Barking Bay." Connected via the Valley Trail, Rainbow Park gives you fantastic views of both Whistler and Blackcomb Mountains and is also a popular spot for night photography.






Nestled behind Nita Lake Lodge and surrounded by trees, Nita Lake has a great feeling of privacy and is quieter than other local lakes. This is the perfect spot to relax and a popular place for paddleboarders and even paddleboard yoga!





Garibaldi Lake in Garibaldi Provincial Park is a stunning, glacier-fed lake sitting 1,450 meters high, surrounded by snow-capped mountains glaciers, alpine meadows and volcanic structures. It is a great day hike, and even better camping destination. Camping at Garibaldi Lake provides opportunities to explore other nearby hikes such as Black Tusk and Panorama Ridge.




STAND-UP PADDLEBOARDING

Paddle hard or hold on and enjoy the ride while certified guides navigate you safely through the rapids. There are different tours, some are "splashier" than others, but bouncy rapids and picturesque scenery are guaranteed. Hanging glaciers, towering mountains, cascading waterfalls, lush rainforest, and exciting rapids await to be admired.



KAYAKING & CANOEING

Kayaking and canoeing have become favorites within the recreational community, and for a good reason. Both sporting activities provide amazing family fun for children of any age. Climb into a canoe and set out as a team around the amazing views and vistas Whistler has to offer. One favorite is the River of Golden Dreams. This scenic glacier–fed river has a lush old–growth forest surrounding both sides. The river connects two of Whistler's largest bodies of water, Alta Lake and magnificent Green Lake. You can choose between a kayak or a canoe and take in the mountain scenery.





Festivals and other cultural events celebrate the cultural and historical background of one community or nation. In that sense, Whistler's festivals and events calendar is packed with shows, races, exhibits, and community events that celebrate long-rooted rituals, traditions, and cultural heritage. There's never a dull moment here. If you find yourself in Whistler during some of these celebrations, make sure you attend the events like the World Ski and Snowboard Festival, Crankworx, and Cornucopia.



ART ON THE LAKE

For two incredible days, Arts Whistler transforms the south end of Whistler's Alta Lake into a floating oasis. Spend the day immersed in nature and the warm summer sun exploring art around every bend, surrounded by live local music. With a floating art gallery showcasing reproductions from *Sea to Sky* artists, local bands, live art, dance performances, and family-friendly entertainment, this community celebration is not to be missed!




CORNUCOPIA FESTIVAL

The best food and drink from British Columbia (and beyond) is celebrated at Whistler's 11-day Cornucopia Festival every November as the snow begins to fly. Between culinary workshops, winery dinners, and specialty tastings hosted by craft brew houses and distilleries, there's no shortage of feasting and food events to enjoy in the village during the festival's run. Savor local cuisine with invigorating farm-to-table dining and a Wellness Feast. Join in farm visits with tastings, ancient medicine talks, and a horticultural walk with a picnic in the park. It's a pop-up culinary series that will nourish your body and mind.



WORLD SKI AND SNOWBOARD FESTIVAL

Known to locals as WSSF, the World Ski and Snowboard Festival combines spring energy with Whistler's unique mountain culture for more than a week of non-stop events and activities on and off the slopes. It's an exciting event that celebrates the best of winter excitement as the season winds to a close. The festival is held each April in Whistler and has been recognized as the largest annual winter sports and music festival in North America.





Whistler hosts several local and international running events. The Whistler Half Marathon is one of Canada's most scenic runs. The event occurs on the unceded lands and among the bountiful waters and spiritual animals of the Lil'wat Nation and Squamish Nation. There are five distances to choose from, ranging from 1 kilometer to 30 kilometers, ie. 0.6 to 18.6 mi (including a 21-kilometer (13.1mi) half marathon, of course), making it welcoming for all levels.






HELI-HOT SPRINGS




WHISTLER BACKCOUNTRY AIR SAFARI

PRIVATE JET

Seasonal private charters to Whistler are often motivated by its more than 8,000 acres of terrain around the Whistler and Blackcomb mountains to ski and enjoy any number of other activities no matter the season. Private jets can land on the following aerodromes:



• Driving From Vancouver

This route comes over the Duffey Lake Road past popular hiking spots such as Joffre Lakes. This road is spectacular – it's also smaller, slower and has a significant mountain pass to ascend and descend.
